#### July 23, 2023 -- Holyoke Historical Commission Minutes

Called to order 5:35 No Public comment

Alex from Voces de Esperanza requests a letter of support for the August round of Historic Tax Credits. He mentioned the updates since the last letter: brick has been repointed, windows in progress as mentioned in Stage 1 and Stage 2. The next stage will address the front steps at #48 and # 52 in the fall. Major work will be done on the bodega with a 'move in' date set for October. Construction will probably go into Feb., and we expect to be back to you in January for another letter of support. To date we have \$480,000 tax credits (20% is eligible). Right now, the cost is \$1,677,000 and we have about \$200,000 to request. We appreciate your support and it's not possible without you. Thank you!

Wright block- William Womeldorf asked if the Preservation Restriction – (PR) with CPA has been signed by the Historical Commission. Chris G. has not seen the PR yet. Their attorney has reviewed it and they are good with it now.

They are also will need a letter of support for the August rounds of Historic Tax Credits. They have initial approval from the National Park Service (approved the 106-108 tower) and will make the porches smaller and bring in the guard rails near the roof line so they're not seen from the street.

CPA proposal- tabled for August meeting.

2015 By-laws review- tabled for August meeting.

Pioneer Valley proposal from Shannon Walsh discussion. The City Council approved \$35,000 to go toward with this proposal. The proposal needs to be reviewed by the committee. The purpose of Shannon's proposal is to provide planning support in the form of an historic advisor to the city and other commissions as needed. Chris and Jennifer will check with procurement about the details of payment re: Pioneer Valley Planning Commission was specified.

Also \$35,000 from the Mass Gaming mitigation fund was rewarded to implement the Historic tourism plan created by Shannon in 2021. (end date: 2026/2027). Jennifer will check to see if other departments need to weight in. She will check on the process.

Discussion on meeting with other departments in the city: LHD, problem properties, Building, etc. to help clarify information, set goals and co-ordinate efforts.

The Historical Commission will not have access to the City's computer drive. Only employees/department heads have access.


