For the month of July, the Hellam Fire Company responded to 38 calls with 21 (55%) in Hellam Township. Year to date for 2023, we responded to 289 calls with 145 (50%) in Hellam Township. Last July, there were 45 calls with 20 (44%) in the Township and 297 calls year to date with 142 (48%) in the Township. There were two automatic fire alarm reports submitted this month.

Last month members attended training on Urban Flooding for First Responders. Crews stood by for the July 4th fireworks and participated in the Emergency Services parade at the York State Fair. I attended the Stakeholder Preparedness Review for Fire Management and Suppression hosted by the York County Office of Emergency Management. Only two fire departments of the 53 in York County were represented in this open meeting. We have also been actively participating in the planning and discussion for the Route 462 bridge traffic management, attending meetings with Rep. D'Orsie

The chassis for the new Brush has been completed and delivered to Marco Equipment Sales. The current estimate for vehicle completion is late May 2024. Last month we took delivery of about 3,500' of hose purchased through the PA DCNR 50/50 cost sharing grant. This hose joins the nozzles and other wildland equipment purchased through the grant over the last year.



Public comments: Nedette informs us of desire to reestablish previous practice of consulting EAC when Twp gets SALDO plans. This is part of EAC's mission so it should resume.

At 7:00 p.m. Chairman Miller called the 26 June 2023 meeting of the Eastern York County Sewer Authority to order.

RECOGNITION OF PUBLIC

To a question from Chairman Miller, Mr. Ricky Garner and Ms. Sherry Myers stated that they had no comments.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Minutes of 22 May 2023 were unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

WWTP:

Operator's Report:

Discharge Monitoring Report: The monthly report was prepared and submitted electronically (eDMR) for May 2023. EYCSA was in full compliance of its NPDES Permit and there were no violations for the period of May 2023.

Omni Dialer Battery Pack: Mr. Schaeffer confirmed that the Interstate battery pack that was in the Omni Dialer at the Influent Pump Station [that was replaced last month] was indeed the original battery.

Campbell Rd Pump Station Updates: Mr. Schaeffer discussed the recent alarms that were received at Campbell Rd Pump Station and noted that several of the alarms have been common alarms, not specific alarms. The incoming alarms should be specific, as Mr. Schaffer provided a specific list of alarms to Envirep, Inc. to be programmed into the OmniSite Alarm System before startup of the new station.

During one of the alarm instances, Envirep, Inc. visited the Campbell Rd Pump Station and found pump #1 clogged. Mr. Schaeffer explained that the new pumps are still loud and vibrating hard. He added that if a clog happened this soon into the startup of the new station, this will be a consistent issue in the future. There was a brief discussion and Mr. Schaffer noted that he's concerned that the loud, rattling pumps will end up doing damage to the pumps, as air in the pump can ruin the impellers. To a question from Mr. Miller, Mr. Schaeffer stated that the vibration is consistent, not just upon startup. Envirep, Inc. has visited the Campbell Rd Pump Station several times for this issue and they continue to say the pumps sound normal. Mr. Schaeffer commented that he wishes Envirep, Inc. would partner with him beforehand so he can be present during these service visits. He finds it odd that Envirep, Inc. never provided pictures of the pump #1 clog and noted that he questions whether or not the pump was actually clogged.

