WHEREAS, the public health, safety or general welfare of the community may require that variances be granted in specific cases as set forth in City of Jackson Sign Ordinance, Sections 102-26, et seq., of the City of Jackson Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 102-40, no action by the City Council may be taken concerning a variance from the sign regulations until after a public hearing in relation thereto, at which parties in interest and the general citizenry shall have an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, no variance from the Sign Ordinance shall be passed by the City Council unless and until an application seeking the variance is filed with the City's Signs and License Division, with such application containing, at a minimum, a legal description, location map, plot plan, the exact nature of the requested variance, the grounds upon which it is requested, and/or such other information as may be required by the Signs and License Division manager; and

WHEREAS, said variance application shall also demonstrate that:

- 1. Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
- 2. The literal interpretation of the provisions of the Sign Ordinance would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance;
- 3. The special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the applicant; and
- 4. Granting the variance requested will not confer upon the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; and

WHEREAS, Chipper & Coco, the applicant herein, has requested a variance from the Sign Ordinance regulations to erect 2 building signs totaling 116 square feet within a CMU-1 zone which only allows a total of 15 square feet for building signage.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED that Chipper & Coco is hereby (approved) a variance from the Sign Ordinance regulations to erect 2 building signs totaling 116 square feet within a CMU-1 zone which only allows a total of 15 square feet for building signage, it being determined that the parties in interest and the general citizenry first had their opportunity to be heard and the applicant (has) met the necessary criteria for the requested variance.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the City Council has considered the variance application and grants the variance requested therein based on a finding that special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; the literal interpretation of the provision of the Sign Ordinance (would) deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance; the special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the applicant; and granting the variance requested (will not) confer upon the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.

WHEREAS, no variance from the Sign Ordinance shall be passed by the City Council unless and until an application seeking the variance is filed with the City's Signs and License Division, with such application containing, at a minimum, a legal description, location map, plot plan, the exact nature of the requested variance, the grounds upon which it is requested, and/or such other information as may be required by the Signs and License Division manager; and

WHEREAS, said variance application shall also demonstrate that:

- 1. Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
- 2. The literal interpretation of the provisions of the Sign Ordinance would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance;

- 4. Granting the variance requested will not confer upon the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; and

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI AMENDING SEC. 102-31 OF THE SIGN ORDINANCE ADDING THE EXEMPTION OF DEFINED CHURCH (PLACE OF WORSHIP) WITH EXISTING GROUND SIGN STRUCTURE.

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of the City of Jackson to exempt Churches with an existing ground sign from applying for a permit or variance to change the face of the sign.

WHEARAS, the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi recognizes that existing churches may change institutions either through Lease, purchase or acquisition. In addition the City Council understands that an institution defined as a church (place of worship) has the right and authority without a sign permit or variance to change the face of existing ground sign to represent the name of the place of worship.

**WHEREAS**, a church (place of worship) is defined as a facility used to hold religious services, meetings, and similar activities. The term church shall not carry a secular connotation and shall include buildings in which the religious services of any denomination are held. The term church does not apply to detached accessory uses or church related uses such as schools, residences, coffee houses, day care centers, bingo parlors, and fellowship halls.

**WHEREAS**, this ordinance does not apply to store front or newly built churches (places of worship). This ordinance only applies to existing churches where there is already a defined existing ground sign.

**BE IT HEREBY ORDERED** that the city council amends Sec. 102-31 of the sign ordinance adding the following:

(25) Church (Place Of Worship) with an existing ground sign.

**IT IS FINANLY ORDERED** that the preceding amendment of the referenced Ordinance of the City of Jackson, Mississippi shall be published and effective immediately upon passage.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi is dedicated to increasing the accountability with parents and guardians when it comes to minors being in possession and or committing a crime with a handgun; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi is committed to reducing violent crimes where handguns are used, and

**WHEREAS**, the word handgun means a pistol, revolver or other firearm of any description, loaded or unloaded, from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged, the length of the barrel of which, not including any revolving, detachable or magazine breech, is less than 16 inches; and

**WHEREAS**, this ordinance does exempt the possession of handgun by minor according to the exceptions in accordance with MS State Law Section 97-37-14; and

**FURTHERMORE**, the mandatory punishment and fine shall not exceed the allocated punishment provided in MS State Law Section 97-37-17 Possession of weapons by students; aiding or encouraging.

**THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI** that an ordinance to codify requiring a mandatory punishment and fine for parents and or guardians of minors under 18 years of age who have committed a crime with a handgun and or found to have possession of a handgun read as follows:

#### Section 86-92

- (a) Any parent and or guardian of a minor under 18 years of age who have committed a crime with a handgun and or found to have possession of a handgun for the 1<sup>st</sup> time shall serve a mandatory 24 hours in the county jail and pay a mandatory \$500 fine.
- (b) Any parent and or guardian of a minor under 18 years of age who have committed a crime with a handgun and or found to have possession of a handgun for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time shall serve a mandatory 48 hours in the county jail and pay a mandatory \$1500 fine.
- (c) Any parent and or guardian of a minor under 18 years of age who have committed a crime with a handgun and or found to have possession of a handgun for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time and each additional time shall serve a mandatory 72 hours in the county jail and pay a mandatory \$2500 fine.





The attached agenda item authorizes the Mayor to enter into an Agreement with AngelTrax for the provision of mobile surveillance camera system for the City of Jackson's Public Transportation System (JATRAN) active fleet.

On January 15, 2019, the Department of Planning and Development, Office of City Planning, Transit Services Division, released a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a qualified company for Mobile Surveillance Camera System of the JATRAN system. Currently the City of Jackson's Public Transportation System is operating a fleet of 45 vehicles (23 fixed route and 22 paratransit). We are expecting to receive 4 used buses from Kansas City within the next thirty days and have placed an order for two new buses to arrive within 24 months.

The City received six proposals from the following companies:

- AngelTrax
- Apollo Video Technology
- DT
- Radio Engineering Industries
- Celplan Industries
- Safety Vision, LLC

The review committee recommended that AngelTrax continue with submitting a contract based on the high-ranking score. The review committee felt that all of the proposed contractors were well qualified to provide the services. However, the critical component was the extensive detailing of the proposal, impressive presentation of the products/services, and pricing.

Based on the scoring of the interviews and review of the proposals, the ranking is as follows:

# DECLARATION INVOKING THE EMERGENCY CONTRACT PROCUREMENT PROCEDURE

#### I. REQUEST

The chiller system at the Information Systems Division office building has failed. The Building Maintenance staff of the Public Works Department has attempted repair to no avail. Extreme heat renders the facility uninhabitable when the system fails. There is also critical equipment that may shutdown due to the heat.

The permanent repair will be performed with outside vendor services. At the time of the drafting of the memorandum to me it appeared temporary cooling would be necessary. However, it was determined that the most cost-effective method to proceed would be to replace the chiller. Repairing the existing chiller would take six to eight weeks mainly due to ordering the necessary parts. A replacement chiller can be installed in approximately one week. Spot chillers and fans are being used in the interim until replacement because setting up temporary cooling at this point would take three to four days. The cost of the replacement chiller is anticipated to be approximately \$50,000.00.

Accordingly, I request that you declare this situation an "emergency" as that term is defined in Section 31-7-1 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and authorize the purchase of a replacement chiller, pursuant to Section 31-7-13 (k) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

As background information to assist in your determination that an emergency exists, I have attached a memorandum from Philip Barnes, Facilities Manager. I have also obtained the review and approval of the Office of the City Attorney and Chief Administrative Officer as evidenced by the signatures below.

