

Well Water Testing Decision Guide

 *Testing private well water annually for coliform bacteria and nitrates is recommended by local Health Departments, the Environmental Protection Agency and the Center for Disease Control. **In New Jersey, under the Private Well Testing Act, wells are required to be tested for all of the following contaminants at the time of home sale. <u>Exceptions:</u> Gross Alpha became a requirement in 2018. PFAS became a requirement in December 2021. Radon (in water) is not a requirement.
