Cascade Striping Project (Council Meeting 12/4)

The Cascade Striping Project is scheduled for discussion at the Town Council's December 4th meeting at 7:00pm in the Women's Club. The traffic engineer, Parisi Transportation, will be in attendance to discuss the traffic calming purpose of the design, answer questions and present options for Council consideration. A special thanks to the 60+ residents who were able to attend the neighborhood meeting this past Thursday (11/21) at 5:00pm at Doc Edgar Park to discuss the Cascade Striping Project. The comments received at the neighborhood meeting will be summarized and attached to the staff report for the December 4th meeting.

Scenic Road Pavement Project

The Scenic Road pavement project is scheduled to begin Monday (11/25) and to be completed on Tuesday (11/26). The approximate location is between the Scenic/Ridge intersection and 454 Scenic Road (approx. 1,000 linear ft). The project does require Ridge and the affected portion of Scenic Road to be closed on Tuesday with potential traffic delays on Monday and Wednesday. Detour and road closure signs will be posted along Scenic Rd.

- **Wednesday (11-27-19), pavement prep work, traffic control using flaggers (delays up to 15 min)**, Working Hours 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Highlights of the November 6, 2019 Town Council Meeting

-- Endorsed Partnership with Earth Day Network's Green Cities program to promote town wide events/activities for Earth Day '20.

-- Approved increase in Town fees and permits. The increase will take effect July 1, 2020. However, most of the Planning and Building Permit Fees increases will be phased in over a 6 year period. Approximately 75% of the total revenue generated from fee for services is from Planning and Building Permit fees. The last time fees were increased, other than facility rental fees, was in 2009. The current overall cost recovery percentage for fee for service is approximately 50%. This percentage will increase to 65% at the end of FY25-26.

-- Awarded contract for the Upper Scenic Road Pavement Rehabilitation project, as described above.

-- Introduced ordinances to amend the Town's Fire and Building Code to reflect updates in California Building Standards Code and California Fire Code.

-- Discussed the status of the replacement of the bus shelter in the Parkade. John Romaidis, a Fairfax resident and volunteer, presented his design concept based on a historical photo of a shelter used for the former Train station. Staff retained a local architect to turn John's preliminary design into formal plans. The Council requested John and staff to return for final discussions and approval at the Council's December 4th meeting.

-- Introduced an ordinance to extend, indefinitely, the prohibition on Smart Meters in Town. The existing ban is scheduled to expire February 2020.
