WHEREAS, the public health, safety or general welfare of the community may require that variances be granted in specific cases as set forth in City of Jackson Sign Ordinance, Sections 102-26, et seq., of the City of Jackson Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 102-40, no action by the City Council may be taken concerning a variance from the sign regulations until after a public hearing in relation thereto, at which parties in interest and the general citizenry shall have an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, no variance from the Sign Ordinance shall be passed by the City Council unless and until an application seeking the variance is filed with the City's Signs and License Division, with such application containing, at a minimum, a legal description, location map, plot plan, the exact nature of the requested variance, the grounds upon which it is requested, and/or such other information as may be required by the Signs and License Division manager; and

WHEREAS, said variance application shall also demonstrate that:

- 1. Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
- 2. The literal interpretation of the provisions of the Sign Ordinance would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance;
- 3. The special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the applicant; and
- 4. Granting the variance requested will not confer upon the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; and

WHEREAS, Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company, the applicant herein, has requested a variance from the Sign Ordinance regulations to erect a 785 sq. ft. monument sign at 40 ft. in height within a C-2 zone which allows ground signs to only be 100 sq. ft. in size and 35 ft. in height.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED that Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company is hereby *(approved)* a variance from the Sign Ordinance regulations to erect a 785 sq. ft. monument sign at 40 ft. in height within a C-2 zone which allows ground signs to only be 100 sq. ft. in size and 35 ft. in height.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the City Council has considered the variance application and grants the variance requested therein based on a finding that special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; the literal interpretation of the provision of the Sign Ordinance (would) deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance; the special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the applicant; and granting the variance requested (will not) confer upon the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.

AMENDMENT TO APPLICATION FOR SIGN VARIANCE

COMES NOW Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company

("SFBLI"), the Applicant in the above-mentioned matter, acting by
and through its undersigned attorneys, and hereby amends the

Application for Sign Variance which it filed on or about March 1,

2018. The Applicant would show as follows:

1.

The Applicant is seeking two variances in connection with constructing a new sign to identify its six-story headquarters building located on a 29.8448-acre campus located at 1401 Livingston Lane in the Twin Lakes of Lakeover area north of Interstate Highway 220. The campus is zoned C-2 Limited Commercial District.

2.

The Applicant is seeking to replace its current lowlying ground sign, which has a width of 36 feet and an elevation of 9.8 feet with a more vertical sign. As stated in the Application, the proposed sign would have a height of 40 feet and a square footage of 321.375 feet of lighted area. A conceptual drawing of the proposed new sign, as prepared by Munn Enterprises, Inc., of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, was attached as Exhibit "F" to the Application. The concept drawing gave dimensions for only the lighted area of the proposed new sign, not the entire area that includes the supporting pylon.

3.

The Signs and License Manager of the City of Jackson requested additional information, particularly the area of the entire sign, including supporting pylon. He also requested the distance from the ground to the bottom of the lighted portion of the sign that would read "Farm Bureau Insurance". He requested that additional information in a formal Amendment to the Application. The Applicant is submitting this Amendment to provide the requested additional information.

4 .

The area of the entire sign, including supporting pylon, is 112,937.11 square inches or 784.2855 square feet. The distance from the ground to the bottom of the lighted portion of the sign reading "Farm Bureau Insurance" is 14'-1 3/8". These dimensions appear on the two pages of the revised concept drawing, as prepared by Munn Enterprises, Inc., attached hereto

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as an exhibit. The revised concept drawing updates and replaces the original concept drawing attached as Exhibit "F" to the Application.

5.

The Applicant is thus seeking to construct a new sign 40 feet in height where the maximum height area is normally 35 feet, and is further seeking to construct a sign having a total area of 784.2855 square feet where the maximum sign area is normally 100 feet.

6.

Because the Sign and License Manager also made inquiry about wind pressure matters, the Applicant hereby states, based on information from Munn Enterprises, Inc., that the sign has been designed to survive winds of 150 miles per hour.

7.

The Signs and License Manager has advised the Applicant that the staff has recommended that the requested variances be granted.

WHEREFORE, for reasons set forth in the original

Application, as amended by this document, Southern Farm Bureau

Life Insurance Company, the Applicant, respectfully requests

variances from the provisions of the Sign Ordinance so that it

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can construct the proposed new ground sign on its campus to a height of 40 feet, with a sign area of 784.2855 square feet.


STATEMENT OF INTENT

I. INTRODUCTION

Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company ("SFBLI"), the Applicant, is seeking a variance from the height and sign area requirements of the Sign Ordinance of the City of Jackson in regard to a new sign which it wishes to construct to identify its six-story headquarters building located at 1401 Livingston Lane in the City of Jackson. The building is located on a 29.8448-acre campus in the Twin Lakes of Lakeover area north of Interstate Highway 220. The campus is zoned C-2 Limited Commercial District. The proposed sign would replace a smaller sign that was built pursuant to a Permit issued on July 23, 1996.

II. THE APPLICANT

SFBLI is a major Mississippi insurance company. In fact, it is the largest life insurance company in the state.



SFBLI, which was established in 1946, some 72 years ago, had approximately \$14.9 billion in life insurance coverage in force in Mississippi as of December 31, 2017.

The home office of SFBLI is located in Jackson,

Mississippi. In addition to serving clients in Mississippi,

SFBLI serves clients in ten other states, including Arkansas,

Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, North Carolina,

South Carolina, Texas, and Virginia.

SFBLI is one of several affiliated companies in the Farm Bureau Insurance corporate family. An organizational chart of that corporate family is included in the packet of exhibits to this Application.

