Fairfax Community-Friendly Evacuation Maps and 9 Firewise Neighborhoods are Online!

Disaster preparedness is important for all of us in Fairfax. The very recent fires in West Marin, the North Bay and the South Bay, are yet another reminder that we all need to prepare, as a Town and as individuals. In response to the need, the Town created Community-Friendly Evacuation Maps, so that each of us in the community can find our *own* way out of our neighborhoods in a disaster.

Firesafe Marin - Fairfax Evac Maps

Pavement Work on Sir Francis Drake Blvd. at Butterfield Road

- Drivers should expect delays at this location during these times

The Town of San Anselmo will be performing pavement patching on Sir Francis Drake Boulevard between Butterfield Road and San Anselmo Avenue on Monday and Tuesday, September 28th and 29th Work will take place between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm, with one lane open in each direction throughout the project. Traffic control staff will be on-site during this project to help keep traffic flowing as best it can.

Outdoor Seating Area in the Mono Parking Lot

The Town, in partnership with the Fairfax Chamber of Commerce, will be closing the lower half the Mono Parking Lot from Thursday through Sunday. The closed portion of the lot (nearest to Bolinas Rd.) will have tables and chairs for patrons of downtown restaurants to use. The Chamber will have someone available to disinfect the tables and chairs between uses. Customers can still access the Mono Parking Lot from the Bank St. entrance. This is a pilot program and, depending on the demand, the Town and Chamber will continue to close this portion of the Mono lot for subsequent weekends during COVID-19.

Portable Battery Program

PG&E's Portable Battery Program (PBP) provides no-cost backup portable batteries for eligible income-qualified[1] customers who live in high fire-threat districts[2] (HFTD) and are enrolled in the Medical Baseline program.

Eligibility requirements include a reliance on medical equipment that operates on electricity to sustain life. Working in coordination with Community Based Organizations (CBOs), PG&E has identified approximately 10,500 customers who could qualify for this program.

PG&E offers additional programs for customers not qualified for PG&E's new Medical Baseline PBP.

- The <u>Disability Disaster Access and Resources Program</u>, to support people with disabilities and older adults before, during, and after a PSPS event. The program enables qualified customers who use electrical medical devices to access backup portable batteries through a grant, lease-to-own or the <u>FreedomTech</u> low-interest financial loan program. Transportation resources, lodging and food options are also provided through an online application process to qualified customers. CFILC administers all aspects of the program.
- PG&E is a Program Administrator of the statewide <u>Self-Generation Incentive Program</u> (SGIP), which is providing financial incentives for Medical Baseline customers installing new, qualifying equipment for storing energy for their homes. The SGIP Equity Resiliency incentive is designed to

allow customers to install a home battery storage system at no cost to them.

Update for Marin County: State Tier 2 (COVID-19) Status

Email for Reporting Shelter-in-Place (SIP) Violations

The Town has created an on-line process for reporting SIP violations by businesses.

The email address is: sipviolations@townoffairfax.org.

In the email, we ask that you include the business name, address, and as much detail as possible regarding the perceived health order violation. Town staff will follow-up with the businesses regarding the violations. Our goal is to gain compliance by informing and educating businesses of the need to follow shelter-in-place (SIP) orders. All businesses will be given a grace period to comply before additional follow-up actions are taken by staff.

Fairfax Climate Action Plan Survey

The Town of Fairfax is updating its 2014 Climate Action Plan and Climate Action Committee needs your input to develop effective measures that will substantially reduce greenhouse gas emissions. In March of 2019, the Town Council passed a Climate Emergency Resolution and set a target of zero emissions by 2030, going beyond State reduction targets.

After receiving community feedback, the Fairfax Climate Action Committee will bring a first draft of the 2030 Climate Action Plan to the Council and then post it for further public comment. Hopefully, a final version will come before the Council by the end of this year.
