## TOWN OF FAIRFAX PROCLAMATION IN HONOR OF Vernon LEFTY Gomez

WHEREAS, Vernon Louis "Lefty" Gomez was born and raised in the Bay Area in California, played sandlot baseball in Oakland while attending Richmond High School, and played for the San Francisco Seals after high school, and

WHEREAS, on February 26, 1933, Lefty married June O'Dea, a Broadway star and Lefty and June had 4 children and 7 grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, as a pitcher for the Yankees, Lefty had an unparalleled career, winning six consecutive World Series games; and

WHEREAS, Lefty won 20 regular season games four times, was an All-Star every year from 1933 to 1939, and led the American League twice each in winning percentage and Earned Run Average (ERA), and in shutouts for 3 seasons; and

WHEREAS, Lefty pitched for the New York Yankees from 1930 - 1942; and

WHEREAS, in his later years Lefty was a Fairfax resident, living with his wife and family at 33 Porteous Avenue from 1968-1975; and

WHEREAS, in 1972 the Lefty Gomez Field was dedicated in his honor in Fairfax and remains today as a well-used field for recreational sports; and

WHEREAS, Lefty was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1972; and

WHEREAS, Lefty was also inducted into the Bay Area Sports Hall of Fame (1981), the East Bay California Hall of Fame (1986), the Yankee Stadium Monument Park (1987), the Babe Ruth International Hall of Fame (1991), and the Hispanic Heritage Ball Hall of Fame (1999 and 2013); and
