ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE JACKSON CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ALLOW THE SELL, POSSESSION, AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AT THE SMITH ROBERTSON MUSEUM

WHEREAS, the Department of Human and Cultural Services desires to allow the sell, possession, and consumption of alcoholic beverages at the Smith Robertson Museum to attract various events to said venue; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson City Council finds it in the best interest of the City of Jackson to allow the same; and

WHEREAS, the governing authorities find that Section 10-3 should be added as follows (added language denoted in underlined italics), and removed as follows (language to be removed is stricken through):

Sec. 10-3. - Sale, possession and consumption on public property.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any persons to have in his possession or to consume any alcoholic beverage in or on any public grounds, building, park or place owned, maintained and operated by the city, except as follows:
- (1) It shall be lawful to sell, possess and consume alcoholic beverages in the Davis Planetarium, Mississippi Arts Center, Union Station, *Smith Robertson Museum*, and Thalia Mara Hall.
- (2) It shall be lawful to sell, possess and consume alcoholic beverages at Private functions by special reservation at the Municipal Art Gallery, <u>and</u> Mynelle Gardens, and Smith Robertson Museum.
- (3) It shall be lawful for beer to be sold and consumed at Smith Wills Stadium, any municipal golf course, and at any other privately managed city facility except it shall be expressly unlawful for beer to be sold at any high school athletic event.
- (4) It shall be lawful to possess and consume wine at wedding receptions held in any community center by special reservation and any future privately managed public facility approved by the administration.
- (5) It shall be lawful to consume and possess alcoholic beverages at events sponsored by Jackson Zoological Park.
- (6) It shall be lawful for beer to be sold and consumed at all facilities and parks managed by the Department of Parks and Recreation only during national tournament events except it shall be unlawful for beer to be sold at any school athletic event.
- (b) The sale, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages as authorized in subsection (a) of this section is subject to compliance with all applicable state laws and regulations.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, THAT Chapter 10 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances is amended to add and remove language in Section 10-3 as follows:

# ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 122-177 (a) OF ARTICLE IN SEWAGE DISPOSAL STANDARDS TO CREATE A FATS, OILS, AND GREASE (FOG) CONTROL PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson entered into a Consent Decree with the State of Mississippi and the United States of America on March 1, 2013 in the case entitled, United States of America and the State of Mississippi vs. The City of Jackson, Mississippi, No. 3:12-cv-790 TSL-MTP, United States District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, the Consent Decree requires the City to implement certain Capacity, Management, Operations, and Maintenance program, including a fats, oils, and grease (FOG) control program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson submitted a proposed FOG Control Program to the United States Environmental Protection Administration, Region IV, for review and approval, which included a commitment to revise the City's ordinances to implement the FOG Control Program and enforce compliance with it; and

WHEREAS, the City initially adopted this Ordinance with a grandfather provision that exempted Food Service Establishments (FSE) existing at the time of its enactment unless their discharge of fats, oils, and grease cause a sanitary sewer overflow or problems in the sewer collection system; and

**WHEREAS**, the United State Environmental Protection Agency has requested that the City make certain amendments to the original ordinance to place a sunset provision on the grandfather clause.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI:

**SECTION 1.** Section 122-177 (a) is amended as follows: DIVISION 5. – FATS, OILS AND GREASE CONTROL PROGRAM

Sec. 122-177. – FOG Control Plan and Fees

(a) FSEs lawfully in existence as of the date of this ordinance are not shall be required to install a grease control device on or before June 30, 2023. However, unless and until if a FOG discharge to the City's sanitary collection system from the such a lawfully existing FSE has caused causes or significantly contributes to a blockage or system problem, as documented by the Director of the Department of Public Works. If such a blockage or system problem occurs such FSE shall be required to submit a FOG Control Plan and install a grease control device. Such a lawfully existing FSE shall submit their FOG Control Plan and install their grease control device within 30 days of notice from the Director of the Department of Public Works.

**SECTION 5.** This ordinance shall be effective thirty days after enactment and following publication.

**Background:** 

The City's Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) Ordinance was enacted during the first quarter of 2018. At the time the new ordinance was enacted, existing Food Service Establishments (FSE) were "grandfathered" from the requirements of a proper grease control device unless their discharges of fats, oils, and grease caused sanitary sewer overflows or problems in the sewer collection system. As you may recall, this provision was discussed with the City Council and commented upon very favorably by its members. The reasoning behind this provision was the impact of requiring the installation of a proper grease control device on the numerous, small, "mom and pop" restaurants in Jackson. In many cases, a properly-sized grease control device for a restaurant may cost thousands of dollars initially and have an ongoing maintenance expense. This would likely lead to many of these "mom and pop" restaurants either closing their doors or operating illegally at the risk of fines.

Recently, the U.S.E.P.A. realized our FOG Ordinance included this "grandfather" clause and expressed a great deal of concern. Their engineering staff believed that the limitation on the "grandfather" clause could not be effectively enforced, which would result in continuing SSOs and operational problems caused by FOG. The U.S.E.P.A. requested that the City first consider completely eliminating the "grandfather" clause. I was able to obtain a concession that the City would present an alternative to the existing "grandfather" clause for their and the governing authorities' consideration.

