Low-flying planes will drop "cover crop" seeds - a non-GMO mixture of grass and clover seeds - on over 2,000 acres of cropland in Northern and Central New Jersey.

Instead of leaving farm fields bare over the winter, farmers will grow a mix of plants that keep soils covered until they plant in the spring. By planting cover crops, farmers are preventing erosion during the winter, sequestering carbon, protecting water quality, and enhancing soil health.

Seeding will occur between September 1<sup>st</sup> through September 14<sup>th</sup>. Exact dates are weather dependent. Check our facebook page (@NJRCD) for updates.

 In 2021, Aerial seeding will occur on farm fields in the following areas: Warren County: Franklin Township, Mansfield Township, Harmony Township, White Township, and Hope Township.
Hunterdon County: Clinton Township, Tewksbury Township, and Bethlehem Township.
Morris County: Washington Township
Somerset County: Franklin Township
Mercer County: Hopewell Township
