





ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SOLID WASTE FACILITY DISPOSAL FEES, SECTION 106-148 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI. (ALL WARDS)

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson owns a Class I rubbish facility located at 6810 I-55 South Frontage Road, Byram, Mississippi 39272;

WHEREAS, on July 16, 2009, the City of Jackson amended Section 106-148 of the Code of Ordinances relating to Solid Waste Facility disposal fees to the current rubbish site tipping fees; and

WHEREAS, Section 106-151 of the Code of Ordinances provides that landfills be accounted for so that on a periodic basis, as may be requested by the mayor and/or city council, their adequacy to support the landfill operation can be reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the City's revenues from solid waste operations have steadily declined since 20011 such that, without certain adjustments to increase revenues, the City will likely not be able to financially support the rubbish site beginning in Fiscal Year 2017; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the municipality to amend the provisions of Section 106-148 to revise the fees assessed for disposal at the City's solid waste facility and to ensure that these fees assessed support the operations.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, THAT:

SECTION 1. Section 106-148 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 106-148. - Solid waste facility disposal fees.

It shall be unlawful to enter upon any solid waste facility managed, controlled, and operated by the City of Jackson for the purpose of removing or disposing of garbage, trash, debris, or refuse material of any type except as hereinafter provided:

- (1) All refuse material collected by the City of Jackson Public Works Department or any other department or agency of the city shall be disposed of at a City of Jackson solid waster facility without charge if collected by the public works department or department or agency of the city in the course of its operations.
- (2) All persons other than those provided for in subparagraph (1) of the section above shall pay the following amounts when disposing of trash, debris, and other types of refuse material in the Byram or other solid waste facility managed, controlled or operated by the City of Jackson:

SECTION 2. All provisions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, in conflict with the provisions of this chapter shall be, and the same are hereby, repealed: and, all other provisions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, not in conflict with the provisions of this chapter shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this chapter be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this chapter as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as a whole.

SECTION 4. The preceding amendment to the Solid Waste Facility Disposal Fee Ordinance shall be effective and enforceable thirty (30) days after adoption and publication.

Background: With respect to continuing to have a viable Solid Waste operation, we are proposing an update to amended Ordinance CHAPTER 106, Solid Waste, SECTION 148 of the Code of Ordinances Relating to Solid Waste Facility Disposal Fees at the City of Jackson Class I Rubbish Disposal Site in Byram, MS. Problems exist in the volume based fees because they are estimated by the employee working the gate, and often there are discrepancies resulting in customer confusion and some arguments based on price charged. Creating a weight based system, with streamlined fees, will eliminate the confusion on what to charge. Basing the gross weight of the incoming vehicles will simplify the process.

City of Jackson Department of Public Works

- Currently, an average of 28 loads is received at the City of Jackson site by pickup truck or single
 axle trailer per day. The charge for both is \$10.00. Over \$2,000,000 is budgeted for this site;
 however, only \$154,000 in revenue was collected in FY 2014.
- The Solid Waste Division is proposing an update to Landfill tipping fees. The current fee
 structure is a mix of charging by loads and volume based charges. We plan to develop a primary
 fee structure based on volume or per cubic yard fee, which provides a fair charge for customers,
 as well as better inventory control and waste acceptance tracking.
- For the purpose of this proposal, the staff compared the per-cubic yard (cy) landfill charge to other Class I Rubbish facilities in the area. Vicksburg charges \$4/cy, Clinton charges \$6/cy and Madison charges \$5.5/cy. The difference in the way they charge for waste disposal and the way that Jackson charges is the other sites charge by the cubic yard and Jackson charges by the load. Below is a spreadsheet that breaks down the cost into a per cubic yard basis. For example; a double-axle trailer can contain 8 cubic yards, the load charge for that waste at the City of Jackson site is \$30/load or \$3.75/cy. This same load would cost someone \$32/load (\$4/cy) at Vicksburg or \$48/load (\$6/cy) at Clinton.
- The proposed updated Tipping fees would result in increased revenue. Currently, pickup trucks and single-axle trailers are paying a flat charge based on the load. When compared on a per cubic yard cost between the landfills, Jackson is charging from 6% to as much as 44% less than the other three. We propose a \$5.00 per-cubic yard fee for all types of acceptable waste to take effect July 1, 2016. The pickup trucks and trailers would pay \$25.00 per load (\$5 * 5 cubic yards). For a 40-yard dump truck, the cost would increase to \$200 from \$150.
- We project a 40% increase in revenue.

ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 62 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, GOVERNING FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Chapter 62 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Jackson, Mississippi, establishes areas of special flood hazard and regulations for the prevention of flood damage; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") has reviewed the City's current floodplain ordinance as part of its regular review of the City's floodplain program and recommended technical changes to certain sections of the ordinance.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

SECTION 1. The definition of *dry floodproofing* as stated in Section 62-7 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Dry Floodproofing means any combination of structural and nonstructural additions, changes, or adjustments to structures, which reduce or eliminate flood damages to real estate or improved real estate property, water, and sanitary facilities, structures, and their contents. Structures shall be floodproofed with a minimum of 12 18 inches of freeboard (more is recommended) in relation to the base flood elevation. Dry floodproofing of a pre-FIRM residential structure that has not been substantially damaged or improved is allowed. Dry floodproofing of a post-FIRM residential building is not allowed. Non-residential structures may be dry floodproofed in all flood zones with the exception of the Coastal High Hazard Area or the Coastal AE Zone.

SECTION 2. Section 62-21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-21. ENFORCEMENT, PENALTIES, AND VIOLATIONS.

Any action or inaction which violates the provisions of this ordinance or permit shall be subject to the enforcement actions outlined in Division 3. Any such action or inaction that is continuous with respect to time is deemed to be a public nuisance and may be abated by injunctive or other equitable relief. The imposition of any of the penalties described below shall not prevent such equitable relief.

dr) Civil penalties. Violation of the provisions of this ordinance or failure to comply with any of its requirements, including violation of conditions and safeguards established in connection with grants of variance or special exceptions, shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than \$500.00 or imprisoned for not more than 90 days, or both, and in addition, shall pay all costs and expenses involved in the case. Each act of violation and each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Nothing herein contained shall prevent

the Floodplain Administrator from taking such other lawful actions as are necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

SECTION 3. Section 62-33 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-33. POWERS, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE FLOODPLAIN ADMINISTRATOR.

The Floodplain Administrator and his or her designated staff is hereby authorized and directed to enforce the provisions of this ordinance. The Administrator is further authorized to render interpretations of this ordinance, which are consistent with its spirit and purpose.

Duties of the administrator shall include, but not be limited to:

- (1) Review all development permits to assure that the permit requirements of this ordinance have been satisfied.
- (2) Review proposed development to assure that all necessary permits have been received from those governmental agencies from which approval is required by Federal or State law, including section 404 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972, 33 U.S.C. 1334. Additionally, require the permittee to obtain and submit copies of any required federal or state permits and maintain them on file with the development permit.
- (3) Perform a minimum of three inspections to ensure that all applicable ordinance and floodplain development requirements have been satisfied. The first inspection upon the establishment of the Base Flood Elevation reference mark at the development site; the second upon the establishment of the structure's footprint prior to pouring the slab or the establishment of the lowest floor in an elevated foundation system; and the final inspection upon completion and submission of the required finished construction elevation certificate.
- (4) Verify any required setback distances.
- (5) Verify that all placement of fill or grading is according to certified plans. Assure that any fill being used as part of the structure's foundation system (not allowed in a CHHA) is both clean material and properly compacted and placed. A professional certification that any structure built on fill is reasonably safe from flooding can be requested of the builder/developer.
- (6) Verify adequate placement and size of any required flood vents in regard to the number of openings, their location, size, and height above ground level.