Since 1947, SFBLI has paid approximately \$469 million in claims in Mississippi. Current outstanding policy loans to Mississippi policyholders total approximately \$39.9 million. In addition, as of December 2017, SFBLI had 7,595 deferred annuity policies in force issued in Mississippi. These policies have approximately \$432 million in gross accumulations.

Since 1996, SFBLI has paid the State of Mississippi, counties, municipalities, and school districts more than \$26 million in premium taxes, \$12 million in ad valorem taxes, and \$3 million in use taxes.

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SFBLI currently employs approximately 650 people in Mississippi. In 2017, SFBLI paid more than \$49.9 million in salaries. It may be said that SFBLI is a major contributor to the economy of the City of Jackson, the Jackson Metropolitan Area, and—indeed—State of Mississippi. SFBLI is a major player in serving the life insurance needs of the people of Mississippi.

In addition, SFBLI is involved in numerous charitable, civic, church, school, and community activities.

III. THE SOUTHERN FARM BUREAU LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY BUILDING AND ITS CAMPUS

SFBLI has its headquarters in a six-story building located at 1401 Livingston Lane, Jackson, Mississippi 39213. The building, which was opened in 1980, contains 400,000 square feet of office space, with parking spaces for 832 vehicles.

The Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company
Building is located on a campus containing 29.8448 acres, more or
less. The campus is a part of the office park area known as Twin
Lakes of Lakeover, Part I.

As the name Twin Lakes of Lakeover implies, the area features two large lakes, one of which is located between the Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company Building on the north and Interstate Highway 220 on the south. Located in the lake is

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a magnificent water fountain which contributes to the beauty of the campus.

The campus is located generally in the northwest corner of the intersection of Watkins Drive with Interstate Highway 220. One reaches the building by turning west off Watkins Drive onto Livingston Lane, which runs generally east-west on the north side of the building. That thoroughfare is intersected by Lakeover Road, which runs in a southerly and then southwesterly direction on the east and south sides of the building between the lake and Interstate Highway 220. There are a location map and an aerial photograph of the area included in the Application packet.

IV. THE EXISTING SIGN AND THE PROPOSED NEW SIGN

The SFBLI headquarters building is currently marked by a sign, which was permitted in 1996, located generally southeast of, and 406.76 feet from, the building. The sign is a relatively low-lying ground sign, having a width of 36 feet and an elevation of 9.8 feet. That ground sign is located west of the intersection of an access drive with Lakeover Road near the right-of-way of Interstate Highway 220, particularly that portion of the right-of-way carrying the traffic from Watkins Drive onto the westbound lanes of Interstate Highway 220.



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The existing ground sign is difficult to see and read from Interstate Highway 220. The six-story Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company Building needs a larger sign, more vertical than horizontal and having greater visibility. SFBLI has determined that it needs a new sign to more appropriately mark and identify the building to the passing public.

SFBLI wishes to replace the existing ground sign with a new ground sign. A concept drawing of the proposed new sign is included in the Application packet. The proposed new sign would have a height of 40 feet and a square footage of 321.375 feet of lighted area. The lighted area would have flat graphics and an opaque vinyl maroon background internally illuminated with LED's. The lighted area would be on both sides of the sign so that the wording "Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance" and "Farm Bureau Insurance" could be read from both directions. The graphics would be mounted on a pylon made of aluminum cladding with sign stepouts. The cladding would be gray in color. The sign would be in harmony with the SFBLI Building.

The sign would architecturally enhance the SFBLI Building and would cause no safety or other hazard.

It should be noted that the land across Interstate

Highway 220 from the subject property is wooded, vacant, and undeveloped.

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The Twin Lakes Property Owners Association, acting pursuant to the Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Twin Lakes of Lakeover, Part I, adopted in 1976 and amended in 2000, has consented to the installation of the proposed sign, conditioned upon requisite approval for the sign being obtained from the City of Jackson, Mississippi.

The subject property is located on land zoned C-2
Limited Commercial District under the Zoning Ordinance of the
City of Jackson. Under Section 102.30(6) of the Sign Ordinance
of the City of Jackson, the maximum height of a ground sign in an
area zoned C-2 Limited Commercial District is 35 feet, while the
maximum sign area in the C-2 Limited Commercial District shall
not exceed 100 feet. In order to construct the proposed new sign
having a height of 40 feet and a sign area of 321.375 feet, SFBLI
requires a variance from both the said height and sign area
requirements. As required by the Sign Ordinance, the sign will
be located no closer than ten feet to any property line. The
distance of the sign to the right-of-way of Interstate
Highway 220 will be approximately 242 feet.

The campus of SFBLI, with an area of almost 30 acres, and with a frontage on Interstate Highway 220, is obviously not a typical commercial lot housing a small retail business. The sign proposed for the subject property, with a height of 40 feet and

an area of 321.375 square feet, is appropriate for the large campus and for the six-story office building which the sign will help identify.

It should be noted that there is an existing sign 40 feet high located a relatively short distance northeast of the proposed site of the ground sign, which existing sign marks the Twin Lakes of Lakeover area. Thus, in seeking a variance to construct the new sign to a height of 40 feet, the Applicant is not seeking to introduce some new sign height into the general area.

It is the belief of SFBLI that, for the reasons previously described, the Applicant has demonstrated the following:

- (1) That special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
- (2) That literal interpretation of the provisions of the Sign Ordinance would deprive the Applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance;
- (3) That the special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the Applicant; and RECEIVED

(4) That granting the variances requested will not confer upon the Applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.