Attached is a straightforward amendment that offers a sunset date for the existing "grandfather" clause. As proposed, all FSEs would have to come into compliance with the requirement of a proper grease control device and its maintenance obligations on or before June 30, 2023, which will be approximately 3 and one-half years after the amendment's anticipated enactment date. This will allow a reasonable period of time for all restaurant to plan how they anticipate funding the necessary improvements to comply with the FOG ordinance.

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into the 20 th day of November 2019 by and between the MISSISSIPPI FAIR COMMISSION of Jackson, Mississippi hereinafter called the Party of the First Part, and City of Jackson MS. Attn: Keyshia Sanders, P.O. Box 17, Jackson, MS 39205, Phone: 601-842-1917, hereinafter called the Party of the Second Part.

#### WITNESSETH:

That whereas the Party of the First Part is the Lessor of the Mississippi State Fair Grounds located in the State Fair Grounds, Jackson, Mississippi, and whereas the Party of the Second Part desires to conduct a City of Jackson Christmas Parade Staging beginning December 07, 2019, and ending December 07, 2019.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual promises, the parties hereto agree as follow:

- 1. That the Party of the First Part, in consideration of the rents hereinafter contained, and of the payment of such rents and the performance by the Party of the Second Part the right to use the following portions, and no other, of the building known as the Mississippi State Fair Grounds, located on the State Fairgrounds in the county and state aforesaid, Namely: Mississippl State Fair Grounds, together with the usual entrances and exits to the same and such additional space as the Party of the First Part in its discretion shall allocate to the Party of the Second Part to be used for said purpose hereinafter listed and for no other purpose whatsoever without the written consent of the Party of the First Part. All other lobbies, offices, rooms, and space are expressly reserved by the Party of the First Part to its own use, with the privilege of occupying and using same at any and all times during the term of this contract and agreement. The rental shall include normal water and power use, normal lighting facilities use, heating or air conditioning as required, the services of one Janitor and the following additional services, laborers and technicians when needed will be furnished on the following terms.
- 2. The property and facilities hereinafter referred to are rented by the Party of the First Part to the Party of the Second Part for the sole purpose of conducting a City of Jackson Christmas Parade Staging. The rental does not include license fees. The rental does not include stagehands, ticket sellers, doormen, porters, usher captains, policemen or firemen, and the number and identity of persons to be used in these capacities by the Party of the Second Part shall be approved by the MANAGEMENT OF THE FACILITY.
- 3. That the buildings, facilities, and equipment located on the State Fairgrounds aforesaid, including those covered and named in this agreement, shall, at the termination of this contract, be returned to the Party of the First Part in as good and safe condition as same was (were) in when the Party of the Second Part begins to operate under this contract, and if any of said building(s), equipment and/or facilities are damaged or destroyed through negligence of the Party of the Second Part, and of its agents employees and/or persons engaged in operating said City of Jackson Christmas Parade Staging or the negligence or malicious vandalism of any patrons or persons patronizing the Party of the Second Part or any persons in or about said Facility during any period in which the Party of the Second Part has charge of same or during any time that any agent or employee of the Party of the Second Part has charge of same or may be working in the Fairgrounds prior to and/or in preparation for cleaning up or repairing damage after said events, the same shall be replaced, or repaired or restored or compensated by the Party of the Second Part to the complete satisfaction of the Party of the First Part before termination of this contract.

- 4. That the Party of the First Part agrees to pay to the Party of the First Part as Rental, NO CHARGE, plus any additional services listed under SPECIAL PROVISIONS. It is also understood and agreed that additional rental, if earned, shall be settled at the close of each day's and/or night's use, or in the manner that Management sees fit, with landlord's lien on all Lessee's properties to secure payment. Management may extend the period for settlement of each day's and/or night's use if, in his judgment, additional time is required to determine gross revenue.
- It is understood and agreed that the Party of the Second Part shall pay to the Party of the First Part all the charges made to the Party of the First Part by Entergy for special electric current (other than regular lighting).
- 6. It is understood and agreed that the Party of the Second Part is to accept the grounds, exits, entrances, building(s), restrooms, and all other equipment and/or facilities named in this agreement and constituting these premises in their present condition, and that they shall be left by the Party of the Second Part, after each SAID event, and at the termination of this agreement, in good and safe condition.
- 7. The Party of the First Part shall not be responsible for any contracts, agreements or transactions of the Party of the Second Part in connection with said events, and the Party of the Second Part covenants and agrees to save harmless the Party of the Second Part and shall conduct said event(s) in an orderly and lawful manner.
- 8. If the Party of the Second Part shall fail to pay any installments or rent or electrical service charge when due or shall fail or refuse to comply with any of the terms of this contract or agreement, this instrument shall become null and void, and the Party of the First Part shall retain any amounts previously paid by the Party of the Second Part, and Party of the Second Part shall pay additional rent due and pay all expenses and damages caused by failure or refusal to the Party of the Second Part to comply with requirements of this section.
- This agreement or contract may not be assigned or transferred by the Party of the Second Part without consent in writing of the Party of the First Part.
- 10. It is understood that no concessions are granted to the Party of the Second Part, or anyone acting under this contract for the sale or dispensing of any kind of beverages, foods, or other articles of merchandise. This shall apply to any such operation on or about the premises hereinbefore described.
- 11. That the Party of the Second Part is to make no lawful or unlawful use of these premises or facilities, except those uses and programs as outlined in this contract and agreement.
- 12. In the event the Party of the Second Part fails or neglects to vacate said premises within the time limited above, the Party of the Second Part agrees to pay as liquidated damages to such unauthorized use the sum equal to the above-named daily rental for each additional day of use.
- 13. Authorized officials of the Mississippi Fair Commission shall have right of access to any and all said premises during the duration of this contract and shall have right of access to any and all financial accountings, records, and statements and/or any other pertinent information pertaining to the proper fulfillment of this contract.
- 14. The Lessee agrees to comply with all State and local laws or ordinances, and shall not permit any act or

conduct offensive or repugnant to public sentiment.