- (7) Ensure that a crawlspace has adequate vents or openings and that the interior grade is at or above the exterior grade.
- (8) Verify that the structure's utilities, duct work, and HVAC systems are at or above the base flood elevation.
- (9) Notify adjacent communities, the NFIP State Coordinator, and other federal and/or state agencies with statutory or regulatory authority prior to any alteration or relocation of a watercourse.
- (10) Assure that maintenance is provided within the altered or relocated portion of said watercourse so that the flood-carrying capacity is maintained.
- (11) Verify and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new construction and substantially improved buildings, in accordance with Section 62-32(2). Information must be recorded on the FEMA Elevation Certificate Form 81-31.
- (12) Verify and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the new construction and substantially improved buildings have been floodproofed, in accordance with Section 62-32(2). Information must be recorded on the FEMA Elevation Certificate Form 81-31.
- (13) Review certified plans and specifications for compliance.
- (14) Make the necessary interpretation where interpretation is needed as to the exact location of boundaries of the areas of special flood hazard (for example, where there appears to be a conflict between a mapped boundary and actual field conditions). The person contesting the location of the boundary shall be given a reasonable opportunity to appeal the interpretation as provided in this Article.
- (15) Obtain, review and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation and floodway data available from a federal, state or other source when base flood elevation data or floodway data have not been provided in accordance with Section 62-12, in order to administer the provisions of Division 5.
- (16) Provide information, testimony, or other evidence, as needed during variance request hearings.
- (17) Conduct the following actions when damage occurs to a building or buildings:
 - a.) Determine whether damaged structures are located within the Special Flood Hazard Area:
 - b.) Conduct damage assessments for those damaged structures located in the SFHA, and;

- c.) Make a reasonable attempt to notify owner(s) of damaged structure(s) of the requirement to obtain a building permit / floodplain development permit prior to repair, rehabilitation, or reconstruction.
- d.) Perform such other inspections as may be required to insure compliance with other provisions of this ordinance.
- (18) Perform such other inspections as may be required to insure compliance with the other provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Section 62-41 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-41. GENERAL STANDARDS FOR ALL ZONES.

In all areas of special flood hazard the following provisions are required:

- (1) New construction and substantial improvements shall be anchored to prevent flotation, collapse and lateral movement of the structure.
- (2) Manufactured homes shall be anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, and lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors. Dry stacked blocks (stacked without the use of mortar or cement to bond them together) are not to be used as an anchor/elevation method. This standard shall be in addition to and consistent with applicable state requirements for resisting wind forces.
- (3) New construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed with materials and utility equipment resistant to flood damage.
- (4) New construction or substantial improvements shall be constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damage.
- (5) Electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, air conditioning equipment and other service facilities shall be designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding, such facilities shall be located a minimum of 18 inches above the Base Flood Elevation.
- (6) New and replacement water supply systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system.
- (7) New and replacement sanitary sewage systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters.

On-site waste disposal systems shall be located and constructed to avoid (8) impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding.

- JAMSE THE CITY ATTORNEY (9)Any alteration, repair, reconstruction or improvements to a building that is in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance shall meet the requirements of "new construction" as contained in this ordinance.
- (10)Any alteration, repair, reconstruction or improvements to a building that is not in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance, shall be undertaken only if said non-conformity shall meet the requirements of "new construction" as contained in this ordinance.
- (11)All gas and liquid storage tanks (both above and below ground) shall be adequately anchored to prevent floatation, lateral movement resulting from hydrodynamic forces, and the effects of buoyancy.
- (12)When new construction and substantial improvements are located in multiple flood zones or in a flood zone with multiple base flood elevations, they shall meet the requirement for the more stringent flood zone and the highest base flood elevation.
- New construction and substantial improvement of any building (both in and (13)outside the SFHA) shall have the lowest floor (including basement) at least one foot above the centerline of the designated street, unless the topography of the property does not allow for strict adherence as determined by the Floodplain Administrator.
- All new horizontal additions must have the lowest floor and all HVAC elevated to (14)the regulatory base flood elevation.
- New construction and substantial improvements of structures built on fill (only (15)allowed outside of the CHHA and Coastal AE Zone) shall be constructed on properly designed and compacted fill that extends 10 feet to 15 feet beyond the building walls before dropping below the base flood elevation, and shall have appropriate protection from erosion and scour as follows:
 - a.) Fill sites, upon which structures will be constructed or placed, must be compacted to 95 percent of the maximum density obtainable with the Standard Proctor Test method or an acceptable equivalent method.
 - b.) Fill slopes shall be no steeper than one foot vertical to two feet horizontal.
 - c.) Adequate protection against erosion is must be provided for fill slopes. When expected velocities during the occurrence of the base flood are greater than five feet per second, armoring with stone or rock protection or material that

will provide equivalent resistance will be provided. When expected velocities during the base flood are five feet per second or appropriate protection shall be provided by covering them with vegetative cover at a minimum.