- Mr. Hardman explained that EYCSA continues to get invoices from Envirep, Inc. for service calls that, in his opinion, should be covered under the 5-year warranty. EYCSA feels as though Envirep, Inc. has been reluctant to work with them on these issues, so it was decided that a meeting should be held with Envirep, Inc., Mr. Hardman, and Mr. Schaeffer, and an EYCSA Board Member to walk through some of the concerns. Ms. Polonikas will send an email to Envirep, Inc. listing the concerns and will coordinate the meeting.
- Mr. Schaeffer advised that the drain that sits in between the two pumps at Campbell Rd Pump Station is approximately ½" high, which is causing water to sit in the station. The Operator purchased a mop to be kept at Campbell Rd Pump Station, however, there's still water in the station, even after mopping the area.
- Pre-EQ Tank Cleaning: Mr. Schaeffer confirmed that Kline's Services visited the WWTP and cleaned the Pre EQ Tank. He added that it was extremely gritty/dirty and suggested EYCSA set it up on a cleaning schedule of every 1-1½ years. The transfer pump in the Pre EQ tank was clogged from all the grit, so Mr. Schaeffer went down into the tank and pulled/cleaned the pump. The Operator sprayed the pump off and Mr. Schaeffer reconnected it and it worked fine. Mr. Schaeffer commented that the transfer pump is so small it would take days to transfer any significant amount.
 - Kline's Services Service Agreement #23334 [in the amount of \$4,850.00] was not approved, as the Post EQ Tank does not need cleaned at this time.
- <u>Drum Filter Cleaning:</u> Mr. Schaeffer advised that he and a co-worker from ARRO Water Services cleaned filter #2. He noted that the filter wasn't as dirty as the last time he had cleaned it. Mr. Schaeffer plans on cleaning filter #1 in the coming weeks.
- Air Diffusers: Mr. Schaeffer explained that he's bringing the repaired air diffuser back to the WWTP tomorrow morning [June 27, 2023] and installing it.
- <u>Spray Weeds:</u> The Operator purchased weed killer and confirmed with Mr. Schaeffer that he's been keeping up with spraying the high weeds out back (behind the WWTP). Mr. Miller noted that there's still some weeds to be sprayed, as he just walked the area and saw new growth.
- <u>Freysville Rd Paving Project:</u> Mr. Schaeffer advised that he was meeting with Mr. Mark Baum of East Jordan Iron Works (EJ), Mr. John Klinedinst of C. S. Davidson, Inc., and Mr. Mackley tomorrow afternoon [June 27, 2023] to pull the ten manhole lids and measure/inspect the riser rings on Freysville Rd.
- Alum Room Rain Gutter: Mr. Schaeffer stated that he has not gotten to the alum room yet, but he did spray the rain gutters with Flex Seal in the area where the UV lights are. He sprayed the rain gutter outside where the pumps are and where the old desk is located. He added that he'll need to use an extension ladder to access the areas that need sprayed in the alum room.
- <u>UV System Wiring:</u> Mr. Schaeffer confirmed that he purchased a new plug for the Trojan Technologies circuit board. He noted that he re-wired it with soft wiring so that the door can be opened and closed. He added that since he made plug/wiring replacements, that the issues with the UV light sensitivity have also been resolved.
- <u>Sludge Hauling:</u> Mr. Schaeffer advised that he has temporarily cancelled sludge hauling, as the levels are way down. The sludge hauling frequency was dropped from three loads per week to two loads per week, however, Mr. Schaeffer stopped hauling altogether for the next three weeks.
- <u>Underground Valves:</u> Mr. Schlosser explained that he and Mr. Miller checked on the (now buried) valves in the pit behind the WWTP. Mr. Schlosser went on to explain that it's very damp down in those pits as there's no drainage, which is causing some rusting. Mr. Schaeffer advised that he'd uncover the valves so that they can be accessed. Mr. Schlosser plans to check the bearings and adding grease to each of the four valves.

Engineer's Report:

- 2023 Maintenance Program: Mr. Hardman advised that Mr. Brent Zeiders of Pennsylvania Sewer Authority, started this year's line cleaning/televising project last Friday [June 23, 2023]. Mr. Zeiders will provide measurements for the stub location/depth at 250 Orange St once he completes that portion of the line cleaning/televising.
- 100 Claire Ave Kelli Sellers: Mr. Hardman stated that Ms. Polonikas made him aware of a PA One Call for 100 Claire Ave for "Install Sewer Lateral/s" [on June 23, 2023]. Mr. Hardman advised that he'd reach back out to the developer to seek an update on the project.
- 250 Orange St Wes Dixon: Mr. Hardman confirmed that plans for the project were officially submitted to EYCSA the beginning of June and noted that he had some comments on those plans, which were returned to Mr. Dixon and his engineer via a Plan Review Letter dated June 9, 2023. Some of those comments were briefly discussed with the Board and Mr. Hardman verified that he's still awaiting a response to his Plan Review Letter.
- Campbell Rd Pump Station Replacement: Mr. Hardman explained that after reaching out to WYElectric, LLC, they agreed to remove the \$2,500.00 "Chain Link Fence, Restore" bid item. The Board voted and unanimously approved Contract Change Order No. 2 for Contract No. 1 (General Construction), which will be the final contract change for the project.
- Freysville Rd Paving Project: Mr. Hardman noted that he's been in communication with PennDOT and advised that once EYCSA gets some additional information regarding the timeline from EJ, that he'd follow back up with PennDOT on those details. PennDOT has not provided any details on the start date of the project, to date, other than "mid-July." To a question from Ms. Myers, Ms. Polonikas advised that that order from EJ will be shipped to the WWTP.

Solicitor's Report:

<u>Vince Card Matter:</u> Mr. Miller advised that there's an email including updates from Attorney Evan Gabel of CGA Law Firm included in the Agenda, for Board review.

Administration Report:

- Index Money Market & Checking/Deposit Accounts: After a brief discussion, the Board did not come to a decision regarding the received banking proposals. The two proposals that stood out as potential contenders were Peoples Bank and Citizens Bank. The Board voted and unanimously approved having Ms. Polonikas partner with Mr. Jamie Schlesinger of PFM Financial Advisors, LLC to seek his opinion/recommendation. For the time being, the Board directed Ms. Polonikas to inform Fulton Bank to keep the Checking/Deposit account as is (interest bearing with AA Fees).
- Executive Secretary PTO Request: The Board approved Ms. Polonikas' PTO request for Friday, June 30th through Wednesday, July 5th, 2023. Tuesday, July 4th is a paid vacation day for Independence Day.

The Board voted and unanimously approved the June Executive Secretary's Report.

