Thank you for considering our request. The new location for the new Center for Pregnancy Choices Clinic(CPC) is quite simply, not visible from State St. The CPC's store front is on the back side of the building and faces east, away from State St.

Another problem is traffic flow. Kolb's Cleaners is above the CPC and does face State St. Kolb's has a particular traffic flow that vehicles must follow entering and exiting the property. Which means there is only one side of the property that cars can enter to drive to the back of the building to find the CPC and it's hidden parking lot.

After careful thought and meeting with experts it has been determined that solutions are limited for effective signage. The best solution is to place a low to the ground, monument sign at the northwest corner of the property. This location for a sign can be seen by traffic driving both directions on State St. and is on the side of the property where vehicles enter for Kolb's traffic flow.

Our research shows there is no other effective solution for vehicles to find the CPC location and keeping the traffic flow moving the proper direction which will reduce the risk for dangerous traffic accidents on State St.

The City of Jackson is a designated Certified Local Governmental Agency (CLG) and as such is eligible to apply for and receive monies through the Mississippi Department of Archives and History's (MDAH) CLG Grant program. As a designated CLG, the City of Jackson is eligible to apply for a portion of grant money. Each year, MDAH sponsors a new grant cycle and encourages CLGs to submit projects which propose activities to strengthen Mississippi's local historic preservation programs.

The City of Jackson was approved by the City Council, February 7, 2017 to allocate \$5,000 (cash) in its FY 2017 budget as a match to complete the survey project, the total cost of which is \$10,000. The MOA was finalized between the City and MDAH on June 12, 2017 to increase the total project cost to \$20,000 with the City's match remaining as \$5,000 and MDAH to reimburse the City up to \$15,000 of the final project cost.

The enclosed Order authorizes the execution of a Professional Services Agreement between the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, the City of Jackson, and Jeff R. Rosenberg to provide Consulting Services for the Midtown Neighborhood Survey and National Register Nomination.

MDAH received three proposals for the completion of the Jackson Midtown Survey and National Register Nomination services on August 31, 2017. The consultant groups were Cristi R. Wolfe, Jeff R. Rosenberg, and Schneider Historic Preservation, LLC. The Selection Committee met on October 10, 2017 to rate the three proposals. Schneider Historic Preservation, LLC received the highest score in the amount of 310 points and Jeff R. Rosenberg received the second highest score of 308 points. Jeff R. Rosenberg proposal was the lowest of the three bids submitted by a comfortable margin. MDAH also believes, based on recent past performance, that Mr. Rosenberg will deliver the highest quality product, which will be to the benefit of both MDAH and

the City of Jackson. Thus, it is recommended that Jeff R. Rosenberg be selected as the consultant to conduct the activities for the completion of the Project.

Jeff R. Rosenberg will conduct the activities for the project in two phases: 1) includes the completion of the survey field work and the submission of completed survey forms, and 2) completion of leftover field work, submission of completed survey forms and National Register nomination(s), which will be in next year CLG grant application. The FY17 Grant total is \$20,000 for Phase I. The reports, documents and materials required from Jeff R. Rosenberg will be detailed in the contract.

The Project will be managed by the Department of Planning and Development specifically the Historic Preservation Program, the planner with report to Mississippi Department of Archives and History throughout the duration of the project. The City of Jackson received over 5" of rainfall within a short period of time causing significant damage to the City's infrastructure systems. The damages reported was not limited to water mains, sewer mains, bridge structures, and storm drainage systems. The Department of Public Works maintenance crews have limited personnel to handle all of the required repairs. The repairs needed are critical to staying within compliance regarding the Clean Water Act and the Consent Decree. It is also critical in stabilizing the transportation and drainage systems.

The City does not have the personnel or equipment to adequately address the necessary repairs to ensure welfare and safety of the Public. Because of the imminent threat to public health and safety, I recommend that the City enter into a replacement contract as provided for in Section 31-7-13(k) of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972.

DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY TO INVOKE EMERGENCY REPAIR CONTRACT PROCEDURE

I. **REQUEST**

The City of Jackson received over 5" of rainfall within a short period of time on April 2, 2017. The intensity of the rainfall duration caused significant damage to the City of Jackson's water mains, sanitary sewer mains, bridge structures, and storm drainage systems. The urgency to repair the damaged infrastructure is critical to staying within compliance with local and federal agencies who govern the Clean Water Act. The City of Jackson has limited maintenance crews to handle all to the repairs required to stabilize the City's Infrastructure systems.

Accordingly, I request that you declare this situation an "emergency" as that term is defined in Section 31-7-1 of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, as amended, and authorize the City to enter into contracts with local contractor to repair water mains, sewer mains, bridge structures, and storm drainage systems, to Section 31-7-13 (k) of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, as amended, and to execute and accept such other documents and instruments as necessary to accomplish said repairs.

I have provided a memo as background information to assist in your determination that an emergency exists. I have also obtained the review and approval of the Legal Department and Administration Department, as evidenced by the signatures below.

