   Walt to provide finalized list:
  - o Community Education and Outreach (includes efforts that support several other strategies):
    - Advocacy: Stressed importance of bringing Town Council, Staff, and CAC in alignment re: Fairfax Climate Action Plan
    - Engage residents with promotion/demos of EVs/EBs along with Drive Clean Bay Area and other resources
    - Promote food waste/composting through town program
    - MCE Deep Green
    - Promote renewable energy storage systems, EVs as backup battery source

- Promote carbon offsets (reframe as investment in climate mitigation rather than "offset")
- o ZEV: focus on eliminating gasoline-powered vehicles
- o Microgrids/Solar/Battery Storage
- o Energy Efficiency Programs
- o Climate Summit, with emphasis on Town Staff participation
- o Renewable fuels for Town vehicles; purchase E-Bikes for Town staff/police
- Noted: to help with budget requests, need contractors to estimate work needed for town building projects
- Beth accepted role of Chair for the Community Engagement subcommittee, outlined ideas for in 2021
