1. CALL TO ORDER

• Cassidy called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

3. REPORT ON MCEP SUMMARY FROM KARA SPENCER (CASSIDY AND PETER)

- MCEP supports a cohesive approach to climate action goals across Marin County. Meetings are first Wednesday of the month. Kara Spencer attends MCEP meetings, representing the town of Fairfax.
- One MCEP goal: take the lead on a model ordinance for single-use plastic, starting with fast-food/restaurant usage. If towns adopt the ordinance, the county will provide enforcement. Planning Commission is leading the effort; Kara to get name of primary contact.
- CAC asked if Kara could provide MCEP agenda prior to each meeting, which would allow CAC to help Kara prepare for the meeting by calling out items of particular interest to CAC, submitting questions for her to ask, or providing a statement where appropriate.
- CAC should send comments relating to upcoming MCEP agenda items to Cassidy or Peter to pass on to Kara.

- Climate Reality Leadership Committee is currently working on EVs, suggested inviting them to CAC meeting, attending for public expression and speaking for a few minutes

7. 2019 ANNUAL PLAN/GOALS UPDATE

- Walt reported on ordinance, town-to-carbon neutral, and electrify-everything subcommittees:
 - #3-Ordinance committee: Title 24 takes effect 1/1/2020, applies to new and 50% remodeled buildings, committee proposes recommending new ordinance to include replacement of natural gas appliances with electric. Requested adding to July CAC meeting agenda, present to town council at July 17 meeting.
 - #4-Town-to-carbon neutral: \$20K in town budget to invest towards this goal, still working on prioritizing the efforts for town energy upgrades.
 - #7-Continuity of power: exploring options other than diesel generators as backup for PG&E shutdowns and other power emergencies. Considering on-site batteries, micro-grid, carbon offsets. Carbon offset estimate is \$3600 – recommending setting that amount aside as grant fund for residents willing to move to electric.
 - #9-Recommended working with Sustainable Fairfax to engage community and promote voluntary moves from gas to electric.
 - #3, #7-Based on further comments from David, Kiki, Bruce, formed subcommittee (David, Joanne, Cassidy, Kiki) to work on support for all building owners to be greenhouse gas (GHG)-free by 2030.
 - #3, #7-Kiki asked to talk in July about connecting with businesses about move to GHG free.
- #2-Bruce reported on CAP subcommittee: met in May, focusing on vision statement. Next meeting will focus on process for updating CAP, followed by special one-day meeting to work through entire plan.
- #5-Jody reported on vulnerability assessment: Using Marin County list of top ten areas of impact to create tool to guide residents and businesses in preparing for top areas of vulnerability; plan to organize community events, share block captain program, encourage people to know neighbors
- #8-Transportation: no report this month

8. BUDGET DISCUSSION

• Confirmed town council approved \$2000 for CAC, \$20,000 towards making the town GHG-neutral.

9. ADVANCED COMMUNITY ENERGY, PILOT A PROGRAM IN FAIRFAX? (DAVID)

• David recommends putting together a "salon" of interested parties to discuss further.