- 15. This Contract or Agreement is executed on representation of each party hereto made to the other, that the person signing has complete authority to act and bind designated parties; that each Party has read and understands this agreement which is the entire contract between the parties.

## CUSTOMER ACCOUNT ESTABLISHMENT:

- A. A separate Vendor Customer Number will be required for each specific customer/installation location.
- B. The Customer is identified as the entity on the first line of the "bill-to" address. All invoices and notices of changes will be sent to the "bill-to" address in accordance with Paragraph 8 herein.
- C. Ship-to and/or Installed-at address is the location to which the initial shipment of equipment/supplies will be made and the address to which service representatives will respond. Subsequent shipments of supplies for installed equipment will also be delivered to the "installed-at" address unless otherwise requested.
- D. Unless creditworthiness for this Customer Number has been previously established by Vendor, Vendor's Credit Department may conduct a credit investigation for this Agreement. Notwithstanding delivery of equipment, Vendor may revoke this Agreement by written notice to the Customer if credit approval is denied within thirty (30) days after the date this Agreement is accepted for Vendor by an authorized representative.
- 2. <u>EQUIPMENT SELECTION, PRICES, AND AGREEMENT</u>: The Customer has selected and Vendor agrees to provide the equipment, including applicable software and services to render it continually operational, identified on Exhibit A attached to this Agreement. The specific prices, inclusive of applicable transportation charges, are as set forth on the attached Exhibit A. The parties understand and agree that the Customer is exempt from the payment of taxes.
- 3. SHIPPING AND TRANSPORTATION: Vendor agrees to pay all non-priority, ground shipping, transportation, rigging and drayage charges for the equipment from the equipment's place of manufacture to the installation address of the equipment as specified under this Agreement. If any form of express shipping method is requested, it will be paid for by Customer.
- 4. RISK OF LOSS OR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT: While in transit, Vendor shall assume and bear the entire risk of loss and damage to the equipment from any cause whatsoever. If, during the period the equipment is in Customer's possession, due to gross negligence of the customer, the equipment is lost or damaged, then, the customer shall bear the cost of replacing or repairing said equipment.

### 5. DELIVERY, INSTALLATION, ACCEPTANCE, AND RELOCATION:

A. <u>DELIVERY</u>: Vendor shall deliver the equipment to the location specified by Customer and pursuant to the delivery schedule agreed upon by the parties. If, through no fault of the Customer, Vendor is unable to deliver the equipment or software, the prices, terms and conditions will remain unchanged until delivery is made by Vendor. If, however, Vendor does not deliver the equipment or software within ten (10) working days of the delivery due date, Customer shall have the right to terminate the order without penalty, cost or expense to Customer of any kind whatsoever.

B. <u>INSTALLATION SITE</u>: At the time of delivery and during the period Vendor is responsible for maintenance of the equipment, the equipment installation site must conform to Vendor's published space, electrical and environmental requirements; and the Customer agrees to provide, at no charge, reasonable access to the equipment and to a telephone for local or toll free calls.

- C. <u>INSTALLATION DATE</u>: The installation date of the equipment shall be that date as is agreed upon by the parties, if Vendor is responsible for installing the equipment.
- D. ACCEPTANCE: Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties, Vendor agrees that Customer shall have ten (10) working days from date of delivery and installation, to inspect, evaluate and test the equipment to confirm that it is in good working order.
- E. <u>RELOCATION</u>: Customer may transfer equipment to a new location by notifying Vendor in writing of the transfer at least thirty (30) calendar days before the move is made. If Vendor is responsible for maintenance of the equipment, this notice will enable Vendor to provide technical assistance in the relocation efforts, if needed, as well as to update Vendor's records as to machine location. There will be no cessation of rental charges during the period of any such transfer. The Vendor's cost of moving and reinstalling equipment from one location to another is not included in this Agreement, and Customer agrees to pay Vendor, after receipt of invoice of Vendor's charges with respect to such moving of equipment, which will be billed to Customer in accordance with Vendor's standard practice then in effect for commercial users of similar equipment or software and payment remitted in accordance with Paragraph 8 herein.
- 6. <u>RENTAL TERM</u>: The rental term for each item of equipment shall be that as stated in the attached Exhibit A. If the Customer desires to continue renting the equipment at the expiration of the original rental agreement, the Customer must enter into a new rental agreement which shall be separate from this Agreement. There will be no automatic renewals allowed. There shall be no option to purchase.
- 7. <u>OWNERSHIP</u>: Unless the Customer has obtained title to the equipment, title to the equipment shall be and remain vested at all times in Vendor or its assignee and nothing in this Agreement shall give or convey to Customer any right, title or interest therein, unless purchased by Customer. Nameplates, stencils or other indicia of Vendor's ownership affixed or to be affixed to the equipment shall not be removed or obliterated by Customer.

