Approved Vegetation Management Special position description/salary MWPA will run the Chipper Programs this year (FireSafe Marin will no longer do so); saw Adapt to Wildfire campaign (out soon); approved MWPA Style Guide for communications; presentation on Biomass Collaborative project (MWPA, OFA with \$500K grant from Governor's OPR).
- Attended MCE Clean Energy Board meeting (Feb 17) –MCE rate Change was adopted at prior meeting – updated information: on 2/10/22, the CPUC approved PG&E's requested rate increase along with a reduction in the PCIA. On March 1st, MCE will implement a 1.7 cents/kWh rate increase to cover increased power supply costs. This will be entirely offset by a PCIA reduction of about 2.5 cents/kWh. When taken with PG&E's very large (3.5 cents/kWh) increase to its generation rates. MCE service should be \$13/month less for the typical household, providing a total bill discount of 7% compared to PG&E. NEWS UPDATE: MCE has approved an agreement for their largest battery-storage solar project with the Golden Fields Solar Project in Kern County, which will provide enough power for an estimated 52,000 homes each year, generating 100 MW of solar energy with a co-located 75 MW lithium-ion battery. 2/17 Board meeting: Issued the Charles McGlashen 2021 Award to Sustainable Contra Costa County; Approved Bond Debt Policy & Master Bond Indenture – necessary as MCE is a leading provider of renewable and GHG free energy and thus must have access to many tools to reach its goals of providing 85% renewable energy by 2029 and 95% GHG free energy by 2023. MCE's ability to issue tax-exempt debt to finance an ownership interest in a generating or storage facility is a distinct advantage over investor-owned utilities and direct access providers. By their adoption, MCE will be able to issue bonds within a six-to-eight-week time frame which will help MCE take advantage of ownership opportunities that arise in a timely manner. SB 1029 (2016) requires that any state and local government agency that intends to issue debt must formulate and adopt a Debt Policy. The Master Bond Indenture dictates the requirements and conditions precedent for MCE to issue bonds. Coler is now a member of the 2022 Ad Hoc Contracts Committee.
