Remembering our "Rosie the Riveter" of Fairfax Phyllis Gould



Fairfax resident, Phyllis Gould, and an original "Rosie the Riveter" of World War II recently passed away just a few months shy of her 100th birthday. In 1942, during World War II, the US government launched the Rosie the Riveter campaign to encourage women to enter the workforce to support the war efforts. As a Rosie, Mrs. Gould worked at the Richmond Kaiser Shipyards as a welder. Phyllis lived at the Bennett House in Fairfax for several years and kept up her fight for the recognition of the Rosie's until the end. In 2015, after her multi-year letter writing and fundraising campaign, Phyllis and four of her Rosie colleagues traveled to Washington D.C to meet with President Obama and Vice President Biden. In 2017, Congress established March 21 as Rosie the Riveter Day. Congresswoman Jackie Spier worked with Phyllis on the Congressional Gold Medal which will be completed next year. In 2014, Phyllis was the Grand Marshall of the annual Fairfax Festival Parade and in 2015, the then Mayor Coler prepared a Town Council proclamation in her honor. Fairfax has lost a great member of our community, and may her story continue on, inspiring us to strive for even higher achievements. She will be dearly missed.