- d.) Fill shall be composed of clean granular or earthen material.
- c.) Storage or processing of materials that are hazardous, flammable, explosive, or in time of flooding could become buoyant and pose an obstruction to flower, are prohibited within the community special flood hazard areas, to include identified floodways. Storage of material or equipment not otherwise prohibited shall be firmly anchored to prevent flotation.
- (16) Storage or processing of materials that are hazardous, flammable, explosive, or in time of flooding could become buoyant and pose an obstruction to flow, are prohibited within the community special flood hazard areas, to include identified floodways. Storage of material or equipment not otherwise prohibited shall be firmly anchored to prevent flotation.

SECTION 5. Section 62-42(7) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (7) Standards for Manufactured Homes and Recreational Vehicles.
 - a.) All manufactured homes placed, or substantially improved, on individual lots or parcels, in existing manufactured home parks or subdivisions, in expansions to existing manufactured home parks or subdivisions, in new manufactured home parks or subdivisions or in substantially improved manufactured home parks or subdivisions, must meet all the requirements for new construction, including elevation and anchoring and the flood openings requirements of Section 62-42 (4).
 Manufactured homes must be:

Manufactured nomes must be:

- 4- (i) Elevated on a permanent foundation to have its lowest floor elevated to no lower than 18 inches above the base flood elevation, and;
- 2. (ii) Securely anchored to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist flotation, collapse, and lateral movement.
- b.) All manufactured homes placed or substantially improved, excepting manufactured homes that have incurred substantial damage as a result of a flood, in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision must be elevated so that:
 - + (i) The lowest floor of the manufactured home is elevated to no lower than 18 inches above the base flood elevation and be securely

(ii) The manufactured home chassis is supported by reinforced piers or other foundation elements of at least an equivalent strength, of no less than 36 inches in height above the highest adjacent grade and adequately anchored foundation support system to resist floatation, collapse, and lateral movement.
- All recreational vehicles placed on sites must either.
 - Be on site for fewer than 180 consecutive days and obtain a new permit before returning to the same site;
 - ii. Be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or
 - iii. Must meet all the requirements for new construction, including unchoring and elevation requirements of this subsection (7)a. or (7)b.1. above.
- c.) All recreational vehicles placed on sites must either:
 - (i) Be on site for fewer than 180 consecutive days and obtain a new permit before returning to the same site.
 - (ii) Be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or
 - (iii) Must meet all the requirements for new construction, including anchoring and elevation requirements of this Section 62-42 (7) (a) or Section 62-42 (7) (b) (i) above.

A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is licensed and insured in accordance with the state of Mississippi motor vehicle regulations, is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities and security devices and has no permanently attached additions.

SECTION 6. Section 62-61 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-61. DESIGNATION OF VARIANCE AND APPEALS BOARD.

The Floodplain Management Board as established by the Planning Board of the City of Jackson shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from requirements of this ordinance.

SECTION 7. Section 62-62 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-62, DUTIES OF VARIANCE AND APPEALS BOARD.

The **board Planning Board** shall hear and decide appeals when it is alleged an error in any requirement, decision, or determination is made by the Floodplain Administrator in the enforcement or administration of this ordinance. Any person aggrieved by the decision of the board may appeal such decision to the **appropriate court**, as provided in Mississippi Code Annotated, § 11-51-75 (1972).

SECTION 8. Section 62-63 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-63. VARIANCE PROCEDURES.

In passing upon such applications, the **Floodplain Management Board** Planning Board shall consider all technical evaluations, relevant factors, and standards specified in other sections of this ordinance, and:

- (1) The evaluation must be based on the characteristics unique to that property and not be shared by adjacent parcels. The characteristics must pertain to the land itself, not to the structure, its inhabitants, or its owners;
- (2) Variances should never be granted for multiple lots, phases of subdivisions, or entire subdivisions;
- (3) The danger that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others;
- (4) The danger of life and property due to flooding or erosion damage;
- (5) The susceptibility of the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and the effect of such damage on the individual owner and the community;
- (6) The importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to the community;
- (7) The necessity of the facility to be at a waterfront location, where applicable;
- (8) The availability of alternative locations for the proposed use which are not subject to flooding or erosion damage;
- (9) The compatibility of the proposed use with existing and anticipated development;
- (10) The relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and floodplain management program for that area;
- (11) The safety of access to the property in times of flood for ordinary and emergency vehicles;
- (12) The expected heights, velocity, duration, rate of rise, and sediment transport of the floodwaters and the effects of wave action, if applicable, expected at the site, and;

(13) The costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions, including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems, and streets and bridges and culverts.