WHEREAS, the public health, safety or general welfare of the community may require that variances be granted in specific cases as set forth in City of Jackson Sign Ordinance, Sections 102-26, et seq., of the City of Jackson Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 102-40, no action by the City Council may be taken concerning a variance from the sign regulations until after a public hearing in relation thereto, at which parties in interest and the general citizenry shall have an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, no variance from the Sign Ordinance shall be passed by the City Council unless and until an application seeking the variance is filed with the City's Signs and License Division, with such application containing, at a minimum, a legal description, location map, plot plan, the exact nature of the requested variance, the grounds upon which it is requested, and/or such other information as may be required by the Signs and License Division manager; and

WHEREAS, said variance application shall also demonstrate that:

- 1. Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
- 2. The literal interpretation of the provisions of the Sign Ordinance would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance;
- The special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the 3. applicant; and
- Granting the variance requested will not confer upon the applicant any special 4. privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; and

WHEREAS, Southern Farm Bureau Insurance Company, the applicant herein, has requested a variance from the Sign Ordinance regulations to erect a 785 sq. ft. monument sign at 40 ft. in height within a C-2 zone which allows ground signs to only be 100 sq. ft. in size and 35 ft. in height.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED that Southern Farm Bureau Insurance Company is hereby (denied) a variance from the Sign Ordinance regulations to erect a 785 sq. ft. monument sign at 40 ft. in height within a C-2 zone which allows ground signs to only be 100 sq. ft. in size and 35 ft. in height, it being determined that the parties in interest and the general citizenry first had their opportunity to be heard and that the applicant (has not) met the necessary criteria for the requested variance.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the City Council has considered the variance application and denies the variance requested therein based on a finding that no special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district; the literal interpretation of the provision of the Sign Ordinance (would not) deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance; the special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the applicant; and granting the variance requested (will) confer upon the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.

("SFBLI"), the Applicant in the above-mentioned matter, acting by
and through its undersigned attorneys, and hereby amends the

Application for Sign Variance which it filed on or about March 1,

2018. The Applicant would show as follows:

1.

The Applicant is seeking two variances in connection with constructing a new sign to identify its six-story headquarters building located on a 29.8448-acre campus located at 1401 Livingston Lane in the Twin Lakes of Lakeover area north of Interstate Highway 220. The campus is zoned C-2 Limited Commercial District.

2.

The Applicant is seeking to replace its current lowlying ground sign, which has a width of 36 feet and an elevation of 9.8 feet with a more vertical sign. As stated in the Application, the proposed sign would have a height of 40 feet and a square footage of 321.375 feet of lighted area. A conceptual drawing of the proposed new sign, as prepared by Munn Enterprises, Inc., of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, was attached as Exhibit "F" to the Application. The concept drawing gave dimensions for only the lighted area of the proposed new sign, not the entire area that includes the supporting pylon.

3.

The Signs and License Manager of the City of Jackson requested additional information, particularly the area of the entire sign, including supporting pylon. He also requested the distance from the ground to the bottom of the lighted portion of the sign that would read "Farm Bureau Insurance". He requested that additional information in a formal Amendment to the Application. The Applicant is submitting this Amendment to provide the requested additional information.

4.

The area of the entire sign, including supporting pylon, is 112,937.11 square inches or 784.2855 square feet. The distance from the ground to the bottom of the lighted portion of the sign reading "Farm Bureau Insurance" is 14'-1 3/8". These dimensions appear on the two pages of the revised concept drawing, as prepared by Munn Enterprises, Inc., attached hereto

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as an exhibit. The revised concept drawing updates and replaces the original concept drawing attached as Exhibit "F" to the Application.

5.

The Applicant is thus seeking to construct a new sign 40 feet in height where the maximum height area is normally 35 feet, and is further seeking to construct a sign having a total area of 784.2855 square feet where the maximum sign area is normally 100 feet.

6.

Because the Sign and License Manager also made inquiry about wind pressure matters, the Applicant hereby states, based on information from Munn Enterprises, Inc., that the sign has been designed to survive winds of 150 miles per hour.

7.

The Signs and License Manager has advised the Applicant that the staff has recommended that the requested variances be granted.

WHEREFORE, for reasons set forth in the original

Application, as amended by this document, Southern Farm Bureau

Life Insurance Company, the Applicant, respectfully requests

variances from the provisions of the Sign Ordinance so that it

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can construct the proposed new ground sign on its campus to a height of 40 feet, with a sign area of 784.2855 square feet.

STATEMENT OF INTENT

I. INTRODUCTION

Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company ("SFBLI"), the Applicant, is seeking a variance from the height and sign area requirements of the Sign Ordinance of the City of Jackson in regard to a new sign which it wishes to construct to identify its six-story headquarters building located at 1401 Livingston Lane in the City of Jackson. The building is located on a 29.8448-acre campus in the Twin Lakes of Lakeover area north of Interstate Highway 220. The campus is zoned C-2 Limited Commercial District. The proposed sign would replace a smaller sign that was built pursuant to a Permit issued on July 23, 1996.

II. THE APPLICANT

SFBLI is a major Mississippi insurance company. In fact, it is the largest life insurance company in the state.



SFBLI, which was established in 1946, some 72 years ago, had approximately \$14.9 billion in life insurance coverage in force in Mississippi as of December 31, 2017.

The home office of SFBLI is located in Jackson,

Mississippi. In addition to serving clients in Mississippi,

SFBLI serves clients in ten other states, including Arkansas,

Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, North Carolina,

South Carolina, Texas, and Virginia.

SFBLI is one of several affiliated companies in the Farm Bureau Insurance corporate family. An organizational chart of that corporate family is included in the packet of exhibits to this Application.

