Town Council Meeting Update

At the August 7th Council meeting the Town Council considered several ordinances.

The Town Council adopted an ordinance which establishes uniform and comprehensive regulations for wireless telecommunication facilities (e.g., 5-G) within the Town on private property and within the Town's public rights-of-way. This ordinance reflects the community and Council's work over the past several months.

After over 20 public meetings to consider the matter, the Council [introduced two ordinances](#) to address commercial cannabis:

- An ordinance establishing zoning standards and restrictions for certain commercial cannabis uses and cannabis cultivation for personal use. The Town only allows adult-use delivery-only retail businesses and continues to allow medical storefront and delivery operations. The ordinance establishes a maximum of two (2) commercial cannabis business locations at any one time in town. A business can be any combination of medical marijuana storefront/delivery and/or adult-use (recreational) delivery-only operation.
- An ordinance regulating Commercial Cannabis Businesses which establishes the local cannabis business permit approval process.

The Council also [introduced an ordinance](#) amending local smoking regulations to eliminate exceptions for tobacco flavored products such as menthol-favored tobacco.

The Council continued to the September meeting an ordinance to establish time limits for incomplete applications and project entitlement approvals.

Forrest Terrace Steps Repaired

Last week we had a ribbon cutting for the repair of the Forrest Terrace steps. Special thanks to Michael St. John for working with the contractor Raul Garcia of Forster-Kroeger on the repairs.



The Town of Fairfax is pleased to be a part of the grassroots safe-driving campaign: Eyes Up Ross Valley! The purpose of the Eyes Up campaign is to raise awareness and encourage community members to:

- Keep their eyes up and pay attention while driving, biking, or walking on roads
- Never drive under the influence of alcohol or other drugs, including marijuana
- Drive within the legal speed limit on neighborhood streets; slower near schools and crosswalks
- Never text or use the internet while driving or crossing the road

- Be patient with, and considerate of, fellow drivers, bikers, and pedestrians.

Participating groups—including Safe Routes to School, the Towns of San Anselmo and Fairfax, Supervisor Katie Rice’s office at County of Marin, San Domenico School, Sleepy Hollow Homes Association, Marin County Bicycle Coalition, local law enforcement, as well as numerous non-profit organizations, small businesses, and community volunteers within the Ross Valley—are working together to raise awareness and increase the safety of local streets.

Marin is ranked 11th worst among 58 California counties in collisions where speeding is a factor and has the second highest collision rate involving bicycles of any other County in California (CA Office of Traffic Safety, 2015).

- Eyes Up Slow Down. Speed limits are put in place to protect all road users.
- 30% of Marin crashes are due to unsafe speeds (2018)!