#### **Background:**

Beginning in early January 2018, the City water system began experiencing issue with dropping pressure associated with prolonged, freezing weather. On January 3, 2018, the Mayor signed the Declaration of Emergency to Invoke Emergency Contract Procedure. The Declaration stated:

As a result of sustained cold temperatures, water production at the O.B. Curtis Water Treatment Plant has been reduced. As a result of reduced water production and ongoing major breaks, water level in most of the City's water tanks is at or near zero. This creates an immediate danger of losing water pressure in the distribution system that would result in the City being unable to supply water to its citizens.

The City does not have enough water maintenance crews at this time to make the necessary repairs in the distribution system quickly enough to ensure the City maintains water pressure during the continuing cold temperatures.

Based on these circumstances, the Public Works Department, the City Attorney, and the Mayor determined that it was appropriate to use the emergency contracting procedures, Section 31-7-13 (k) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, to purchase the materials necessary to make the emergency water line repairs.

A previous council order authorized payment to Consolidated Pipe & Supply Co., Inc., a materials supplier located in Jackson, for materials costing \$17,164.79. Subsequently, the

Department of Public Works received additional invoices in the amount of \$20,226.80. The delay in presenting these invoices was due to miscommunication between UCI, one of the contractors working on the winter weather emergency, and Consolidated Pipe about transmittal of those invoices to the City. There has also been a delay because the remaining funds allocated to pay for the winter emergency, \$13,718.75, were insufficient to cover the entire amount owed. Because the Public Works Department does not currently have the entire amount owed, Consolidated Pipe has agreed to accept a partial payment now and accept the remaining balance at a later time when funding is available.

#### DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY TO INVOKE EMERGENCY CONTRACT PROCEDURE

#### I. REQUEST

As a result of sustained cold temperatures, water production at the O.B. Curtis Water Treatment Plant has been reduced. As a result of reduced water production and ongoing major breaks, water level in most of the City's water tanks is at or near zero. This creates an immediate danger of losing water pressure in the distribution system that would result in the City being unable to supply water to its citizens.

The City does not have enough water maintenance crews at this time to make the necessary repairs in the distribution system quickly enough to ensure the City maintains water pressure during the continuing cold temperatures.

Accordingly, I request that you declare this situation an "emergency" as that term is defined in Section 31–7–1 of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, as amended, and authorize the City to retain contractors to complete the repairs to water lines, pursuant to Section 31-7-13 (k) of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, as amended, and to execute and accept such other documents as necessary to accomplish said repair.

Plaintiffs filed this lawsuit against the City of Jackson claiming significant damage to Plaintiffs' property resulting from a police pursuit, along with emotional distress. Specifically, Plaintiffs alleged City of Jackson police officers pursued certain unnamed individuals up and until these unnamed individuals crashed into Plaintiffs' fence. Apparently, these individuals crashed through Plaintiffs' fence, 'knocking down trees, and putting ruts in and tearing up plaintiffs' yard.' Plaintiffs complained that the alleged pursuit resulted in damage to property, and emotional distress, and that 'the actions and inactions of the [City of Jackson police officers] [...] were in reckless disregard of the rights and property of the plaintiffs.'

It is well-settled that a governmental entity shall not be liable for the acts of its employees related to police protection unless the employee acted in reckless disregard of a person's safety. *Collins v. City of Newton*, 240 So.3d 1211 (Miss. 2018). Specifically, the Mississippi Tort Claims Act provides immunity for City of Jackson police officers engaged in police protection activities unless the officers acted in reckless disregard of the safety and well-being of any person. Miss. Code Ann. 11-46-9 (emphasis added). Pertinent to Plaintiffs' claim, the *Collins* Court held specifically that the plain language of the aforementioned statute 'simply does not contemplate liability for actions that may relate merely to alleged reckless disregard of property.' However, Plaintiffs alleged that the actions of the City of Jackson's police officers damaged their property and endangered their safety and well-being causing them emotional distress.

Reckless disregard cases are incredibly fact specific. The Office of the City Attorney recommends the City settle this matter instead of building the case to defend against liability, especially considering Plaintiffs' initial demand was \$35,000 they are now willing to accept \$5,000 to settle their claims.
