## ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE I, SECTION 110-2(a)(1) OF THE JACKSON CODE OF ORDINANCES - PROCEDURE FOR RENAMING STREETS AND PUBLIC FACILITIES.

**WHEREAS**, Article I, Section 110-2 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances establishes the procedure for street/facility renaming in the City of Jackson, Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, Article I, Section 110-2 (a)(1) was amended by Council Order on August 24, 2010 to include additional requirement(s) upon a Council member seeking to rename a street; and,

**WHEREAS**, Article I, Section 110-2 (a)(1) regarding street renamings initiated by any member of the Jackson City Council, currently reads as follows:

- "(a) Naming/Renamings initiated by any member of the Jackson City Council:
  - (1) Any Jackson City Council person may name or change the name of a street or public facility within the city by placing an ordinance on the regular council agenda. The party initiating the action shall complete an application and provide the following supporting documentation:
    - a. Name of the council person initiating said change. In cases of street or facility or renamings, the council person initiating the change shall notify, in writing at least one week prior to the item being placed on the agenda, all council persons whose ward may be affected by said change. A copy of such letter shall be attached as support documentation.
    - b. Current and proposed name of the street or facility
    - c. Reason(s) for the naming or renaming, including a biographical sketch of the person for whom the street or facility will be named.
    - d. In the case of street renaming, a petition with 50 percent plus one, of property owners located on the street affected by the naming or renaming, indicating their support of such action. A sworn affidavit or legal opinion attesting to the genuineness and validity of the signatures shall be attached to the petition, as well as a copy of the Hinds County Land Roll Tax Map.
    - e. Letters from affected utility agencies, stating their approval or disapproval, of the purposed naming or renaming."

**WHEREAS**, Article I, Section 110-2 (a)(4) regarding street renamings initiated by any member of the Jackson City Council, currently reads as follows:

"(4) The director of planning and development, or his/her designee shall cause a sign providing notice of the requested name change and the date

The director or his/her designee shall also provide:

- a. **WHEREAS**, the provision, 110-2(a)(4), placed upon an initiating Council member have proven to be onerous and unnecessary. Thus, it is in the best interest of the City of Jackson that Section 110-2(4) be stricken

**WHEREAS**, the petition provision, 110-2(a)(1) d., placed upon an initiating Council member have proven to be onerous and unnecessary. Thus, it is in the best interest of the City of Jackson to strike Section 110-2(a)(4) and to amend the provisions of Section 110-2(a)(l) as described below:

- "(a) Naming/Renamings initiated by any member of the Jackson City Council:
  - (1) Any Jackson City Council person may name or change the name of a street or public facility within the city by placing an ordinance on the regular council agenda. The party initiating the action shall complete an application and provide the following supporting documentation:
    - a. Name of the council person initiating said change. In cases of street or facility or renamings, the council person initiating the change shall notify, in writing at least one week prior to the item being placed on the agenda, all council persons whose ward may be affected by said change. - 1. Pursuant to the Mississippi Tax Increment Financing Act, Title 21, Chapter 45, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), the City is authorized to undertake and carry out redevelopment projects, as defined therein, utilizing tax increment financing ("TIF"), and also to carry out such projects jointly with other local government units, pursuant to the Regional Economic Development Act, Title 57, Chapter 64, Mississippi Code as amended (the "REDA Act") or the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Title 17, Chapter 13, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Interlocal Act").
- 2. The Council has previously conducted hearings on and approved and adopted the Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan for the City related to the Jackson State Foundation Development Project (the "Redevelopment Plan"). The Redevelopment Plan constitutes a qualified plan under the Act.
- 3. Under the Redevelopment Plan, University Park of Jackson II, LLC, (the "Developer") is proposing to develop a project known as the Jackson State Foundation Development Project (the "Project") in the City and in the proposed Jackson State Foundation Development Project TIF District (the "TIF District"), as further described herein. The Project will consist of a university-based, mixed-use community primarily for the public employees which is intended to redevelop the neighborhood between the Jackson State University ("JSU") campus and the central business district of the City within the area defined by Lynch Street as the southern boundary, Dalton Street as the western boundary, the Metro Parkway as the northern boundary and Terry Road as the eastern boundary. The Project will be developed in phases. Phase IA is a mixed-use development on a two-acre tract including rental housing, retail, office space and parking. Phase IB is projected to consist of for-sale housing units on an eleven-acre tract. Phase IC is projected to be a two-acre development of rental housing units, retail, office space and parking. Phase II is projected to be workforce housing, retail, a preschool facility, a health center,

theater and senior housing on a series of sites totaling approximately 14 acres. To date, Phase IA of the Project has been completed.