## 8. PAYMENTS:

- A. <u>INVOICING AND PAYMENTS</u>: The charges for the equipment, software or services covered by this Agreement are specified in the attached Exhibit A. Charges for any partial month for any item of equipment shall be prorated based on a thirty (30) day month. Vendor shall submit an invoice with the appropriate documentation to Customer.
  - E-PAYMENT: The Vendor agrees to accept all payments in United States currency via the State of
    Mississippi's electronic payment and remittance vehicle. The Customer agrees to make payment in accordance
    with Mississippi law on "Timely Payments for Purchases by Public Bodies", Section 31-7-301, et seq. of the
    1972 Mississippi Code Annotated, as amended, which generally provides for payment of undisputed amounts
    by the agency within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the invoice.
  - 2. PAYMODE: Payments by state agencies using Mississippi's Accountability System for Government Information and Collaboration (MAGIC) shall be made and remittance information provided electronically as directed by the State. The State, may at its sole discretion, require the Vendor to submit invoices and supporting documentation electronically at any time during the term of this Agreement. These payments shall be deposited into the bank account of the Vendor's choice. The Vendor understands and agrees that the State is exempt from the payment of taxes. All payments shall be in United States currency.
- B. METER READINGS: If applicable, the Customer shall provide accurate and timely meter readings at the end

of each applicable billing period on the forms or other alternative means specified by Vendor. Vendor shall have the right, upon reasonable prior notice to Customer, and during Customer's regular business hours, to inspect the equipment and to monitor the meter readings. If Customer meter readings are not received in the time to be agreed upon by the parties, the meter readings may be obtained electronically or by other means or may be estimated by Vendor subject to reconciliation when the correct meter reading is received by Vendor.

- C. COPY CREDITS: If applicable, if a copier is being rented, the Customer will receive one (1) copy credit for each copy presented to Vendor which, in the Customer's opinion, is unusable and also for each copy which was produced during servicing of the equipment. Copy credits will be issued only if Vendor is responsible for providing equipment services or maintenance services (except time and materials maintenance). Copy credits will be reflected on the invoice as a reduction in the total copy volume, except for run length plans which will be credited at a specific copy credit rate as shown on the applicable price list.
- 9. <u>USE OF EQUIPMENT</u>: Customer shall operate the equipment according to the manufacturer's specifications and documented instructions. Customer agrees not to employ or use additional attachments, features or devices on the equipment or make changes or alterations to the equipment covered hereby without the prior written consent of Vendor in each case, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

## 10. MAINTENANCE SERVICES, EXCLUSIONS, AND REMEDIES:

- A. <u>SERVICES</u>: If Vendor is responsible for providing equipment services, maintenance services (except for time and materials), or warranty services: (1) Vendor shall install and maintain the equipment and make all necessary adjustments and repairs to keep the equipment in good working order. (2) Parts required for repair may be used or reprocessed in accordance with Vendor's specifications and replaced parts are the property of Vendor, unless otherwise specifically provided on the price lists. (3) Services will be provided during Customer's usual business hours. (4) If applicable, Customer will permit Vendor to install, at no cost to Customer, all retrofits designated by Vendor as mandatory or which are designed to insure accuracy of meters.
- B. <u>EXCLUSIONS</u>: The following is not within the scope of services: (1) Provision and installation of optional retrofits. (2) Services connected with equipment relocation. (3) Installation/removal of accessories, attachments or other devices. (4) Exterior painting or refinishing of equipment. (5) Maintenance, installation or removal of equipment or devices not provided by Vendor. (6) Performance of normal operator functions as described in applicable Vendor operator manuals. (7) Performance of services necessitated by accident; power failure; unauthorized alteration of equipment or software; tampering; service by someone other than Vendor; causes other than ordinary use; interconnection of equipment by electrical, or electronic or mechanical means with noncompatible equipment, or failure to use operating system software. If Vendor provides, at the request of the Customer, any of the services noted above, the Customer may be billed by Vendor at a rate not to exceed the Master State Prices Agreement between the Vendor and the State of Mississippi, or in the absence of such agreement at the then current time and materials rates.
- C. <u>REMEDIES</u>: If during the period in which Vendor is providing maintenance services, Vendor is unable to maintain the equipment in good working order, Vendor will, at no additional charge, provide either an identical replacement or another product that provides equal or greater capabilities.
- HOLD HARMLESS: To the fullest extent allowed by law, Vendor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless, protect, and exonerate the Customer and the State of Mississippi, its Commissioners, Board Members, officers, employees, agents, and representatives from and against all claims, demands, liabilities, suits, actions, damages, losses, and costs of every kind and nature whatsoever, including, without limitation, court costs, investigative fees and expenses, and attorneys' fees, arising out of or caused by Vendor and/or its partners, principals, agents, employees, and/or subcontractors in the performance of or failure to perform this Agreement. In the Customer's sole discretion, Vendor may be allowed to control the defense of any such claim, suit, etc. In the event Vendor defends said claim, suit, etc., Vendor shall use legal counsel acceptable to the Customer; Vendor shall be solely liable for all reasonable costs and/or expenses associated with such defense and the Customer shall be entitled to participate in said defense. Vendor shall not settle any claim, suit, etc., without the Customer's concurrence,

which the Customer shall not unreasonably withhold.

