Speed Hump Petition – Laurel Street

Dear Ms. McGee:

Enclosed is a Speed Hump Petition which has been signed by the majority of homeowners on Laurel Street (House numbers 45, 49, 43, 33, 29, 23, 51, 41, 56, 26, 37, 17, 20, 19, 11, 34, 14, 5, 39, 10 and 30).

The speed at which cars and motorcycles travel on Laurel Street has overwhelming increased in the past years to the point that all residents are concerned for their safety. Speeds routinely are approximately 50 to 60 mph, if not more. We regularly see motorcycles doing wheelies as soon as they turn onto Laurel (from Northampton Street) to the intersection of Brown, at high rates of speed as well. Cars parked on the streets are often hit, with the offenders not stopping. The road narrows at the Brown Ave end and with cars parked on the side, they all try to squeeze through at the same time, which ends up with mirrors on parked cars being hit. One neighbor reported 3 accidents in front of her house alone. Kids are not safe to play in their own yards or ride their bikes due to the speeds of cars. Backing out our own driveways is always risky due to the speeds of the cars. Walking and biking is also very risky. There is a daycare on our street as well that speeding traffic pays no mind to. We have zero police presence on our street to monitor the traffic, not that a random officer would make any sort of difference.

As you can see by the number of signatures on the Petition, the homeowners of Laurel Street strongly urge you to install speeds humps to help slow the traffic speeds. Such speed humps have been put on Lawler, Westfield Road, West Franklin and other area streets. It is time to reduce the speeds on our street, for the safety of our residents, as well as other vehicles using our street.

Please contact me with any questions, and please notify the residents of Laurel Street when there is a public hearing scheduled to consider this Petition.
