- 1. Rogers Pond
 - Diane will locate information available and add into Idea Bank
 - Much of the historical information was misplaced several years ago and could not be located. Engineering firm that did study in early-2000s has gone out of business and reports cannot be located.
 - Princeton Hydro did a study in 2018-2019 and the pond has a lot of duckweed which is not harmful. Pond cannot be restored because the Capoolong Creek base has eroded over the years so it is significantly below the intake pipes. The Capoolong is a C-1 stream so needs DEP approvals to do any work associated with the Pond.