## 12. ALTERATIONS, ATTACHMENTS, AND SUPPLIES:

- A. If Customer makes an alteration, attaches a device or utilizes a supply item that increases the cost of services, Vendor will either propose an additional service charge or request that the equipment be returned to its standard configuration or that use of the supply item be discontinued. If, within five (5) days of such proposal or request, Customer does not remedy the problem or agree in writing to do so within a reasonable amount of time, Vendor shall have the right to terminate this Agreement as provided herein. If Vendor believes that an alteration, attachment or supply item affects the safety of Vendor personnel or equipment users, Vendor shall notify Customer of the problem and may withhold maintenance until the problem is remedied.
- B. Unless Customer has obtained title to the equipment free and clear of any Vendor security interest, Customer may not remove any ownership identification tags on the equipment or allow the equipment to become fixtures to real property.
- 13. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: The Vendor shall not assign, subcontract or otherwise transfer in whole or in part, its right or obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent of the Customer. Any attempted assignment or transfer without said consent shall be void and of no effect.
- 14. GOVERNING LAW: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi, excluding its conflicts of laws provisions, and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the courts of said state. The Vendor shall comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- 15. <u>NOTICE</u>: Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and personally delivered or sent by certified United States mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the party to whom the notice should be given at the address set forth below. Notice shall be deemed given when actually received or when refused. The parties agree to promptly notify each other in writing of any change of address.

- 16. <u>WAIVER</u>: Failure by the Customer at any time to enforce the provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of any such provisions. Such failure to enforce shall not affect the validity of this Agreement or any part thereof or the right of the Customer to enforce any provision at any time in accordance with its terms.
- 17. <u>CAPTIONS</u>: The captions or headings in this Agreement are for convenience only, and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any provision or section of this Agreement.
- 18. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>: If any term or provision of this Agreement is prohibited by the laws of the State of Mississippi or declared invalid or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 19. THIRD PARTY ACTION NOTIFICATION: Vendor shall give Customer prompt notice in writing of any action or suit filed, and prompt notice of any claim made against Vendor by any entity that may result in litigation related in any way to this Agreement.
- 20. <u>AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT</u>: Vendor warrants that it is a validly organized business with valid authority to enter into this Agreement and that entry into and performance under this Agreement is not restricted or prohibited by any loan,

security, financing, contractual or other agreement of any kind, and notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, that there are no existing legal proceedings, or prospective legal proceedings, either voluntary or otherwise, which may adversely affect its ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement.

- 21. RECORD RETENTION AND ACCESS TO RECORDS: The Vendor agrees that the Customer or any of its duly authorized representatives at any time during the term of this Agreement shall have unimpeded, prompt access to and the right to audit and examine any pertinent books, documents, papers, and records of the Vendor related to the Vendor's charges and performance under this Agreement. All records related to this Agreement shall be kept by the Vendor for a period of three (3) years after final payment under this Agreement and all pending matters are closed unless the Customer authorizes their earlier disposition. However, if any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other action arising out of or related in any way to this Agreement has been started before the expiration of the three (3) year period, the records shall be retained for one (1) year after all issues arising out of the action are finally resolved. The Vendor agrees to refund to the Customer any overpayment disclosed by any such audit arising out of or related in any way to this Agreement.
- 22. EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES: If either party is rendered unable, wholly or in part, by reason of strikes, accidents, acts of God, weather conditions or any other acts beyond its control and without its fault or negligence to comply with any obligations or performance required under this Agreement, then such party shall have the option to suspend its obligations or performance hereunder until the extraordinary performance circumstances are resolved. If the extraordinary performance circumstances are not resolved within a reasonable period of time, however, the non-defaulting party shall have the option, upon prior written notice, of terminating the Agreement.
- 23. <u>TERMINATION</u>: This Agreement may be terminated as follows: (a) Customer and Vendor mutually agree to the termination, or (b) If either party fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and that breach continues for thirty (30) days after the defaulting party receives written notice from the other party, then the non-defaulting party has the right to terminate this Agreement. The non-defaulting party may also pursue any remedy available to it in law or in equity. Upon termination, all obligations of Customer to make payments required hereunder shall cease.
- 24. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS: It is expressly understood and agreed that the obligation of the Customer to proceed under this Agreement is conditioned upon the appropriation of funds by the Mississippi State Legislature and the receipt of state and/or federal funds. If the funds anticipated for the continuing fulfillment of the agreement are, at any time, not forthcoming or insufficient, either through the failure of the federal government to provide funds or of the State of Mississippi to appropriate funds or the discontinuance or material alteration of the program under which funds were provided or if funds are not otherwise available to the Customer, the Customer shall have the right upon ten (10) working days written notice to the Vendor, to terminate this Agreement without damage, penalty, cost or expenses to the Customer of any kind whatsoever. The effective date of termination shall be as specified in the notice of termination.
- 25. MODIFICATION OR RENEGOTIATION: This Agreement may be modified, altered or changed only by written agreement signed by the parties hereto. The parties agree to renegotiate the Agreement if federal, state and/or the Customer's revisions of any applicable laws or regulations make changes in this Agreement necessary.
- 26. WARRANTIES: Vendor warrants that the equipment, when operated according to the manufacturer's specifications and documented instructions, shall perform the functions indicated by the specifications and documented literature. Vendor may be held liable for any damages caused by failure of the equipment to function according to specifications and documented literature published by the manufacturer of the equipment.
- 27. <u>E-VERIFY COMPLIANCE</u>: If applicable, the Vendor represents and warrants that it will ensure its compliance with the Mississippi Employment Protection Act of 2008, Section 71-11-1, et seq. of the Mississippi Code Annotated (Supp 2008), and will register and participate in the status verification system for all newly hired employees. The term "employee" as used herein means any person that is hired to perform work within the State of Mississippi. As used herein, "status verification system" means the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigration Responsibility Act of 1996 that is operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security, also known as the E-Verify Program, or any other successor electronic verification system replacing the E-Verify Program. The Vendor agrees to maintain records of such compliance and, upon request of the State and