Since 1947, SFBLI has paid approximately \$469 million in claims in Mississippi. Current outstanding policy loans to Mississippi policyholders total approximately \$39.9 million. In addition, as of December 2017, SFBLI had 7,595 deferred annuity policies in force issued in Mississippi. These policies have approximately \$432 million in gross accumulations.

Since 1996, SFBLI has paid the State of Mississippi, counties, municipalities, and school districts more than \$26 million in premium taxes, \$12 million in ad valorem taxes, and \$3 million in use taxes.

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SFBLI currently employs approximately 650 people in Mississippi. In 2017, SFBLI paid more than \$49.9 million in salaries. It may be said that SFBLI is a major contributor to the economy of the City of Jackson, the Jackson Metropolitan Area, and—indeed—State of Mississippi. SFBLI is a major player in serving the life insurance needs of the people of Mississippi.

In addition, SFBLI is involved in numerous charitable, civic, church, school, and community activities.

III. THE SOUTHERN FARM BUREAU LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY BUILDING AND ITS CAMPUS

SFBLI has its headquarters in a six-story building located at 1401 Livingston Lane, Jackson, Mississippi 39213. The building, which was opened in 1980, contains 400,000 square feet of office space, with parking spaces for 832 vehicles.

The Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company
Building is located on a campus containing 29.8448 acres, more or
less. The campus is a part of the office park area known as Twin
Lakes of Lakeover, Part I.

As the name Twin Lakes of Lakeover implies, the area features two large lakes, one of which is located between the Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company Building on the north and Interstate Highway 220 on the south. Located in the lake is

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a magnificent water fountain which contributes to the beauty of the campus.

The campus is located generally in the northwest corner of the intersection of Watkins Drive with Interstate Highway 220. One reaches the building by turning west off Watkins Drive onto Livingston Lane, which runs generally east-west on the north side of the building. That thoroughfare is intersected by Lakeover Road, which runs in a southerly and then southwesterly direction on the east and south sides of the building between the lake and Interstate Highway 220. There are a location map and an aerial photograph of the area included in the Application packet.

IV. THE EXISTING SIGN AND THE PROPOSED NEW SIGN

The SFBLI headquarters building is currently marked by a sign, which was permitted in 1996, located generally southeast of, and 406.76 feet from, the building. The sign is a relatively low-lying ground sign, having a width of 36 feet and an elevation of 9.8 feet. That ground sign is located west of the intersection of an access drive with Lakeover Road near the right-of-way of Interstate Highway 220, particularly that portion of the right-of-way carrying the traffic from Watkins Drive onto the westbound lanes of Interstate Highway 220.



The existing ground sign is difficult to see and read from Interstate Highway 220. The six-story Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company Building needs a larger sign, more vertical than horizontal and having greater visibility. SFBLI has determined that it needs a new sign to more appropriately mark and identify the building to the passing public.

SFBLI wishes to replace the existing ground sign with a new ground sign. A concept drawing of the proposed new sign is included in the Application packet. The proposed new sign would have a height of 40 feet and a square footage of 321.375 feet of lighted area. The lighted area would have flat graphics and an opaque vinyl maroon background internally illuminated with LED's. The lighted area would be on both sides of the sign so that the wording "Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance" and "Farm Bureau Insurance" could be read from both directions. The graphics would be mounted on a pylon made of aluminum cladding with sign stepouts. The cladding would be gray in color. The sign would be in harmony with the SFBLI Building.

The sign would architecturally enhance the SFBLI Building and would cause no safety or other hazard.

It should be noted that the land across Interstate

Highway 220 from the subject property is wooded, vacant, and undeveloped.

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The Twin Lakes Property Owners Association, acting pursuant to the Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Twin Lakes of Lakeover, Part I, adopted in 1976 and amended in 2000, has consented to the installation of the proposed sign, conditioned upon requisite approval for the sign being obtained from the City of Jackson, Mississippi.

The subject property is located on land zoned C-2
Limited Commercial District under the Zoning Ordinance of the
City of Jackson. Under Section 102.30(6) of the Sign Ordinance
of the City of Jackson, the maximum height of a ground sign in an
area zoned C-2 Limited Commercial District is 35 feet, while the
maximum sign area in the C-2 Limited Commercial District shall
not exceed 100 feet. In order to construct the proposed new sign
having a height of 40 feet and a sign area of 321.375 feet, SFBLI
requires a variance from both the said height and sign area
requirements. As required by the Sign Ordinance, the sign will
be located no closer than ten feet to any property line. The
distance of the sign to the right-of-way of Interstate
Highway 220 will be approximately 242 feet.

The campus of SFBLI, with an area of almost 30 acres, and with a frontage on Interstate Highway 220, is obviously not a typical commercial lot housing a small retail business. The sign proposed for the subject property, with a height of 40 feet and

an area of 321.375 square feet, is appropriate for the large campus and for the six-story office building which the sign will help identify.

It should be noted that there is an existing sign 40 feet high located a relatively short distance northeast of the proposed site of the ground sign, which existing sign marks the Twin Lakes of Lakeover area. Thus, in seeking a variance to construct the new sign to a height of 40 feet, the Applicant is not seeking to introduce some new sign height into the general area.

