Curbside Recycling Collection Schedule

Recycling is collected every other week on your regular trash day. Monday – Friday (Saturday if there is a holiday)

Holiday Schedule

When a scheduled collection day falls on a holiday, that day's collection and all remaining collections for the week will be delayed one day (see calendar).

Friday's collection will be on Saturday. Holidays are (circled O).

Hazardous Waste Drop – Off

Paper - Place in Blue Bin or Paper Bag

- Newspaper/inserts, Magazines, Catalogs, Phone Books, Junk Mail, Office Paper, Paperboard, Cereal Boxes,
- Corrugated cardboard- must be clean, flattened, cut to 3 x 3 and tied in a bundle
- Shredded paper in PAPER BAGS, not plastic
- NO Plastic bags or Pizza Boxes

Containers - Place in blue bin

- Glass bottles/jars, all colors & sizes
- Aluminum/tin/steel cans and lids
- Aluminum foil/pie plates
- All plastic containers labeled...
- Milk cartons and juice boxes
- NO cans or bottles containing paint or hazardous materials
- NO window glass, dishes, Pyrex or ceramics
- NO plastic bags or plastic film
- NO metal items

Did you know...?

The City of Holyoke has an ordinance regarding curbside trash disposal, Section 74-2 of the Holyoke Code of Ordinances:

- 1 Rubbish shall be placed in watertight containers, no larger than 35 gallons, with a tight-fitting lid and two intact handles, and able to be lifted when full by one person. Residents shall provide enough containers to adequately contain all rubbish at each location.
- 2 Each container must not be overloaded so that the lid will fit securely.
- 3 No more than 12 containers at each location on a weekly basis.