WWTP:

- Mow/Weed Cut Bank at WWTP: Mr. Mackley confirmed that Hellam Township is scheduled to mow/weed cut the bank at the WWTP Wednesday [June 28, 2023] morning at 7:00 a.m. After a brief discussion, the Board voted and unanimously approved having Environmental Concepts Landscaping visit the WWTP on a monthly basis to mow/weed cut the areas that Hellam Township cannot reach/access. Mr. Mackley is hoping to partner with Hellam Township to see if it's possible for them to come in three times per year versus two times per year to mow/weed cut the bank. Ms. Polonikas verified that Environmental Concepts Landscaping charges \$48.00 per man hour for their services.
- Envirep, Inc.: After a brief discussion, it was decided that Envirep, Inc. Quote Number 5131 was not approved, as EYCSA already has a spare assembly kit (wear plate and impeller for Pre-EQ Pumps). Mr. Miller noted that the only thing Envirep, Inc. needs to do is the installation. To a question

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from Mr. Schlosser, Mr. Schaeffer advised that the unit that's taken out can be re-built for future use. Mr. Schaeffer stated that he confirmed the above with Envirep, Inc., so they are aware. Mr. Miller added that there's at least three spare assembly kits at the WWTP, so he doesn't understand why Envirep, Inc. is trying to sell EYCSA another assembly kit. To a question from Mr. Mackley, Mr. Hardman confirmed that per Envirep, Inc. Invoice Number 75137, labor costs should be approximately \$110.00 per hour. Mr. Hardman commented that Envirep, Inc. usually sends at least two workers out to each service call.

Regarding Envirep, Inc. Invoice Number 75137, Mr. Schaeffer feels as though the seal fail on Influent Pump #1 should have been caught during EYCSA's Annual Preventative Maintenance Agreement visit (which just took place the end of April 2023). It was brought up that EYCSA may need to have someone onsite during these visits to ensure Envirep, Inc. is being thorough, however, EYCSA would have to pay someone to do that. Mr. David Kline of ARRO directly questioned Envirep, Inc. regarding missing the seal fail during the Annual Preventative Maintenance Agreement visit and Envirep, Inc. "gave him the runaround." To a question from Mr. Miller, Ms. Polonikas advised that there's a Service Agreement Checklist which goes over everything that's to be done during the Annual Preventative Maintenance Agreement visits. The Operator made Envirep, Inc. aware that that particular pump had been running more and more, which should have prompted them to look into the issue. Mr. Schaeffer recalls this same thing happening (with the same pump) in 2022. It was decided that this invoice would not be paid for the time being, and the issues noted above would be discussed during the meeting Ms. Polonikas is coordinating with Envirep, Inc. Mr. Schaeffer commented that Envirep, Inc. should also be made aware of the messes they are leaving behind after their service visits.

Collection System:

Envirep, Inc.: Invoice Number 75053 was discussed at the May 22, 2023 Board Meeting, as it was questioned whether or not the repairs/service visit would be covered under the five-year Gorman-Rupp warranty. Mr. Hardman partnered with Envirep, Inc., who believes the invoice would *not* be covered under the warranty, however, didn't want to "fight over such a miniscule amount." Envirep, Inc. requested a written response as to whether or not EYCSA would be paying the invoice. The Board voted and unanimously declined paying the invoice. Mr. Hardman will partner with Ms. Polonikas so she knows who to send the written response to.

Pole Light Repair at Campbell Rd Pump Station: There was a brief discussion regarding how EYCSA should move forward, as EYCSA was in the midst of having Mr. Milton Sultzbaugh of Milts Repair Service order parts for the pole light repair at Campbell Rd Pump Station. Ms. Myers advised that she'd share Mr. Sultzbaugh's contact information with Ms. Polonikas so she could reach out to follow-up. Ms. Polonikas noted that she called and left messages with YoCo Electric and DM Electric [on June 26, 2023].

<u>Freysville Rd Paving Project:</u> After a brief discussion, the Board voted and unanimously approved having Mr. Miller sign the final EJ quotation, no matter what the cost.

Hellam Township Comprehensive Plan: There was a brief discussion regarding the Hellam Township Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Miller approached Hellam Township asking them to include EYCSA, so that EYCSA can be made aware of any future plans for possible expansion of their collection system. No action is necessary at this time, as Hellam Township has not approached the Authority with any requests/information.

Developers:

<u>Vacant Lot on Harold St:</u> Ms. Myers informed the Board that there's a half-acre vacant lot for sale on Harold St. This will most likely be developed, once sold.

S.R. 30 & Kreutz Creek Rd – Love's Travel Stops: No updates.

4100 Lincoln Highway East – 4100 Lincoln Highway, LLC: The property is still up for sale with no recent movement.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Payment of Operating Expenses:</u> Payment of operating expenses for SSSA Numbers 0, 1, & 2, payroll, and ACNB 2016 Bank Note interest-only payment, in the total amount of \$44,685.65 were unanimously approved.