It is the belief of SFBLI that, for the reasons previously described, the Applicant has demonstrated the following:

- (1) That special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
- (2) That literal interpretation of the provisions of the Sign Ordinance would deprive the Applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the provisions of the Sign Ordinance;
- (3) That the special conditions and circumstances do not result from actions of the Applicant; and RECEIVED

(4) That granting the variances requested will not confer upon the Applicant any special privilege that is denied by the Sign Ordinance to other similar lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, DETERMINING THE NECESSITY FOR AND INVOKING THE AUTHORITY GRANTED TO MUNICIPALITIES BY THE LEGISLATURE WITH RESPECT TO TAX INCREMENT FINANCING AS SET FORTH IN CHAPTER 45 OF TITLE 21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AS AMENDED; DETERMINING THAT THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN FOR THE FONDREN HOSPITALITY PROJECT, MAY 2018, CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, PROPOSES A PROJECT THAT IS A PROJECT ELIGIBLE FOR TAX INCREMENT FINANCING UNDER THE LAWS OF THE STATE; THAT A PUBLIC HEARING BE CONDUCTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN FOR THE FONDREN HOSPITALITY PROJECT, MAY 2018, CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Sections 21-45-1 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), authorize municipalities and counties in the State of Mississippi to undertake and carry out development and redevelopment projects as defined therein with the use of tax increment financing as set forth in detail in the Act;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body, in accordance with the Act, conducted a public hearing on and approved and adopted The City of Jackson, Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan"), for the City, which Redevelopment Plan constitutes a qualified plan under the Act.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has been presented with a tax increment financing plan entitled *Tax Increment Financing Plan, Fondren Hospitality Project, City of Jackson, Mississippi, May 2018*, and hereinafter referred to as the "TIF Plan", a copy of which is attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** and becomes a part hereof in its entirety, the purpose of which is to provide a financing mechanism to construct various needed infrastructure improvements described in the TIF Plan;

WHEREAS, Fondren Hospitality, LLC a Mississippi limited liability company, (the "Developer"), proposes to construct the Fondren Hospitality Project in the City, including a 125 room hotel together with parking and related amenities (the "Project").

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has heretofore identified various parts of the City in need of development and redevelopment and does hereby find that the Project is of major economic significance to and within the City, is within the redevelopment project area described in the Redevelopment Plan, and qualifies as a project eligible for tax increment financing as set forth in the Act; and the Governing Body finds that participation on the part of the City is necessary and would be in the public interest and in the best interest of the public health, safety, morals, and welfare of the City;

WHEREAS, the City proposes to issue Tax Increment Financing Bonds or Notes ("TIF Bonds"), in as development allows, in an amount not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000), which shall be secured solely by a pledge of the incremental increase in real and personal property ad valorem taxes and sales tax rebates from the "TIF District" as set forth in the TIF Plan, which funds will be used to pay the cost of demolishing and removing structures and acquiring and constructing various infrastructure improvements including, but not limited to:

Item #16 May 8, 2018 Kumar, Lumumba installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water, gas and sanitary sewer, construction, renovation, or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, site improvements, structured and surface parking; relocation of electrical lines; lighting and signalization; landscaping of rights-of-way; related architectural/engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees, issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs (collectively "Infrastructure Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Developers have estimated the total cost of the Project to be in excess of \$15,000,000; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the Infrastructure Improvements, the Developers will incur expenses for which the Developers will advance funds, and the City will reimburse the Developers for a portion of such expenses from the proceeds of such TIF Bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, such TIF Bonds shall be secured solely by a pledge of the increase in ad valorem taxes on real and personal property generated within the TIF District and that portion of the increase in sales taxes generated within the TIF District specified in the TIF Plan (the "Tax Increment"), provided, however that the TIF Bonds (as defined below) will be sized and issued based on the incremental increases in ad valorem tax revenues generated from real and personal property in the TIF District based on the City's general fund millage plus fifty percent of the increase in sales tax rebates from the Project; and

WHEREAS, as authorized by the Act, the City will agree to pledge the Tax Increment for payment of debt service on such TIF Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body shall publish a public hearing notice and conduct a public hearing in accordance with the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, ACTING FOR AND BEHALF OF THE CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. Pursuant to the Act, the Council, acting for and on behalf of the City, does hereby declare its intention to sell and issue TIF Bonds of the City in a total aggregate principal amount of not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) (the "Bonds") for the Project proposed to be located in the City.

SECTION TWO. The Governing Body has been presented with the TIF Plan, a copy of which is attached hereto as EXHIBIT A and becomes a part hereof in its entirety, the purpose of which is to provide a financing mechanism to construct various needed infrastructure improvements described in the TIF Plan.

SECTION THREE. The TIF District to be established shall be described in the TIF Plan which shall be adopted and approved as a part of the Redevelopment Plan after holding a public hearing on the matter. The Council hereby gives notice of its intention to create and establish the TIF District and to approve the TIF Plan as a part of the Redevelopment Plan as well as hold a public hearing as prescribed by law.

SECTION FOUR. The Council hereby declares its intention, upon establishment of the TIF District and the approval of the TIF Plan, to issue TIF Bonds not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000). These bonds will be secured solely by a pledge of the increase in advalorem taxes on real and personal property and sales tax rebates generated within the TIF District as described in the TIF Plan; provided, however, the TIF Bonds will be sized and issued based on fifty percent (50%) of the incremental increases in sales tax rebates plus advalorem tax revenues generated from real and personal property in the TIF District based on the City's general fund millage. The funds derived from the sale of the Bonds will be used for the Infrastructure Improvements. These bonds shall never constitute an indebtedness of the City within the meaning of any state constitutional provision or statutory limitation and shall never constitute or give rise to a pecuniary liability of the City, other than from the sources set forth herein, or a charge against its general credit or taxing powers.

