March 2025 Report

Hellam Fire Company

For the month of February, the Hellam Fire Company responded to 61 calls with 24 (39%) in Hellam Township. Year to date for 2025, we responded to 106 calls with 46 (3%) in Hellam Township. Last February, there were 45 calls with 22 (49%) in the Township and 115 calls year to date with 67 (58%) in the Township. There was one automatic fire alarm report submitted this month.

Members trained on the hazards and methods of disabling the high tension cable barriers recently installed on Route 30 along with members from Wrightsville Fire Department.

Engine 21-2 completed the annual inspection and service with no major issues. Our air packs also had their annual service and maintenance. Our inventory of air packs consists of 6 packs that are 17 years old and 18 packs that are 12 years old. The service life of an air pack is 15 years. Last year we applied for a FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) to replace our air packs. We are still awaiting feedback on our grant application.

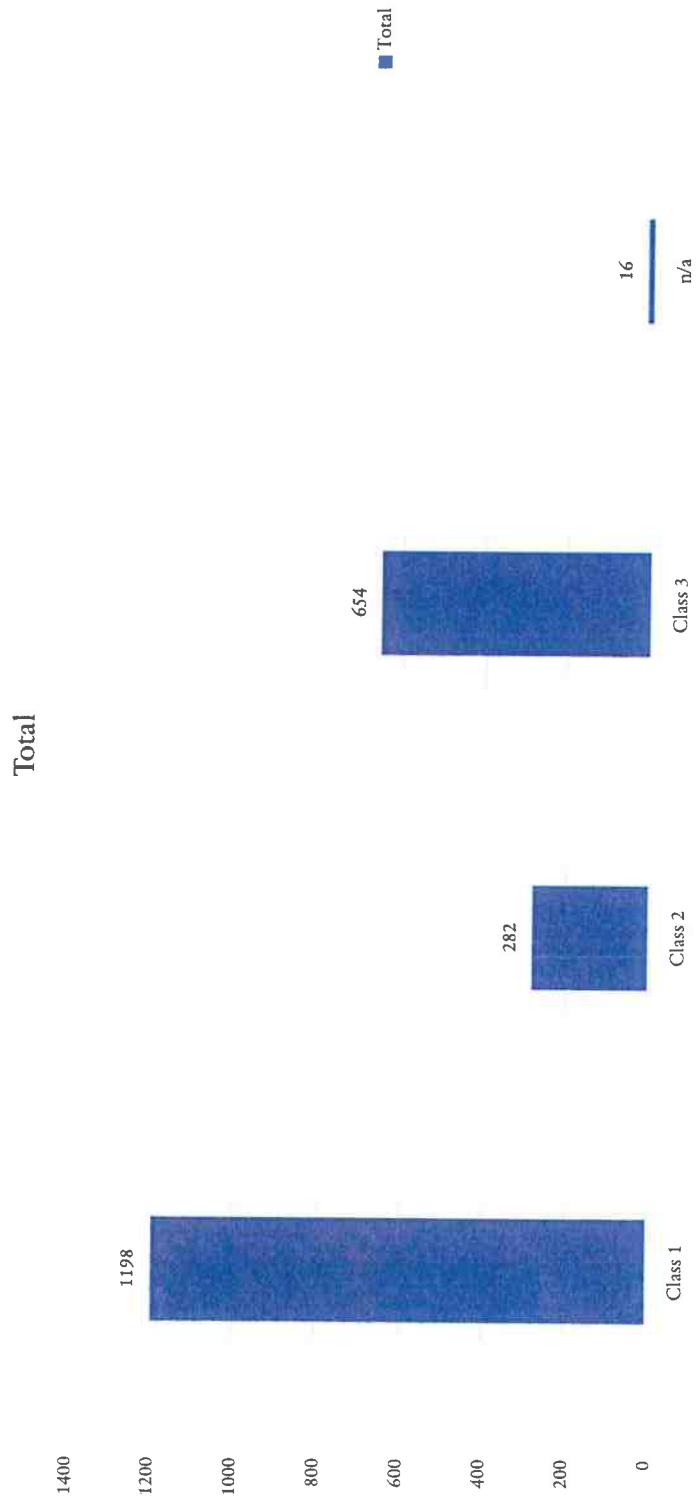

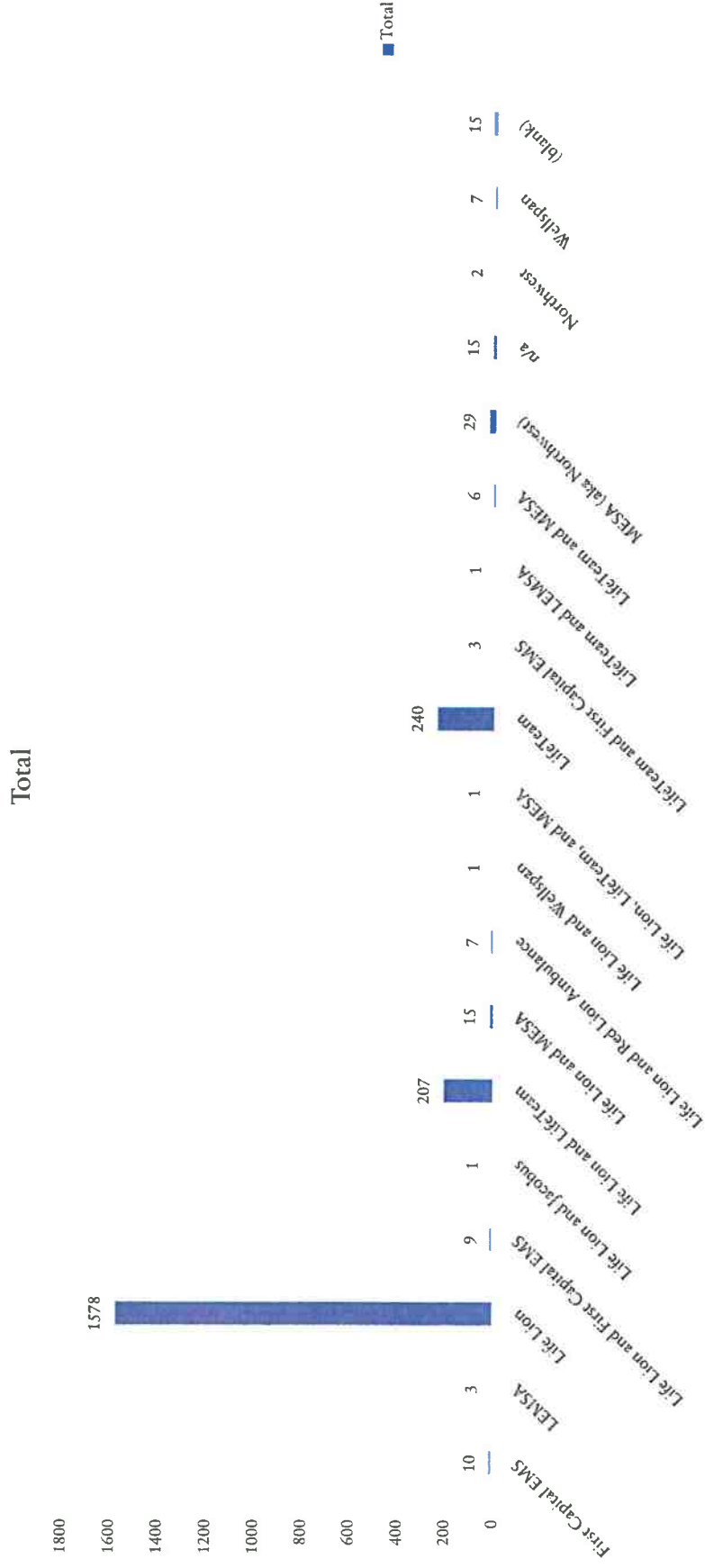


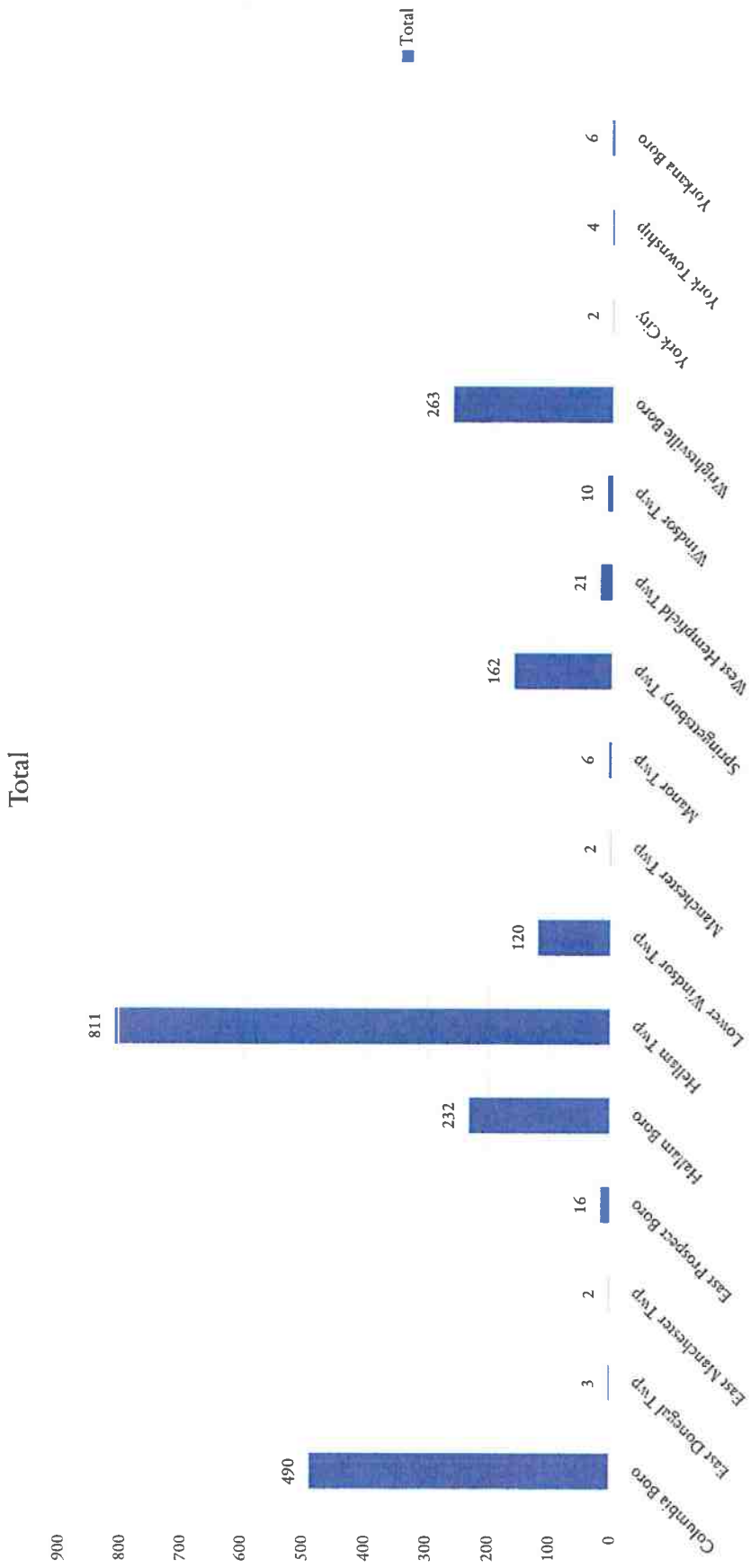

- Plow trucks were out for every snow and ice event plowing and cindering where necessary to keep the roads as safe as possible.
- After every snow event all snow equipment was checked and repaired to be ready for the next snow.
- Worked on various projects at the Community Building and at the Administration building.
- Continuing general maintenance on the buildings and all non-snow vehicles and equipment.
- Replaced street signs, a post and a break a way that were damaged from high winds.
- Graded several stone roads to help with the pot holes.
- Placed cold patch material in pot holes on various roads.
- Ran routes several times checking for ice and debris on roadways.
- Completed four stormwater inspections.
- Responded to 27 PA One calls.
