Sign Up to Receive Updates From the Town

Update on Marinda Heights

At the December 2019 Council meeting, staff reported that the applicant indicated he was considering revisions to the project description for the EIR and that the matter would be scheduled for consideration at a future Council meeting.

On January 15, 2020, staff further reported the applicant has not submitted any revisions to the EIR project description nor has a future meeting been scheduled for the Town Council to consider the agreement for the preparation of the EIR.

As a result, the application processing is still on hold pending approval of an agreement with an environmental consultant. We recommend that persons who wish to receive updates of information and meetings regarding the Marinda Heights subdivision sign up on the Major Projects page.

Sidewalk Replacement Program in Downtown

The first phase of the downtown sidewalk repair project will begin Tuesday, February 18th. This phase replaces the sidewalk from Gestalt Haus to the southern edge of the Mono parking lot on Bolinas Road. The work will take 2-3 days. During this time, the Bolinas Road entrances to Mono alley (adjacent to Gestalt Haus) and the Mono parking lot will be closed. However, Mono Alley can be accessed from Bank St. A portion of the Mono parking lot will also be open from Bank St. Thank you for your understanding.

Tree Trimming & Vegetation Management

You may have noticed significant tree trimming and/or vegetation removal in the public right of way and/or around power poles in Town. This work is being performed by contractors retained by either PG&E or FireSAFE Marin. Cascade Striping Project

At its January 15th meeting, the Council received a status update on the revisions to the striping project as directed by the Town Council. The contractor completed the modifications on 1/24/20. An informal Cascade Working group was formed with Councilmembers Hellman and Reed assigned to meet with interested residents regarding the project. Highlights from the January 15th and February 5th Town Council Meetings

Marin Sanitary Services (MSS)

The Council approved a 10 year contract extension and new rate setting methodology with Marin Sanitary Services, for residential, commercial and multi-family garbage, recycling, and organics collection and processing services. Under the new methodology, the Town approved an annual rate increase of 4.9%, effective January 1, 2020. The old methodology would have resulted in a 6.4% increase, or 1.5% higher than the approved rate. This new methodology is the same one adopted by San Anselmo, Ross, San Rafael, Larkspur, and incorporated County of Marin. The new methodology should avoid large fluctuations in rate increases, that the Town had previously experienced, in exchange for more reasonable, annual increases.

Farmers' Market

The Town approved a two year extension of the agreement with Agricultural Community Event Farmers' Market to operate the Downtown Farmers' Market on Wednesdays. Opening day is May 6th . The Farmers' Market will run from 4:00pm to 8:00pm every Wednesday, from May 6th to October 14th.

Hill Area Residential Development Permit (HRD)

The Town Council adopted an ordinance requiring HRD permits, if applicable, for all residential zones in Town. A HRD permit would be required if a site meets certain conditions.

Single-Use Foodware Ordinance

The Council introduced an amendment to the existing Single-Use Foodware ordinance. The amendment clarified that the 25-cent charge applies to all disposable cups whether compostable or not. The intent of the provision was to encourage customers to use reusable cups.

Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs)/Junior Accessory Dwelling Units (JADUs)

The Council adopted an ordinance to establish objective development standards for ADUs/JADUs. This was in response to State laws imposing new limits on local authority to regulate ADUs/JADUs.

Emergency and back-up Generators

The Council discussed an ordinance to regulate the use of emergency and back-up generators during prolonged power outages caused by emergencies or PG&E's Public Safety Power Shut-Off (PSPS) program. No action was taken and the matter was continued to the March 4th meeting.
