**WHEREAS**, Frank, his wife and six children moved to Fairfax in 1964, and when he passed away last month at the age of 91, Frank was still living at the same home in the Cascades; and

**WHEREAS**, Frank loved the Town of Fairfax, and as a boy recalls coming to the Town for accordion picnics in the park; and

**WHEREAS**, He had a long career with the Northwestern Pacific Railroad, and retired from the Southern Pacific Railroad; and

**WHEREAS**, Following his retirement, he purchased the Fairfax Bakery at 71 Broadway, and operated it for many years; and

**WHEREAS**, He was a longtime parishioner at St. Rita's Church, and previously served on the men's advisory council there; and

**WHEREAS**, He instilled a business sense in his children, and his son Paul owns Fradelizio's Ristorante and his grandson Spencer owns the Fairfax Barber Shop (two other sons own businesses outside of Fairfax); and


**WHEREAS**, He was a longtime member of the Native Sons of the Golden West, Fairfax Parlor #307; and
