Highlights of the July 1st Council Meeting

The Council adopted a Resolution Establishing a Temporary Limit of 15% on Commissions Charged by Third Party Food Delivery Companies (e.g., Door Dash, Grub Hub) to Support Restaurants in Fairfax During the Covid-19 Pandemic.

The Council authorized the Town Manager to enter into an agreement with: Ascent Environmental, Inc., to prepare the Environmental Impact Report (EIR), at the applicant's costs, for the Marinda Heights Subdivision (aka "Wall Property"); and Lamphier-Gregory to perform project management and coordination services for the EIR and overall project, at the applicant's cost.

The first step in the EIR process will be a scoping meeting to hear from the community regarding the issues or topics the EIR should address. While no scoping meeting date has been set, we anticipate this meeting will most likely be scheduled in August. While the scoping meeting will be advertised to the community, we suggest residents go to www.townoffairfax.org to subscribe for updates on Marinda Heights including any future meetings such as the scoping session.

July 15th- Community Listening Session 5:30pm

The Town Council will be holding a virtual Community Listening Session to hear from the community on a broad range of topics including racial equity, inclusion, diversity, systematic racial bias, social justice, rethinking/reimagining police services, police safety funding, police

practices/policies, and/or other matters of importance to the community. Based on community input, the Council will be considering the formation of a committee(s) to address the issues raised during the community listening session. The Council was originally scheduled to discuss/consider the formation of Town committees at its July 1st meeting, but due to the lateness of the hour continued the discussion to July 15th.

Stay Home, Stay Safe from COVID-19 on Fourth of July

With <u>COVID-19</u> spreading rapidly in many Bay Area neighborhoods, health officials across the region urge residents to protect themselves and the community by celebrating from home this holiday weekend.

The Fourth of July is traditionally a time for firework displays, cookouts and parades, but this year the COVID-19 pandemic has forced many communities to cancel public events. Gatherings with others from outside your household, such as members of the extended family, are potentially risky.

Health officers from across the greater Bay Area, speaking in unison as the Association of Bay Area Health Officials, say staying home this year is a healthy choice.

"We know people have an urge to get outside and gather among friends, especially on Independence Day," said Dr. Lisa Santora, Deputy Public Health Officer for Marin. "But the more we come together in groups, the more COVID-19 spreads in the community." You can spread COVID-19 even if you don't feel that sick. You can pass the disease to someone else before you have symptoms, and even if you never develop any symptoms at all. When people who have contracted the infection come in contact with high-risk people, there can be deadly consequences.

Marin County Public Health recommends the following ideas for families to have a safe and fun holiday weekend:

- Attend the Virtual Marin County Fair, July 1-5: Watch music, dance and acrobatic performances; share your art and favorite fair memories; and watch a virtual firework show at 9 p.m. on July 4. (<u>Schedule</u>) (<u>Watch Performances</u>)
- Go camping in your own backyard: Set up a tent and enjoy a night under the stars
- Have a dance off: Light the night with glow sticks and dance to your favorite tunes
- Make a festive snack or craft: Enjoy a patriotic DIY project with the kids
- Watch a movie under the stars: Check YouTube to learn how to make a projector using your smart phone

- Create a waterpark at home: Set up sprinklers and a splash pool filled with water balloons
- Plan an online watch party: Enjoy a patriotic fireworks show online
- Have a sports-a-thon: Plan a friendly competition with members of your household
- Fly a kite: Add to the fun and build your own kite
- Go for a bike ride: Enjoy a bike ride around your neighborhood

All Bay Area residents are also encouraged to get tested for COVID-19, and to do so immediately if they have symptoms. FireSafe Marin Chipper Days

In case you missed the chipper days these past two weekends, Fire Safe Marin is offering curbside pick up services funded through the

Marin Wildfire Prevention Authority (MWPA). To use this service, you must live in a Firewise community, which includes Cascade, Forrest, Deer Park, Canon Village, Manor Hill, Meadowlands, Oak Manor and Marinda Oaks.

You must pre-register for this service by going to the online web portal https://www.chipperday.com/marin. Sign up is on a first come first served basis.

This pick up service will take place the week of July 13th.

Please have your material at the curb by 8 a.m. on the day of your scheduled pick up. Piles are limited to 10 feet by 4 feet by 4 feet. Anything larger will be left for the resident to remove. NO: Trash, poison oak, blackberry brambles, firewood, construction material, lumber, regular yard waste, leaves or lawn clippings. Contact info: firewise@firesafemarin.org.

Outdoor Dining and Retail Permits

In an effort to temporarily streamline Town regulations regarding outdoor dining and other business uses (e.g., outdoor retail), the Town Council has created a Temporary Use Permit (TUP) process for private property and an encroachment permit process for public property such as parking spaces. These programs will allow restaurants and other businesses to temporarily expand their operations outside for such uses as dining, retail, or exercise classes. A Reminder from Marin County Public Health to Wear a Face Covering in Public

Under the authority of the California Emergency Services Act, Governor Newsom issued a mandate that everyone must wear a mask when in public settings.

Face coverings are required for everyone over 2 years old when:

- at indoor AND outdoor businesses whether as an employee or a customer
- waiting in line to enter a store
- waiting for and using public transit
- when in a taxi or ride share
- when seeking healthcare; or visiting a hospital, medical clinic, pharmacy, laboratory, dental office, veterinary clinic or blood bank
- walking outside and within 6 feet of others

Face coverings should cover your nose and mouth, and can be improvised for bandanas, t-shirts or other cloth around your home.
