### Overview of HPD Intervention Activities

# **Project CARE**

Purpose: To divert individuals with serious mental illness from arrest and to provide ongoing outreach and clinical support to individuals with serious mental illness.

# Personnel and Responsibilities:

HPD CARE Intervention Officer: The CARE Intervention Officer responds to crisis calls as part of an intervention response team. The CARE Intervention Officer conducts outreach. CHD CARE Clinician: The CARE Clinician responds to crisis calls as part of an intervention response team. The CARE Clinician provides direct counseling and treatment. CHD CARE Case Manager: The CARE Case Manager develops outreach plans. The CARE Case Manager conducts community visits, outreach, and monitors client activities.

### Project ERASE II

**Purpose:** To prevent overdoses and to provide ongoing recovery support to individuals with substance use challenges. Additionally, ERASE II will provide a drop-in center for individuals with substance issues.

#### Personnel and Responsibilities:

Substance Intervention Officer: The Substance Intervention Officer responds to OD calls as part of an intervention response team. The Substance Intervention Officer conducts outreach. Community-based Recovery Coach: The Community-based Recovery Coach responds to OD calls as part of an intervention response team. The Community-based Recovery Coach does outreach and provides recovery support to clients.

Outreach Coordinator: The Outreach Coordinator manages outreach activities, assigns outreach tasks, and conducts outreach activities.

Hospital-based Recovery Coach: The Hospital-based Recovery Coach supports clients in the hospital because of OD calls. Whenever possible, they refer clients to the Outreach Coordinator.

### Project ERASE – (Similar to ERASE II – Second Shift)

**Purpose**: To prevent overdoses and to provide ongoing recovery support to individuals with substance use challenges.

#### Personnel and Responsibilities:

Substance Intervention Officer: The Substance Intervention Officer responds to OD calls as part of an intervention response team. The Substance Intervention Officer conducts outreach. Community-based Recovery Coach: The Community-based Recovery Coach responds to OD calls as part of an intervention response team. The Community-based Recovery Coach does outreach and provides recovery support to clients.

Hospital-based Recovery Coach: The Hospital-based Recovery Coach supports clients in the hospital because of OD calls. Whenever possible, they refer clients to the Outreach Coordinator.
