August 2025 Report

Hellam Fire Company

For the month of July, the Hellam Fire Company responded to 73 calls with 36 (49%) in Hellam Township. Year to date for 2025, we responded to 366 calls with 171 (47%) in Hellam Township. Last July, there were 91 calls with 57 (63%) in the Township and 374 calls year to date with 209 (56%) in the Township. There were six automatic fire alarm reports submitted this month. Four of those fire alarm reports are from calls at Pyramid Health. This year through July, we have responded to nine fire alarms at Pyramid Health.

Members completed training on Rigging for Swiftwater Rescue, Entry Level Fire Ground Support, and Traffic Incident Management. We also met with PA DCNR to complete a walkthrough of the Susquehanna Riverlands State Park.

We attended the Wrightsville Independence Day fireworks, handling two calls and assisting with traffic control at 9th and Hellam.

The Pennsylvania Office of the State Fire Commissioner (PA OSFC) provides a Records Management System (RMS) free of charge. PA OSFC has chosen to change vendors for the RMS and announced the process to change over only nine weeks before the current system is no longer available. The timeline to convert to the new RMS places an extreme burden on first responder agencies. I have enlisted the help of Senator Phillips-Hill and Representative D'Orsie to have our account created earlier in the process to allow time for system setup, training, and data conversion to be ready before the current system is closed on September 30th. Please expect the data received in my monthly reports to look different as we navigate the new system. I will do my best to provide the same information that has been provided for many years.

MINUTES OF 23 JUNE 2025 MEETING

At 6:00 p.m. Chairman Miller called the 23 June 2025 meeting of the Eastern York County Sewer Authority to order.

RECOGNITION OF PUBLIC

To a question from Chairman Miller, Mr. Ricky Garner stated that he had no comments.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Minutes of 19 May 2025 were unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

Operator's Report:

<u>Influent Pump Station Transducer/Float Failure:</u> Mr. Dunn advised that ARRO responded to an alarm call on May 25, 2025. The pumps didn't know to turn on and pump down, so there were high levels. ARRO was able to pump down by hand while Mr. Dunn contacted Control Systems 21, who visited that same day and resolved the issue. Control Systems 21 mentioned coming back to work on the hanger with the floats and will provide a quote to EYCSA.

<u>Utility Pole Replacement:</u> Mr. Dunn explained that during the utility pole replacement at the WWTP, ARRO experienced issues with the generator, which didn't want to run while the power was off. Winter Engine-Generator Service, Inc. found a faulty thermostat in the generator and replaced it, which resolved the issue.

To a question from Mr. Newcomer, Mr. Dunn explained that the WWTP cannot go for very long without electric. It's vital to have the pumps and disinfection run without interruption.

Control Panel Alarm: On 6/19/2025, ARRO visited the WWTP for a control panel general alarm, thought to have been from a power blip. Some of the equipment needed to be restarted upon arrival. Mr. Miller confirmed a power outage in Hellam Township on the evening of 6/19/2025.

Engineer's Report:

<u>Freysville Rd Manhole:</u> Mr. Hardman confirmed receipt of the Highway Occupancy Permit from PennDOT and advised that Gingerich Landscaping & Excavating would be onsite tomorrow [June 24, 2025] to start the project. The work will begin early and is expected to be completed in one day.

- 4100 Lincoln Hwy: Additional sanitary sewer testing and televising of the line was completed. Most of the manholes were vacuum-tested and the remainder will be tested once the manholes are brought up to grade. The developer will pass the televising footage along to C. S. Davidson, Inc. for review. Mr. Miller advised of an abandoned leg of the line, as the building was initially set up for two uses and will now only be one. Mr. Miller confirmed that he completed the inspection.
- 2025 Maintenance Program Problem Areas: During this year's Maintenance Program, Mr. Brent Zeiders of Pennsylvania Sewer Authority reported several sags and an indentation in EYCSA's sewer main. Mr. Hardman explained that the water isn't moving in the areas where the sags are located and noted that the water is sitting stagnant. There are two areas that are 30%, one area that's at 50%, and two areas that are at 75%. In the area of the sags, Mr. Zeiders' camera became completely submerged, restricting his view. Mr. Zeiders is recommending flushing the sags and televising those areas so EYCSA can see what's going on. Mr. Hardman recommends at least focusing on the two sags that are at 75%. Those sags are located by Emig Park [just before the line goes under the creek] and Buttonwood. To a question from Mr. Miller, Mr. Hardman advised that EYCSA owns 25' of line towards Buttonwood from the centerline of Buttonwood; the remainder is considered private. EYCSA could potentially partner with Buttonwood if repairs are necessary.