SECTION FIVE. The Developer intends to acquire and construct the Infrastructure Improvements at its expense to facilitate the development of the Project, based on the anticipation that TIF moneys will be available in the future. Upon approval of the TIF Plan the City wishes to reimburse the Developer for these expenses expense in whole or part, up to the amount of moneys available from the proceeds of TIF Bonds in the principal amount not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000), at the time TIF Bonds are issued in the future.

SECTION SIX. The Project appears to be a project of major economic significance within the City and to qualify as a project eligible for TIF under the Act and Redevelopment Plan, and the participation on the part of the City is necessary and would be in the public interest and would benefit the economic and financial well-being and the public health, safety and welfare of the City.

SECTION SEVEN. The Council hereby declares its intention to hold a public hearing with respect of the TIF Plan and the issuance of the TIF bonds at the regular meeting room of the Council at the City Hall of the City of Jackson, Mississippi at 6:00 p.m., on May 22, 2018.

SECTION EIGHT. The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a notice of the public hearing in **The Mississippi Link**, a newspaper in which the City is authorized to publish legal notices, once (1 time) not more than twenty (20) days and not less than ten (10) days prior to the date set forth in Section Seven above, pursuant to and in compliance with the requirements of the Act. A copy of the TIF Plan will be available for examination in the office of the City Clerk at City Hall, Jackson, Mississippi.

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Jackson, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "City"), will hold a public hearing on May 22, at 6:00 o'clock p.m. at the regular meeting place of the Governing Body at the City Hall of the City of Jackson, 219 South President Street, Jackson, Mississippi, on the *Tax Increment Financing Plan: Fondren Hospitality Project, City of Jackson, Mississippi, May 2018* (the "TIF Plan"), for consideration by the Governing Body and requesting that the TIF Plan be approved in compliance with The City of Jackson, Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan, and further, to designate the project described in the TIF Plan as appropriate for development and tax increment financing.

The Bonds shall be secured solely by a pledge by the City of the incremental increase in sales tax rebates and real and personal property ad valorem tax revenues generated within the TIF District, as described in the TIF Plan, and will never be a general obligation of the City, will not be secured by the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the City, and will not create any other pecuniary liability on the part of the City other than the pledge of the incremental increase in the ad valorem taxes and sales tax rebates set forth above. If deemed necessary and appropriate, the City may require additional security from the developers of the Project.

Construction of the Infrastructure Improvements and payment of the Bonds issued pursuant to the TIF Plan will be paid as hereinabove set forth and will not require an increase in any kind or type of taxes within the City. TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN FOR THE FONDREN HOSPITALITY PROJECT MAY 2018 CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI

ARTICLE I

A. PREAMBLE

- 1. The administration and implementation of this Tax Increment Financing Plan for the Fondren Hospitality Project, April 2018, City of Jackson, Mississippi (the "TIF Plan") will be an undertaking of the City of Jackson, Mississippi (the "City"), authorized pursuant to Sections 21-45-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "TIF Act"), and in accordance with The City of Jackson, Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan").
- 2. Fondren Hospitality, LLC, a Mississippi limited liability company, its successor or assign, (the "Developer"), proposes to construct a 125 room hotel, parking and related amenities in the Fondren neighborhood in the City (the "Project"). The Project will be located on real property more particularly described in Article VII of this TIF Plan and the map attached hereto as "Exhibit A" (the "Map"). The land described in the Map and Article VII of this Plan constitutes the "TIF District."
- 3. The issuance of bonds to provide funds to finance the costs of infrastructure improvements identified in the TIF Plan will be an undertaking of the City whereby the City will issue Tax Increment Financing Bonds as authorized herein to finance the Project as more fully described herein (the "TIF Bonds"). The TIF Bonds authorized by this TIF Plan shall not exceed \$1,000,000.
- 4. The Mayor and City Council of the City (the "Governing Body") hereby find and determine that the Project is in the best interest of the City and its future development and that it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens that the provision of Section 21-45-9 of the TIF Act requiring dedication of the "redevelopment project" to the City not apply to those improvements which are constructed on the privately owned portion of the Project.
- 5. The tax increment financing funds as identified herein will be used to defray the cost of infrastructure improvements to serve the Project and the community as a whole.
- 6. The Developers have provided information to the City regarding the proposed site plans, the amounts of the private investments, sales taxes, and job creation

projections. Estimates of ad valorem taxes were made through consultation with the office of the Hinds County (the "County") Tax Assessor and valuations of similar projects in the region.

B. STATEMENT OF INTENT

- 1. The City may issue TIF Bonds, pursuant to the Act and authority outlined hereinabove, in an amount not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000), which will be secured solely by a pledge of the increased ad valorem taxes from real and personal property generated within the TIF District, which funds will be used to pay the cost of demolishing and removing structures and acquiring and constructing improvements, which may include, but are not necessarily limited to: installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water, gas and sanitary sewer; construction, renovation, or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, site improvements, structured and surface parking; relocation of electrical lines; lighting and signalization; landscaping of rights-of-way; related architectural/engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees, issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs (collectively "Infrastructure Improvements");
- After sufficient development of the Project has been substantially completed, either
 in total or in phases, the City will issue the TIF Bonds and reimburse the Developers
 in accordance with a development agreement to be entered into between the City
 and the Developer as authorized by the TIF Act.
- 3. The construction of the Infrastructure Improvements will be undertaken to provide for the public convenience, health, and welfare.
- 4. The TIF Bonds will **never** be a general obligation of the City secured by the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the City, nor create any other pecuniary liability on the part of the City other than the pledge of the incremental increase in the ad valorem taxes and sales tax rebates set forth in this TIF Plan.

C. PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

- 1. The public convenience and necessity requires participation by the City in the Project. The Project will accomplish the following, which will provide for the public convenience and necessity and serve the best interests of the citizens of the City:
 - a. Construction of the Project will represent a private investment of approximately \$15,000,000.

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- b. The Project will create construction jobs with an estimated payroll of approximately \$4,500,000.
- c. It is estimated that the Project will create approximately 58 new permanent full-time and part-time jobs.
- d. It is expected that the Project will result in an annual real and personal property tax *increase* of about \$91,721 for the City.
- e. It is expected that the Project will result in an annual real and personal property tax *increase* of about \$60,507 for the County.
- f. It is anticipated that the Project will result in an annual real and personal property tax increase of about \$123,421 for the School District.
- g. The annual sales generated by the Project are expected to reach \$4,200,000, and it is anticipated that the City will receive annual sales tax rebates of \$54,390.
- h. It is anticipated that the Project will yield over \$41,000 in special taxes to the City pursuant to its 1% Convention and Visitors Bureau Tax; \$123,000 in special taxes pursuant to the 3% Capital City Convention Center Tax; and \$25,600 pursuant to the Jackson Occupancy Tax of \$0.75 per day for each occupied hotel room. These special taxes are not eligible for TIF Financing, and the projections are provided for informational purposes only.
- i. The development of the Project will include new businesses and will help diversify and expand the tax base of the City.

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ARTICLE II PROJECT INFORMATION

A. REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Project is expected to consist of a 125 room hotel, parking and related amenities.

1. Project Location

- a. <u>Property Description and Map</u>: The Project is located in the Fondren neighborhood between North State Street (to the East) and Lorenz Boulevard (to the South), as more particularly described in Article VII and Exhibit A attached hereto.
- **B.** Environmental Characteristics and Zoning: Development of the Project site will require improvements such as (but not limited to) the demolition and removal of structures, construction of the hotel and amenities, and the development of the Infrastructure Improvements. All proposed uses shall comply with the applicable zoning ordinances of the City.

ARTICLE III ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IMPACT DESCRIPTION

A. JOB CREATION

- 1. <u>Construction Jobs</u>: The Project is expected to create construction jobs with an estimated payroll of \$4,500,000.
- 2. <u>Permanent Jobs</u>: It is estimated that the Project will create 58 new permanent full-time and part-time jobs.

B. FINANCIAL BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY

1. Ad Valorem Tax Increases: The construction and development of the Project will generate significant ad valorem tax revenues for the City, the County, and the School District. The following are estimates of new ad valorem tax revenues expected to be generated when the Project has been completed and are based on an assumed new combined true value of \$10,526,375 for the development and for furniture, fixtures, equipment, and inventory; and an assumed combined assessed value of \$1,578,956.

ARTICLE IV THE OBJECTIVE OF THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN

A. PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

The primary objective of this TIF Plan is to serve the public convenience and necessity by participating in the Project. The TIF Plan will provide financing to construct the Infrastructure Improvements to serve the general public and the Project.

B. LOCAL CODES AND ORDINANCES

The Project and the Infrastructure Improvements will be constructed in accordance with standards, codes, and ordinances of the City.

C. HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC PROVIDED FOR

The Infrastructure Improvements will provide for the health and welfare of the public by removing structures and improvements that impair the growth and development of the community and by providing for safe and adequate improvements to the TIF District to encourage private redevelopment to the area consistent with the goals of the Redevelopment Plan.

ARTICLE V

A STATEMENT INDICATING THE NEED AND PROPOSED USE OF THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN IN RELATIONSHIP TO THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN

The proposed use of the TIF Plan is to provide a financing mechanism for removing structures and improvements that impair the growth and development of the community, the construction and development of the Infrastructure Improvements which are necessary to serve the public who will utilize the induced development, all as contemplated in the Redevelopment Plan.

ARTICLE VI

A STATEMENT CONTAINING THE COST ESTIMATE OF THE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT, PROJECTED SOURCES OF REVENUE TO MEET THE COSTS, AND TOTAL AMOUNT OF INDEBTEDNESS TO BE INCURRED

A. COST ESTIMATE OF REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

- 1. The development of the TIF District will represent a private investment of approximately \$15,000,000. The proceeds of the TIF Bonds will be used to pay the cost of constructing various Infrastructure Improvements, more particularly described in Article I, Section B.
- 2. The Governing Body does hereby find and determine that the Project is in the best interest of the City and its future development and that it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens that the provision of Section 21-45-9 of the TIF Act requiring dedication of the "redevelopment project" to the City not apply to those improvements which are constructed on the privately owned portion of the Project.
- 3. The construction of the Infrastructure Improvements will be undertaken to provide for the public convenience, health, and welfare.
- 4. Proceeds of the TIF Bonds may also be used to fund capitalized interest and/or a debt service reserve fund as may be permitted under the TIF Act.

B. PROJECTED SOURCES OF REVENUE TO MEET COSTS

- 1. The Developers will secure financing to construct the Project including the work to be funded with TIF Bonds.
- 2. To secure the TIF Bonds the City shall pledge the incremental increase ad valorem tax revenue generated from real and personal property in the TIF District.
- 3. To secure the TIF Bonds the City shall pledge the incremental increase in sales tax rebates generated from the Project.

C. TOTAL AMOUNT OF INDEBTEDNESS TO BE INCURRED

- 1. The City will issue up to One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) in TIF Bonds which shall be secured as follows:
 - (a) The City shall pledge all of the incremental increase in real and personal property ad valorem tax revenues generated from the TIF District together with the incremental increase in sales tax rebates generated from the Project.

