ORDER AUTHORIZING THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI TO SELL EXCESS CASES OF WATER AT BELOW MARKET VALUE TO THE CITY OF VICKSBURG, MS ASSIST WITH THE CITY OF VICKSBURG'S WATER CRISIS.

WHEREAS, Section 17-25-25 and Section 31-7-13(m)(vi) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, authorizes the governing authority of a municipality to dispose of or purchase goods from other governmental entities at an agreed upon price; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that excess pallets of water belonging to the City of Jackson, Mississippi may be of use or benefit to the city of Vicksburg, Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Jackson wished to donate the excess cases of water to the City of Vicksburg, however, said donation is precluded by state statue; and

WHEREAS, as such, the City of Jackson determined that the best interest of the City would be served by selling the excess pallets of water belonging to the City of Jackson, Mississippi to the City of Vicksburg, Mississippi, pursuant to the above-referenced statue; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson also finds and determines that it is in its best interest to sell the excess cases of water to the City of Vicksburg at a nominal fee that is below market value as it's in the best interests of the taxpayers of the State.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Mayor be authorized to execute any and all documents and agreements necessary to affect the sale of the excess cases of water to the City of Vicksburg.