- 4. The site of the Project is in need of development and redevelopment, and the proposed Project will provide a significant boost to the City's economy, is in the best interest of the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the City and is a project eligible for Tax Increment Financing as set forth in the TIF District plan adopted by the City in 2008.
- 5. As authorized by the Act, the Governing Body has determined the necessity of providing funds for certain site and infrastructure improvements relating to the Project, including but not limited to, installation and/or relocation of utilities such as water, sewer, natural gas lines, electricity, construction of drainage improvements, construction of roadways with curb and gutter, asphalt overlay, installation of traffic signalization and signage, public parking, landscaping of rights-of-way, irrigation, acquisition of rights-of-way, related engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs (the "Improvements").
- 6. It is necessary and in the public interest for the City to issue the Jackson State University TIF Bonds in the principal amount not to exceed \$500,000 (the "Bonds") to finance a portion of the cost of the Improvements.
- 7. 

Attached you will find an item for the agenda authorizing the Mayor to execute a professional services agreement with Neel-Schaffer, Inc. for traffic signal warrant analysis necessary for the City of Jackson's upcoming MPO applications.

Motorpuller

Public Works staff has identified three high volume corridors where traffic signal improvements are needed to improve traffic flow and efficiency and where the chances of funding are highly likely:

Medical Mall Area: Woodrow Wilson Ave from Medgar Evers Blvd to Bailey Ave Ext plus Bailey Ave & Bailey Ave Ext/Glendale St

(Annual average daily traffic volume: 19,000 on Woodrow Wilson Ave and 12,000 on Bailey Ave Ext) These four signals serve an area with high peak hour volume plus a major destination for employees and visitors. The three signals on Woodrow Wilson Ave would benefit from replacement of the cabinets and controllers, improved synchronization and communication, installation of radar detection to replace the often broken loops, and installation of pedestrian heads and ramps where missing. The signal on Bailey Ave and Bailey Ave Ext/Glendale St serves as part of the general left turn movement from Bailey Ave northbound to Woodrow Wilson Ave westbound and would be a candidate for the same improvements as the three signals on Woodrow Wilson Avenue.

State St corridor from Rankin St to High St

(Annual average daily traffic volume: 13,000-18,000)

This corridor has a high peak hour volume in the morning and afternoon rush hour. The signal equipment including mast arms was installed as part of a 1983 program with minor equipment upgrades since then. The corridor will benefit from the replacement of the 1980's controller cabinets, replacement of the late 1990's controllers, replacement of 3 often-brushed or struck signal poles, installation of radar detection units to replace the often broken loops, installation of improved synchronization and communication, and pedestrian improvements where missing. Replacement and upgrade of the signal at Silas Brown Street was previously funded and is not a part of the proposed application.

Ridgewood Rd corridor from Eastover Dr to Old Canton Rd (Annual average daily traffic volume: 14,000-17,000)

The Ridgewood Rd corridor south of Old Canton Rd serves a variety of interests daily. It provides a direct path from northeast Jackson and southeast Ridgeland to Lakeland Dr, provides an optional north-south route east of Interstate 55, and serves as the primary route to three schools (Casey Elementary School, Spann Elementary School, and Jackson Academy K-12). This corridor would benefit from the replacement of a hodge podge of various traffic signal cabinets and controllers, improved synchronization and communication, installation of radar detection to replace the often broken loops, and installation of pedestrian heads and ramps where missing.

As part of upcoming call for projects for the second half of federal FAST Act funding, the Jackson MPO has \$5 million available for traffic signal operational improvements. This is the largest amount of operational funds that has been available in at least 10 years. These funds can cover construction and related construction engineering and require no City match. The City will have to fund preliminary engineering if approved. In addition to providing operational improvements, the work proposed in these three high volume corridors will help cover deferred maintenance and potential near future maintenance issues.

Public Works selected Neel-Schaffer for the necessary traffic signal warrants to add to these proposed applications based on availability to do this work in a short time frame. The amount of the professional services agreement will not exceed \$43,700.00 which is City funded. Public Works will return to Council in October to request approval of the applications for these signal projects as well as resurfacing and bridge projects.