- 2. The TIF Bonds will be sized as follows:
 - (a) One hundred percent (100%) of the incremental increases in ad valorem tax revenues generated from real and personal property in the TIF District based on the City's general fund millage (which is currently 50.94 mills); **PLUS**
 - (b) Fifty percent (50%) of the incremental increase in sales tax rebates generated from the Project.
- 3. The Redevelopment Plan and this Tax Increment Financing Plan for the Fondren Hospitality Project, May 2018, City of Jackson, Mississippi will be an undertaking by the City including, but not necessarily limited to, the issuance of the TIF Bonds, which may include bonds, notes, or other debt obligations, to provide funds to defray the cost of the Infrastructure Improvements.
- 4. It is expected that \$1,000,000 in TIF Bonds or notes can be obtained at an annual interest rate of 3.0% for up to fifteen (15) years, and annual principal and interest payments are estimated to be up to approximately \$83,987 resulting in an estimated surplus to the City of \$62,133.
- 5. The amount and timing of the issuance of the TIF Bonds shall be determined pursuant to further proceedings of the City.

ARTICLE VII REAL PROPERTY TO BE INCLUDED IN TAX INCREMENT FINANCING DISTRICT

A. PARCEL NUMBERS FOR THE TIF DISTRICT

The real property to be included in the TIF District from which the ad valorem real and personal property tax revenues will be generated to finance the TIF Bonds are described below and in the Plat. The below True and Assessed Values are for real property and improvements and were obtained from the County Tax Assessor's office, and a copy of the information is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

ARTICLE VIII DURATION OF THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN'S EXISTENCE

The duration of this TIF Plan shall be thirty (30) years from the date of approval thereof.

ARTICLE IX

ESTIMATED IMPACT OF TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN UPON THE REVENUES OF ALL TAXING JURISDICTIONS IN WHICH A REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT IS LOCATED

ARTICLE X

A STATEMENT REQUIRING THAT A SEPARATE FUND BE ESTABLISHED TO RECEIVE AD VALOREM TAXES AND THE PROCEEDS OF ANY OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

A separate fund entitled the "Tax Increment Financing Fund: Fondren Hospitality Project" shall be established by the City to receive ad valorem taxes, sales tax rebates and the proceeds of any other financial assistance in connection with this TIF Plan.

ARTICLE XI

THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY SHALL BY RESOLUTION FROM TIME TO TIME, DETERMINE (i) THE DIVISION OF AD VALOREM TAX RECEIPTS, IF ANY, THAT MAY BE USED TO PAY FOR THE COST OF ALL OR ANY PART OF A REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT; (ii) THE DURATION OF TIME IN WHICH SUCH TAXES MAY BE USED FOR SUCH PURPOSES; (iii) IF THE GOVERNING BODY SHALL ISSUE BONDS FOR SUCH REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT; AND (iv) SUCH OTHER RESTRICTIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS AS IN THE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY SHALL BE NECESSARY IN ORDER TO PROMOTE AND PROTECT THE PUBLIC INTEREST.

Through the adoption of the TIF Plan, the Governing Body of the City acknowledges the above and shall adopt the necessary resolutions when deemed necessary and appropriate.

ARTICLE XII PLAN OF FINANCING

A. SECURITY FOR THE TIF BONDS

The TIF Plan provides for the City to issue the TIF Bonds which will be secured by the pledge of incremental increases in ad valorem real and personal property taxes generated by the Project and the increase in sales tax rebates generated by the Project. To secure the TIF Bonds the City will pledge the incremental increase in ad valorem tax revenues on real and personal property and the incremental increase in sales tax rebates generated by the Project. The TIF Bonds will be sized as set forth in Article VI(C)(2).

B. FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY

Such decision on the most advantageous method for the City to incur the debt will be made pursuant to further proceedings of the City.

C. AMOUNT AND TIMING OF ISSUANCE

The amount and timing of the issuance of the TIF Bonds shall be determined pursuant to further proceedings of the City.

WHEREAS, on April 05, 2016, found at Minute Book 6-J Page 20, the Mayor was authorized to execute all documents necessary to apply and administer the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Grant to the Office of Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes; and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2016, HUD announced the City of Jackson as one of its recipients to be awarded grant funds through the Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Grant and Healthy Homes Supplemental Funds for a 36-month funding period and issued Grant Agreements on October 17, 2016 to begin program activities for the City's Lead Safe Jackson Housing Program; and

WHEREAS, on February 7, 2017, found at Minute Book 6-K Page 517, the original order was amended to authorize the Mayor to execute any and all documents necessary to administer \$1,384,180.42 for the usage of funds awarded through HUD's Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Grant and Healthy Homes Supplemental Funds and \$487,377 of matching CDBG funds; and

Morris and McDaniel Inc., was the only company to submit proposals.

Morris and McDaniel Inc. has extensive experience in developing and conducting valid assessment centers and was the only consultant to submit proposals during the request for proposal process for the development and management of a testing and assessment exercise for promotion to the ranks of Fire Lieutenant Driver Operator, Fire Captain, and District Fire Chief. The cost for each assessment exercise quoted by Morris and McDaniel Inc. is as follows: (1) Fire Lieutenant Driver Operator \$46,696.00 (2) Fire Captain \$61,289.75 and (3) District Fire Chief \$61,362.50.

In an effort to secure valid promotional processes, the Jackson Fire Department and the Department of Personnel Management recommend that the proposals, from Morris and McDaniel Inc., to develop, administer, and manage a testing and assessment process for promotion to the ranks of Fire Lieutenant/Driver Operator, Fire Captain, and District Fire Chief be accepted.
