SUBJECT: Approve concept of \$5,000 Increase to Town's Annual Contribution to the Joint

Exercise of Powers Agreement (JEPA) for Yellow School Bus Services to White Hill

School

RECOMMENDATION

Approve concept of increase to Fairfax's financial contribution from \$30,500 annually to \$35,500 for the coming fiscal year to be paid to the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (JEPA) for the Yellow School Bus Program.

BACKGROUND

Beginning in the School Year of 2016/2017, the Town of Fairfax has provided annual funding to help support the Yellow Bus Program for White Hill Middle School students. This program is designed to relieve congestion along the Sir Francis Drake corridor. Fairfax students use the service, but the majority of the demand is from students living outside of Fairfax who might be driven through Fairfax in individual cars if they did not use the bus.

DISCUSSION

The Yellow Bus Program is operated by Marin Transit, who contracts with Michael's Transportation to provide the bus service. Marin Transit provides bus pass sales, route development and management, and financial management.

The program has been funded in part by large annual contributions from Measure AA and the County of Marin, along with smaller contributions by the Towns of Fairfax and San Anselmo. Approximately 30% of the needed revenue comes from the public agencies contributions. The remaining approximately 70% of the funding comes from student bus pass sales.

During its budget meeting on March 21, 2022, JEPA discussed the impact of fuel price increases and reduced ridership during the pandemic. To address potential budget shortfalls while keeping yellow bus pass costs relatively low, the idea of raising JEPA members' contributions was proposed. For Fairfax, the amount of increase would be \$5,000. The Town of San Anselmo has volunteered to increase its contribution by \$5,000.

Councilmember Goddard, the Town's representative on the JEPA, attended the JEPA budget meeting and commented on the importance of this program in relieving several hundred car trips that would otherwise travel through Fairfax.

FISCAL IMPACT

The additional \$5,000 would be approved by the Council as part of the FY22-23 budget process.

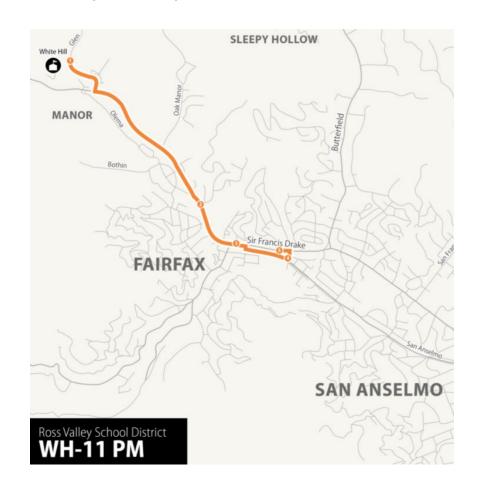

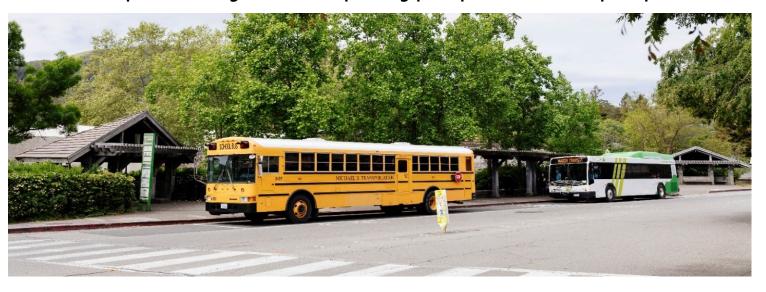

Other considerations for 22/23 service plan:

- Update stop times on schedules to reflect current traffic patterns
- Address open seats on sold-out routes
 - Make seats available to existing yellow bus passholders on a first come basis
 - Requires assistance by White Hill staff to facilitate waiting students
 - Requires raising the late-departing pass price to the full pass price

Measure AA Funds and Term Renewal



New three-year term 2022 — 2025

- Funds allocated to regular home to school (yellow bus) programs in the county
- Measure AA funds provide a subsidy based on the one-way pass price and the number of passes distributed



On average these funds cover 10 –
 20% of total program costs

Measure AA



First 3-year term annual Measure AA funds for RVSD: \$132,956

Additional \$30,000 provided annually to off-set program costs

New 3-year term annual Measure AA funds estimated for RVSD:

- Option 1 with five schools participating: \$190,057
- Option 2 with six schools participating: \$184,209
