OPPUN TOWISH (ARE YOU WELL?)

 As long as the sun has filled our days with the gift of light, and as long as the moonlight has guided our path at night, and since time immemorial, Coast Miwok peoples, who hold the uncontestable aboriginal title, have occupied, tended, stewarded, held sacred ceremonies, defended and governed according to traditions of their ancestors the unceded lands of present-day Marin County, California.





ULE-MI MACONO (FREE US)

- We, the rightful and proven lineal descendants of the Coast Miwok indigenous peoples of Marin County, California, in exercise of our right to selfdetermination governance, have assembled a council of tribal leaders, the Coast Miwok Tribal Council of Marin, to:
 - Cultivate our unique identity and heritage
 - Protect our rights
 - Provide for the sustainment and development of our traditional culture
 - Economically develop our communities
 - Educate our youth
 - Train our workforce





TOWISH NISHINI (GOOD WAY)

- The Coast Miwok Tribal Council of Marin:
 - Will provide for the sustainment and development of our traditional culture
 - Will establish committees, advisory councils, agencies, companies and corporations as necessary to serve its membership, and purposes of this council
 - Will honor traditional customs of justice and conflict resolution
 - Is explicitly not formed for the purposes of seeking tribal gaming enterprises





WALLI TOWISH (BLESSINGS)

- We offer our warmest solidarity and support in the common cause of the resilience of our tribal communities, and recognize all of our relations as extended family, and acknowledge that all Miwoks have the freedom to choose how they wish to associate with other tribal relations and tribal organizations, and we maintain no hostility or conflict with other Miwoks, California Tribes, or Native American Nations.
