2023 Roadway Repair and Rehabilitation Projects

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Facts about Fairfax Streets and Roads

- Fairfax has approximately 27.6 centerline miles of Town Maintained streets and roads
- Fairfax recently received its Pavement Management Technical Assistance Program for Round 23 (P-TAP 23) results
- Currently, the Fairfax Overall Pavement Condition Index (PCI) is 55 out of 100, this is the lowest in Marin County
- Approximately 37% of the road network in Fairfax is listed as "Poor" or "Failed"
- The P-TAP report estimates that \$7.2 Million over the next 5 years could improve the PCI from 55 to 60. The dollar figure does not include addressing other aspects of road repair including ADA improvements or sub-surface issues such as storm drains or soil movement/stability

Creation of a 5 Year Program

- It is the intent of the Public Works Department to establish an initial 5 year program for road repair and rehabilitation utilizing the results and recommendations of the P-TAP report as well as the input from consultants and contractors and the community.
- Projects will be identified within the 5 year program and the number of projects may vary depending upon budget allocations and costs of the projects themselves
- The Department of Public Works will work with its partners at Marin Municipal Water District (MMWD), PG&E, Ross Valley Sanitary District (RSVD) and other utilities to coordinate work as much as possible to ensure that road improvements put into place are not damaged by the subsequent work of other agencies.

Current year Program 2023

Current Identified Projects for current year include:

- Scenic Ave from Azalea to Manor (PCI of 30)
- Porteous from Bolinas to Wood Lane (PCI between 11 and 30)
- Claus from Sir Francis Drake to Burdette (PCI of 43)
- Roads were selected based upon condition, utility to the Community, location in the Town of Fairfax and minimal secondary requirements such as storm drain work
- Roads were presented to partner agencies and there is no planned work on these streets in the next 3 years by other agencies
- Identified projects are within the Streets and Roads Budget for current fiscal year.

Benefits of refurbishing Scenic

- Very well traveled roadway for residents coming from the hills and adjacent neighborhoods
- Part of Bike Pathways to Schools
- Generally flat with little to no issues with soil subsidence
- Some Sidewalk curb cut work may be necessary

Benefits of Refurbishing Porteous

- Significant residential traffic corridor
- Failed condition in some areas
- Typically flat with little to no soil subsidence issues
- Very little below ground storm drainage infrastructure that might need updating

Benefits of Refurbishing Claus

- PCI is average and is a good example of refurbishing a street even in decent condition to prevent further and faster degradation
- Improvements may include new curb cuts providing improved ADA access for neighborhood
- Location near Mercy Housing for improved vehicular and pedestrian access

- Location near a Town Park which may have increased number of visitors compared to other streets
- Access point to Sir Francis Drake for that section of Fairfax

- Due to size of anticipated project, Bid Process will be formal requiring 30 Day Bid Period, firm Bid Opening Date, and evaluation of apparent low bidder's responsiveness and responsibility (Spring 2023)

- Town Council to Award Project (Spring 2023)
- Schedule and Complete Work (Summer and Fall 2023)

- Crack Seal and replace street markings and curb paint on Broadway between Pacheco and Bolinas
- Crack Seal on Rocca Drive
- Evaluating spot repairs on Sir
 Francis Drake in multiple locations
- Roadway rehabilitation as part of 145 Canyon Road Stabilization Project
