\*\*\*PURSUANT TO STATE LAW, JHLS CANNOT UNDERTAKE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES RELATED TO LIBRARY FACILITIES. AS WE HAVE DISCUSSED PREVIOUSLY, JHLS ASKS THE CITY TO INCLUDE AN <u>ADDITIONAL</u> \$750,000 IN CAPITAL EXPENDITURE FUNDING IN ITS FY23-24 BUDGET TO MAKE REPAIRS AND REOPEN (1) THE MEDGAR EVERS BRANCH and (2) THE RICHARD WRIGHT BRANCH. THIS WOULD BE A ONE-TIME EXPENDITURE FOR THE LONG-TERM STABILITY OF THE SYSTEM.\*\*\*

# Performance Goals



- **1.** Relocate, establish and equip a temporary city/county main Eudora Welty headquarter Library in downtown Jackson.
- 2. Assess the physical Library facilities needs and begin critical library repairs and update resources acquisition.
- **3.** Acquire the necessary resources (human and non-human) to plan and develop a five- year strategic plan as required by the MLC Accreditation guidelines.
- **4.** Replace Library motor vehicles and provide maintenance to others as needed
- **5.** Study for appropriate mobile Library system, purchase Bookmobile, equip and implement in rural Jackson/Hinds County.

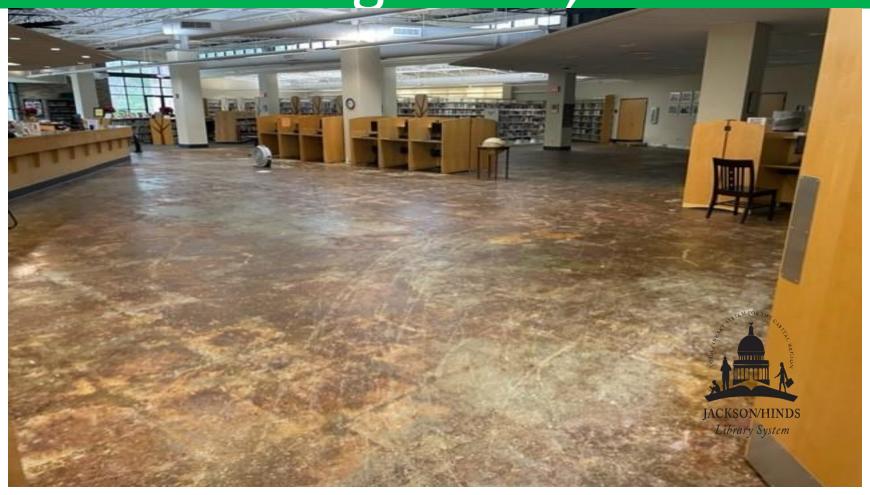

# Top 10 Financial Objectives



- 1. Relocation the Eudora Welty Headquarters Library
- 2. Sustain employee 2.5% cola and fund 5% mandated PERS increase.
- **3.** Fund library staffing of 4 restored positions to accomplish Pre-COVID 19 service levels and to open regional libraries for two evenings each week in support of community homework help time for City/County partnerships.
- 4. Restore a full-time Facilities Manager position for the library system
- **5**.\$250K to maintain (City)library buildings to prevent future closures. Recover libraries in disrepair and implement active maintenance.
- **6.** Adequately fund annual library programs.
- 7. Adequately fund library physical and digital collections.
- 8. Fund City/County Bookmobile Service & Maintenance.
- **9**. Offset State library funds lost due to Hinds County population lost.
- 10. Replace and repair library vehicles for operational support.