approval of the Social Security Administration or Department of Homeland Security, where required, to provide a copy of each such verification to the Customer. The Vendor further represents and warrants that any person assigned to perform services hereafter meets the employment eligibility requirements of all immigration laws of these warranties, the breach of which may subject the Vendor to the following: (1) termination of this Agreement and ineligibility for any state or public contract in Mississippi for up to three (3) years, with notice of such cancellation/termination being made public, or (2) the loss of any license, permit, certification or other document granted to the Vendor by an agency, department or governmental entity for the right to do business in Mississippi for up to one (1) year, or (3) both—in the event of such cancellation/termination, the Vendor would also be liable for any additional costs incurred by the Customer due to the contract cancellation or loss of license or permit.

- 28. <u>HARD DRIVE SECURITY:</u> Vendor must properly format the hard drive, deleting all information, or replace the hard drive with a new hard drive prior to storing or re-selling the equipment. The Customer may request to retain the hard drive for a nominal fee. Vendor will supply written notification to the Customer that all data has been made inaccessible. This notification must be provided with forty-five (45) days of the equipment being returned to the Vendor.
- 29. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the equipment, software or services described herein and supersedes and replaces any and all prior negotiations, understandings and agreements, written or oral, between the parties relating hereto. No terms, conditions, understandings, usages of the trade, course of dealings or agreements, not specifically set out in this Agreement or incorporated herein, shall be effective or relevant to modify, vary, explain or supplement this Agreement.
- 30. TRANSPARENCY: This Agreement, including any accompanying exhibits, attachments, and appendices, is subject to the "Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983," codified as Section 25-61-1 et seq., Mississippi Code Annotated and exceptions found in Section 79-23-1 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972, as amended). In addition, this Agreement is subject to provisions of the Mississippi Accountability and Transparency Act of 2008 (MATA), codified as Section 27-104-151 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972, as amended). Unless exempted from disclosure due to a court-issued protective order, this Agreement is required to be posted to the Department of Finance and Administration's independent agency contract website for public access. Prior to posting the Agreement to the website, any information identified by the Vendor as trade secrets, or other proprietary information including confidential vendor information, or any other information which is required confidential by state or federal law or outside the applicable freedom of information statutes will be redacted. A fully executed copy of this Agreement shall be posted to the State of Mississippi's accountability website at: <a href="http://www.transparency.mississippi.gov">http://www.transparency.mississippi.gov</a>.
- 31. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: The Vendor understands that the Customer is an equal opportunity employer and therefore maintains a policy which prohibits unlawful discrimination based on race, color, creed, sex, age, national origin, physical handicap, disability, genetic information, or any other consideration made unlawful by federal, state, or local laws. All such discrimination is unlawful and the Vendor agrees during the term of the Agreement that the Vendor will strictly adhere to this policy in its employment practices and provision of services. The Vendor shall comply with, and all activities under this Agreement shall be subject to, all applicable federal, State of Mississippi, and local laws and regulations, as now existing and as may be amended or modified.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN JACKSON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI AND ITS POLICE DEPARTMENT

This Memorandum of Understanding for Security for Athletic and Graduation
Events ("MOU") is entered into by and between the Jackson Public School District
(JPS), the City of Jackson, Mississippi (COJ) and its Police Department (JPD). The
terms of this MOU are binding from September, 2019 through September,
2020. The purpose of this MOU is for the COJ and JPD to provide police security at
designated JPS athletic and social events pursuant to an Order adopted by the City
Council of the City of Jackson on, and
an Order adopted by the Board of Trustees of JPS on July 16, 2019.

