DEFENSIBLE SPACE IS REQUIRED BY LAW



ZONE 0: 0'- 5'
The area around your house, 0'-5', including the surfaces of the structure itself is vulnerable to embers during wildfires. Trees should be 20'0" combination in this zone.

ZONE 1: 5'- 30'
The "Lean, Clean and Green" zone extends 15'0" out from buildings, structures, decks, etc. Extra maintenance, good plant selection, and smart design are required.

ZONE 2: 30'- 100'
Extends from 30' to at least 100' or to the property line. Dead vegetation should be removed and some fire resistant vegetation is required in this zone.

ACCESS ZONE: 10'
Clearance is required to maintain vegetation at least 10' overhead and 10' from the edge of roads and driveways adjacent to that property, even in the public right-of-way.

Home Hardening
Embers are the most common cause of home ignition during wildfires. Steps and other measures, design and material details can help protect your home.
