The questions below reflect the major themes that appeared throughout the submitted questions to the community "survey". We grouped questions by the themes.

- 1. <u>Background:</u> Please summarize what it is about your background and experience that you believe makes you qualified to be the next police chief and why you are interested in the position?
- 2. <u>Role of Police:</u> What is your philosophy about the role Fairfax PD should play in our community?
 - a. As chief, how would you ensure the entire department staff implements that philosophy and involves themselves in this community?
 - b. On the other hand, how can/should members of the community help the Fairfax PD in performing its role here?
- 3. <u>Race Issues:</u> What will you do to ensure that minority residents and visitors <u>are</u> treated fairly and equally, and that they <u>feel</u> confident that they will be treated fairly and equally, by Fairfax PD?
 - a. What training do FPD members currently receive in racial bias issues in policing? What should they receive/what other training would you support?
 - b. What are your ideas about how FPD can contribute to making Fairfax a welcoming, inclusive community?
 - c. How does FPD investigate/address incidents that may be considered a hate crime?
- 4. <u>Transparency:</u> As police chief, how would you propose to keep in regular contact with concerned citizen groups to hear and respond to questions about on-going policing issues?
 - a. What information is/could be provided to such groups/the community on a regular basis?
 - b. What do you feel is the role of civilian oversight of police?
- 5. <u>Crisis Intervention:</u> What kinds of personnel, policies and training do you feel would improve FPD's ability to respond to mental-health-driven and substance-abuse-driven calls for service in a non-violent manner that is safe for both the responders and those involved in the incident?
 - a. For example, should unarmed mental health/addiction specialists respond to these types of calls, and if so, how could they be included in responses? How do you envision such a model working?

- b. Should some police officers have specialized training in such issues, and if so what kind? What training do they receive now in recognizing mental health issues?
- 6. <u>Local Public Safety Challenges:</u> What do you feel are the 2-3 biggest public safety challenges currently facing Fairfax and how would you propose to address them?
- 7. <u>Use of Force</u>: What training and/or policies does FPD currently use to ensure that officers are equipped to de-escalate situations to avoid "use of force" responses instead (or at least to ensure minimal force measures are used)?
 - a. How can these de-escalation measures and practices be improved upon?
 - b. Do FPD officers currently train with and use military-style weapons (e.g., assault weapons/riot gear) and if so, why? Could those be eliminated?
 - c. Are there department budgetary shifts that would support such efforts (e.g., moving funds away from things like SWAT/riot gear to other measures)?
- 8. <u>Future of Policing in Fairfax:</u> What does the future of policing/public safety look like in our community, and what services (other than hiring/training officers) do you envision may be important to support it?
- 9. Open Remarks from Candidate: Is there anything else you would like to share with the community panel that was not addressed in any of the other questions?"