The City of Jackson received over 5" of rainfall within a short period of time causing significant damage to the City's infrastructure systems. The damages reported was not limited to water mains, sewer mains, bridge structures, and storm drainage systems. The Department of Public Works maintenance crews have limited personnel to handle all of the required repairs. The repairs needed are critical to staying within compliance regarding the Clean Water Act and the Consent Decree. It is also critical in stabilizing the transportation and drainage systems.

The City does not have the personnel or equipment to adequately address the necessary repairs to ensure welfare and safety of the Public. Because of the imminent threat to public health and safety, I recommend that the City enter into a replacement contract as provided for in Section 31-7-13(k) of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972.

DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY TO INVOKE EMERGENCY REPAIR CONTRACT PROCEDURE

I. REQUEST

The City of Jackson received over 5" of rainfall within a short period of time on April 2, 2017. The intensity of the rainfall duration caused significant damage to the City of Jackson's water mains, sanitary sewer mains, bridge structures, and storm drainage systems. The urgency to repair the damaged infrastructure is critical to staying within compliance with local and federal agencies who govern the Clean Water Act. The City of Jackson has limited maintenance crews to handle all to the repairs required to stabilize the City's Infrastructure systems.

Accordingly, I request that you declare this situation an "emergency" as that term is defined in Section 31-7-1 of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, as amended, and authorize the City to enter into contracts with local contractor to repair water mains, sewer mains, bridge structures, and storm drainage systems, to Section 31-7-13 (k) of the Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, as amended, and to execute and accept such other documents and instruments as necessary to accomplish said repairs.

I have provided a memo as background information to assist in your determination that an emergency exists. I have also obtained the review and approval of the Legal Department and Administration Department, as evidenced by the signatures below.

Attached you will find an item for the agenda that authorizes submission of applications to the Jackson Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Transportation Alternative Grant funds for various projects. The resolution also commits matching funding as required by the MPO.

On December 4, 2015, President Barack Obama signed the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, which authorized \$305 billion dollars from FY 2016 through FY2020 for various transportation improvements. It is the first long range federal surface transportation bill since SAFETA-LU expired in 2009. These funds are divided into programs based on the text of the law and disbursed. Funds for projects in urbanized areas flow through the USDOT, FHWA, and MDOT, to the MPO level. As part of the FAST Act, a set amount of funds were set aside for Transportation Alternatives (TA). This call for projects is for \$1.7 million in projects based on categories set by language in the FAST Act.

The Jackson MPO's bicycle and pedestrian subcommittee consisting of two representatives from each county as well as advocacy groups reviewed the project submittal guidelines from the previous short term transportation bill and make changes as needed. The City of Jackson was represented on that subcommittee. The result of the review was to add application points for partnerships as part of the application process.

The MPO issued a call for projects with a submittal deadline of November 15th. Public Works staff developed a short list of projects based on likelihood of promoting and securing private sector partnerships, securing other potential match funding sources, as well as a project based on discussions with the Municipal Sales Tax Commission.

The recommended projects are:

- Highway 18 Shared Use Path from Woodland Way to Walmart
- West Capitol Street Pedestrian and Bicycle Project from Robinson Street to Ellis Avenue (one application for Robinson to Prentiss, one application for Prentiss to Ellis)
- Peachtree Street Shared Use Path from Riverside Drive to Woodrow Wilson Avenue

- Woodrow Wilson Avenue Shared Use Path from Peachtree Street to State Street
- Eastover Drive (LeFleur East Trail Part 2) from Eastwood to Ridgewood Road

It is highly likely that not all projects will be funded since there is a limited amount of funds for the metro area. However, we feel that these projects are our strongest based on a combination of the scoring criteria, design criteria, geographical outreach, potential partnerships for fundraising, and limited federal funds available.

Awards are anticipated to be announced before the February 2018 MPO meetings. Construction would likely not begin on any awarded project until sometime in FY2019.

Bill Chandler is Executive Director of MIRA, Mississippi Immigrants' Rights Alliance. An eye witness to the brutal immigration raids during the 1950's, he has been continuously in organizing and advocating for human and workers' rights for immigrant and all workers.

Since then his organizing focus has been with the lowest paid workers in the South, including farm workers, hospitality, health care, public and immigrant and migrant workers. In Mississippi he organized the aggressive Mississippi Alliance of State Employees/CWA local 3570. He helped start the successful effort by some 8,000 casino workers to organize their unions. Out of that effort, concern by regular casino workers about abuse of their immigrant co-workers led to the founding of MIRA in 2000.

Responding to these abuses by casino contractors and discrimination by Mississippi school districts against undocumented children, Bill brought a group of immigrants, labor, civil rights, religious, social and human rights activists and organizations together to form MIRA in 2000. Initially an organization of volunteers, MIRA has grown into a major force in Mississippi with a staff of organizers, attorneys and advocates, led by a board of directors made up of mainly African and Latino leaders.

MIRA is internationally recognized throughout Latin America, Europe, South Asia and Africa for its aggressive work with immigrants in Mississippi, and its efforts to build unity in struggle among people of color.