- 1. COJ and JPD agree to provide trained police security at designated JPS athletic and social events. A listing of the athletic and social events, along with the number of officers and supervisor to be provided by JPD at each event, and the number of hours expected to be worked at each event will be coordinated by the Executive Director of Jackson Public Schools Campus Enforcement Department or his designee. All officers and supervisors will act, at all times, as JPD employees and are under the supervision and direction of JPD. All JPS employees will work under the supervision of the Executive Director of JPS Campus Enforcement Department or designee.
- JPS will pay JPD for all services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and the applicable salary ranges, inclusive of fringe benefits costs up to the specified amount indicated in the Agreement, not to exceed the total sum of One Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$105,000.00).
- 3. JPS will pay JPD for all services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and the attached salary ranges, inclusive of fringe benefits costs (Exhibit A).
  - a. JPS further agrees to reimburse JPD for any and all additional hours of overtime incurred by JPD in providing JPS with services under the terms of this Agreement.
  - b. For every semi-monthly period (corresponding to established JPD payroll periods), during which any JPD renders any services to JPS under the terms of this agreement, JPD shall prepare and send to JPS an invoice that sets forth the semi-monthly amount due for services rendered during the semi-monthly period, and overtime, plus related fringe benefits (PERS at 12.93% and Medicare at 1.45%), during that semi-monthly billing period.
  - c. Further, the invoice shall set out the following: (1) the officer and supervisors providing services, (2) date, time, and place services provides, (3), the number of hours of service provided by each officer and supervisor, (4) the total amount due to COJ, and (5) any other information deemed necessary or relevant by COJ or JPS. COJ

agrees to submit to JPS invoices within thirty (30) days after services are rendered.

- d. JPS agrees to pay COJ the full amounts due on any such invoice within forty-five (45) days of the invoice date. Nothing in this Agreement shall operate to limit in any way JPD's right to pursue any other legal remedies against JPS for the reimbursement of the amounts due to JPD under this Agreement.
- e. The total sum due for all invoices, inclusive of any overtime due or fringe benefits, shall not exceed the sum of One Hundred Five Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$105,000) for the term of this Agreement.
- 4. JPS, COJ and JPD will make reasonable efforts to communicate in writing anticipated problems or concerns about security in a timely fashion.
  - a. JPS Campus Enforcement personnel shall be present at all designated athletic and social events.
  - b. JPS will inform JPD of anticipated violence, potential disturbances based on rivalry, potential sell-outs or any other matter that may reasonably lead JPS' Executive Director of Campus Enforcement to suspect that additional security may be needed or that JPD should be warned.
  - c. JPS' Executive Director of Campus Enforcement or designee and JPD's Chief of Police or designee will coordinate, or delegate authorized personnel to coordinate security schedules that will ensure that police security and JPS security are in place at a reasonable time before the start of the event.
  - d. In the event of a tragedy, calamity or other serious disturbance occurs such that additional police officers, other than those already scheduled to work the event are needed to respond, JPS will not be responsible for payment for such officers. Likewise, such additional officers are under not duty to remain at the scene of such tragedy, calamity or disturbance once controlled, unless ordered to do so by a supervising JPD officer.
- 5. In accordance with applicable law, JPS agrees to promptly notify and/or provide JPD with any material, substantial, and reliable information of which JPS has actual knowledge and or possession regarding any act contrary to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or any other illegal or inappropriate act(s) or omission(s), or any other allegation of the same, by any JPD officer. JPS also agrees that it shall promptly deliver to JPD written

notice and copies of any complaint(s), charge(s), or any other accusation(s) or allegation(s) of wrongdoing, whether civil or criminal in nature, which JPS becomes aware of regarding any JPD officer rendering services under this Agreement. JPS agrees to cooperate with JPD in any investigation conducted by JPD into the character and/or fitness of any officer.

- This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi.
  - a. Any modifications to this MOU shall be in writing and executed by the authorized representatives of both parties.
  - b. In the event of any dispute arising under this MOU, the parties will first negotiate in good faith to resolve such dispute.
  - c. In the event of a "Material Breach" of this MOU, this MOU shall be terminable at the option of the non-breaching party. For the purposes of this MOU, a "Material Breach" shall be limited to the following events:
    - Failure of JPS to pay COJ undisputed amounts due for officers and supervisors providing security services hereunder within sixty (60) days of receiving an invoice;
    - Failure of JPD to provide officers and/or supervisors for a designated event; or
    - iii. Repeated occurrences of a non-material breach.
  - d. In the event suit shall be filed to enforce any provision of this MOU, the parties submit to the jurisdiction of the state and federal courts located in Jackson, Hinds County, Mississippi.
  - e. Either party may terminate this MOU upon thirty (30) days prior written notice.
- 7. While providing services hereunder, JPD officers will have their normal and usual police power and/or authority and discretion.
  - a. JPD officers, who provide services at JPS events, will have all normal and usual authority to arrest, serve and protect, as if on the beat.
  - b. Neither JPS security nor any JPS official or employee may interfere with a JPD officer's authority and discretion to enforce laws of the State of Mississippi or the ordinances of the City of Jackson. JPS

personnel shall act under the authority and supervision of JPS' Executive Director of Campus Enforcement.

- c. JPS' Executive Director of Campus Enforcement may advise JPD officer and supervisors as to matters; however, JPD officers and supervisors shall at all times be under the supervision of the Chief of Police for the City of Jackson and his supervision officers.
- d. Neither COJ nor JPD assumes liability for the actions and inactions of JPS security, staff or administration.
- e. JPS assumes no liability for the actions and inactions of JPD and/or COJ employees, officials and administration providing services hereunder.