The Board voted and unanimously approved Mr. Zeiders proposal in the amount of \$3,000.00. This will cover high pressure cleaning and vacuuming the associated manholes to provide access to televise the two sags at 75%. Mr. Zeiders noted that if he can't get a good look at both sags, he will only charge EYCSA for one sag [\$1,500.00] versus two.

The indentation was briefly discussed and no action was taken.

Private Lateral Repair/Replacement: Mr. Miller explained that he recently inspected a private lateral where a liner was pulled inside the existing lateral versus digging it up and fully replacing it. To a question from Mr. Miller, Mr. Hardman commented that there are different liner thicknesses and noted that it generally does not affect the flow. A minimum and maximum thickness guideline can be established by EYCSA, if they'd like to add it to their specifications. No action was taken.

Solicitor's Report:

Nothing to report.

WWTP:

- <u>Rubber Roof Replacement:</u> After a brief discussion, the Board voted and unanimously approved Ream Roofing's proposal in the amount of \$16,900.00. This includes a 2-year workmanship warranty and 20-year manufacturer's warranty.
- Solar Updates: There was a brief discussion surrounding the refundable deposit agreement that American Sentry Solar provided to EYCSA, which would help lock in the 30% Federal Tax Credit. After a brief discussion, no action was taken. EYCSA would need to go out for bid if they were to proceed with American Sentry Solar, and EYCSA is not allowed to sign any sort of agreement with a contractor prior to finding out if they are awarded the Local Share Account Grant.
- <u>Leak Under Garage Door:</u> Ms. Polonikas pointed out that the garage door at the WWTP has been leaking during significant rainfall. Mr. Gromling mentioned that the seals on the bottom of the door should be checked. They may need cleaned off or the door may need adjusted.

Developers:

<u>198 W Beaver St – Susquehanna Micro:</u> To a question from Mr. Newcomer, Mr. Miller advised that he has not completed the final plumbing inspection, to date.

Customers:

- <u>4223 Lincoln Hwy Riverview Corporate, LLC:</u> The Board voted and unanimously approved an additional EDU for the property; one for Riverview Mechanical and one for Captain Crab.
- 433 E Market St Brian E. Townsley: Mr. Miller explained that Mr. Townsley's plumber provided video footage showing one of the two leaks directly above the kitchen sink. EYCSA has no way to detect exactly how much water went into the sanitary sewer system, so after a brief discussion, the Board decided to request that Mr. Townsley submit a claim through his insurance company to see what they will pay. If the insurance company doesn't cover the amount owed [\$4,046.95], the Board will work with Mr. Townsley on the overage charges.

Administration Report:

- EYCSA Office Sign: The Board approved having Ms. Polonikas contact Ascom, Inc. to schedule a service call for the EYCSA office sign, as it appears one of the tube lights is not working.
- Billing Card Memo Line: Ms. Polonikas explained that it may cost EYCSA extra to print the memo line of the billing card in color [to announce that EYCSA will be accepting credit/debit card payments at the office and online]. After a brief discussion, the Board agreed that they were fine with this.
- Executive Secretary Paid Time Off: Ms. Polonikas will be out of the office from June 30, 2025 through July 9, 2025. The Board voted and unanimously approved Ms. Jones working a maximum of 30 hours per week in Ms. Polonikas' absence.

The Board voted and unanimously approved the June Executive Secretary's Report.

NEW BUSINESS

- <u>Utility Pole Replacement:</u> Mr. Miller confirmed that a new pole was installed where the utility pole fell over at the WWTP. The electrical lines were transferred to the new pole, while the remaining lines were left on the old pole, which was secured to the new pole. Ms. Jones has made several phone calls to Comcast and Verizon in an effort to have those remaining lines transferred to the new pole.
- <u>Payment of Operating Expenses:</u> Payment of operating expenses for SSSA Numbers 0, 1, & 2, payroll, and ACNB interest-only payment [\$7,346.23], in the total amount of \$53,115.77 were unanimously approved.
- Next Board Meeting: Monday, July 28, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. at the EYCSA Office, located at 4 West Market Street, Hallam, PA 17406.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no other business and upon a unanimous vote, the meeting was adjourned at 6:44 p.m.
