



Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Goals

- Starting Salary of \$50,000 for Sworn Personnel
- Hire new and experienced police officers
- Fill all vacant positions within the department.
- Acquire new Police Technology to enhance crime-fighting efforts.
- Purchase of new vehicles with emergency equipment upfitting.



FY 2024-2025 Services

Our Challenges

- Equipment fatigue (high mileage vehicles that require frequent. repair and present a negative public persona).

- Officer calls for service response time inclusive of CIT

Sworn Starting Salary at \$50,000

Sworn Positions - To achieve Chief Wade's vision of reducing violent and property crime in the City of Jackson, it is of the utmost importance that the Jackson Police Department has the staffing levels available to recruit and retain the best and brightest. This includes raising the starting salary to \$50,000. **Request: \$654,804.94**





Vehicle Purchase & Upfitting

Vehicle Purchase and Upfitting - JPD must continue to purchase emergency vehicles so its personnel can respond to calls for service. In the last decade, the department went two years without vehicle purchases and saw a decrease in funding for vehicle purchases. JPD must replenish its fleet. These funds will allow JPD to purchase an estimated 15 additional vehicles and upfit them with emergency equipment. **Request: \$750,000.00**

Currently, there are 213 Operable Police Vehicles and 315 Inoperable Police Vehicles. These are sedans, SUVs, trucks, vans, and motorcycles.





Flock Public Safety LPR Cameras

Flock Safety LPR Cameras – These License Plate Reader (LPR) Cameras will be strategically placed throughout the city to observe as vehicles enter and exit. These solutions also would allow JPD to share information with other agencies such as Byram, Ridgeland, and Clinton. Will integrate into the RTCC. Request \$96,000.00 Approx 15 LPR Cameras





Safe City Cameras

Safe City Cameras – Additional blue light cameras are strategically placed around the city for additional coverage to be viewed at the RTCC. This will allow more coverage throughout the city. Request: \$75,000.00 Approx 6 Cameras.