#### FUNDING GRANT AGREEMENT

This Funding Grant Agreement (hereinafter the "Grant") is entered into between the Department of Finance and Administration (hereinafter the "DFA") and the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo for the purpose of establishing the agreed upon conditions under which the DFA may disburse funds to assist the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo in paying costs associated with the local projects (hereinafter the "Projects") specified in Section 19 of Senate Bill 2906, 2015 Regular Legislative Session, Laws of 2015, and in Section 48 of House Bill 1729, 2016 Regular Legislative Session, Laws of 2016 (hereinafter the "Acts"). This Grant is entered into pursuant to, and subject to the terms of the Acts. This Grant shall not exceed \$351,714.78 for the Projects (the "Grant Funds") and includes bond funds and interest which were repaid to the DFA due to misappropriation of funds by the Jackson Zoo. (PLEASE NOTE THAT IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO SPEND THE GRANT FUNDS RECEIVED FROM THE STATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACTS.)

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Acts establish the 2015 Jackson Zoo Improvements Fund and the 2016 Jackson Zoo Improvements Fund for the purpose of providing funds to the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo to pay the costs of the Projects; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Acts, the State Bond Commission, on behalf of the State of Mississippi (hereinafter the "State"), issued general obligation bonds of the State (hereinafter the "Bonds") to fund the Projects and certain other projects and programs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo shall maintain the Grant Funds in a separate bank account; and

WHEREAS, the Acts authorize the DFA, within its discretion, to utilize funds in the 2015 Jackson Zoo Improvements Fund and the 2016 Jackson Zoo Improvements Fund for purposes of entering into this Grant to finance all or a portion of the Projects; and

WHEREAS, the DFA has requested the City of Jackson – Jackson Zoo to maintain on file the documentation listed in "Exhibit A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, to the extent required by the State's bidding laws; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo agrees to make every effort to expend the Grant Funds within thirty-six (36) months from the date of receipt from the State; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo agrees that if Grant Funds are remaining at the completion of the Projects, said funds shall be returned to the State to be applied to debt service on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo agrees to provide quarterly reports to the DFA that summarize the expenditure of the Grant Funds and also provide an update on the status

of the Projects. The quarterly reports must be provided on a form prescribed by the DFA and must include all invoices and bank statements associated with the reported expenditures. The first quarterly report shall be provided within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this Grant, and thereafter within thirty (30) days of each calendar quarter end. The City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo shall also provide to the DFA a final report no more than thirty (30) days after final expenditure of the Grant Funds, summarizing the expenditures and use of the proceeds upon completion of the Projects and include all invoices that have not previously been submitted; and

WHEREAS, the DFA finds, consistent with the Acts, that it is in the best interest of the DFA and the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo that the Grant Funds be disbursed to the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo and that the City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo shall directly administer the expenditure of such Grant Funds for the Projects.

# NOW THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION AND THE CITY OF JACKSON - JACKSON ZOO AS FOLLOWS:

- **SECTION 1.** Each and all of the facts and findings set forth in the preamble clauses of this memorandum are hereby found and determined to be true and accurate and are incorporated herein by this reference thereto as though set forth again in words and figures.
- **SECTION 2.** The DFA, pursuant to the Acts, shall disburse the Grant Funds upon the request of the City of Jackson Jackson Zoo to pay the costs associated with the Projects.
- **SECTION 3.** The City of Jackson Jackson Zoo certifies and agrees to use all Grant Funds received **solely** for the costs of the Projects as set forth in the Acts and upon the terms and provisions of this Grant. Failure on the part of the City of Jackson Jackson Zoo to adhere to this provision of the Grant may result in immediate action by the State to revoke the Grant and seek return of the Grant Funds.
- **SECTION 4.** The City of Jackson Jackson Zoo agrees to spend the Grant Funds within thirty-six (36) months from the date of receipt. Failure on the part of the City of Jackson Jackson Zoo to adhere to this provision of the Grant may result in immediate action by the State to revoke the Grant and seek return of the Grant Funds.
- **SECTION 5.** The City of Jackson Jackson Zoo agrees to properly and competitively execute procurements in accordance with State law. Failure to adhere may cause the DFA to revoke the Grant and seek return of the Grant Funds. Further, the Jackson Zoo agrees to maintain on file the documentation listed in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein, in accordance with the law and the recitals of this Grant.
- **SECTION 6.** The City of Jackson Jackson Zoo agrees to provide the DFA quarterly notarized reports as set forth hereinabove, in a format prescribed by the DFA. The first quarterly report shall be provided within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this Grant, and thereafter within thirty (30) days of each calendar quarter end. The Jackson Zoo shall also provide the DFA with a final report summarizing the expenditures and use of the Grant Funds proceeds no more than thirty (30) days after final expenditure of the Grant Funds.

SECTION 7. The City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo agrees to maintain copies of all invoices, bank statements and similar documentation for each expenditure of all funds received from sufficient to satisfy and confirm, to DFA's satisfaction, that such Grant Funds have been expended solely for the costs of the Projects as authorized and provided by the Acts.

SECTION 8. The City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo agrees to administer the Projects with respect to construction to be completed in accordance with the state procurement laws.

SECTION 9. The City of Jackson - Jackson Zoo agrees that if any Grant Funds are remaining at the completion of the Projects, the remaining Grant Funds shall be returned to the State to be applied to debt service.

SECTION 10. All notices or information pursuant to this Grant shall be provided as follows:
