**RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRANKLIN, COUNTY OF
HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND
THE TOWNSHIP CLERK TO EXECUTE THE INTERLOCAL SERVICES
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE POLLUTION CONTROL FINANCING
AUTHORITY OF WARREN COUNTY AND THE TOWNSHIP OF FRANKLIN,
COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY FOR THE 2024
CALENDAR YEAR**

WHEREAS, the Township of Franklin is presently engaged in an Interlocal Services Agreement with the Pollution Control Financing Authority of Warren County (PCFAWC) for disposal of bulky waste; and

WHEREAS, the fee for municipal solid waste shall be \$84.00 / New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Recycling Tax \$3.00 per ton for the term of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Franklin believes it is in the best interest of the taxpayers to continue the Interlocal Services Agreement with PCFAWC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Franklin, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, does hereby authorize the Mayor and Township Clerk to execute the Interlocal Services Agreement between the Pollution Control Financing Authority of Warren County and the Township of Franklin.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and the Township Clerk are authorized to sign and attest on behalf of the Township.

INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT

The purpose of this Resolution is to authorize the Mayor and the Township Clerk to execute the Interlocal Agreement with the Pollution Control Financing Authority of Warren County. The Township has previously used the Authority's services for bulky waste, and, upon recommendation from the Department of Public Works Supervisor, the Township is renewing the agreement. This will allow the Township to dispose of larger waste material at the Warren County Facility and will alleviate the burden on the residents.