- (14) Upon consideration of factors listed above, and the purpose of this ordinance, the Floodplain Management Board or the Planning Board of the City of Jackson Planning Board may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this ordinance.
- (15) Variances shall not be issued within any designated floodway if any increase in flood levels during the base flood discharge would result.

SECTION 8. Section 62-64 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-64. CONDITIONS FOR VARIANCES.

- (1) Variances shall only be issued when there is:
 - a.) A showing of good and sufficient cause;
 - b.) A determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship, and;
 - c.) A determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public expense, create nuisance, cause fraud on or victimization of the public, or conflict with existing local laws or ordinances.
- (2) The provisions of this ordinance are minimum standards for flood loss reduction; therefore any deviation from the standards must be weighed carefully. Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary deviation from the requirements of this ordinance, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief. In the instance of a Historic Structure, a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary so as not to destroy the historic character and design of the building. (See Article 6, Section F Section 62-66.)
- (3) Any applicant to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice specifying the difference between the base flood elevation and the elevation to which the lowest floor is to be built and stating that the cost of flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation.
- (4) The Floodplain Administrator shall maintain the records of all appeal actions and report any variances to the Federal Emergency Management Agency and Mississippi Emergency Management Agency upon request. (See Section 62-65.)

- Upon consideration of the factors listed above and the purposes of this ordinance, the Floodplain Management Board or the Planning Board of the City of Jackson Planning Board may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this ordinance.
- (6) Variances shall not be issued "after the fact."

SECTION 9. Section 62-67 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 62-67. SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

Upon consideration of the factors listed in Division 6, and the purposes of this ordinance, the Floodplain Management Board or the Planning Board of the City of Jackson Planning Board may attach such conditions to the granting of variances, as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION 10. Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this Article be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Article as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as a whole.

SECTION 11. The preceding amendments and revisions to the Floodplain Ordinance of the City of Jackson, Section 62-1, *et seq.*, of the Code of Ordinances, City of Jackson, Mississippi, shall be published and effective August 15, 2016.

Attached you will find an item for the agenda amending certain sections of Chapter 62 of the Code of Ordinances governing flood plains.

Last summer, FEMA conducted a routine Community Assisted Visit to review the City's floodplain program. As part of the review, FEMA reviewed the City's ordinance and recommended two substantive changes and some minor technical changes. There were two substantive changes recommended by FEMA:

- Amend the definition of dry floodproofing in Section 62-7 to change the required freeboard from 12 inches to 18 inches. This change will allow the freeboard requirement to match the freeboard requirement in the MEMA model ordinance and the rest of the City ordinance.
- Amend sections between Section 62-61 and 62-67 referencing the body reviewing appeals and variance requests. The current ordinance lists two bodies to hear and vote upon variances; (1) the floodplain management board, which was in the MEMA model ordinance, and (2) the planning board, which was added as a City Council amendment during the ordinance approval process in 2014. However, the last two variance requests were heard and voted upon by the City Council. To consolidate these overlapping bodies, Public Works and Planning recommend that all appeals and variance requests be heard by the Planning Board.

The minor technical changes deal with paragraph numbering and references. Paragraph and subparagraph numbering changes with no text edits were made in Section 62-21, 62-33, 62-41, and 62-42(7). One section reference in Section 62-64(2) has also been corrected.

Typically, ordinances go into effect after publication and 30 days after passage. Based on staff's previous experience with FEMA asking for a set date for an ordinance to go into effect (instead of the normal 30 days after passage), Public Works has listed August 15th, 2016, as the date that this ordinance would go into effect.

ordinance regulating the erection of political signs within the City of Jackson promotes the aesthetic and safety goals

Sec. 102-31. - Exempt signs.

(12) Political signs provided such signs are not located less than ten feet from any public right-of-way and

shall not exceed 12 square feet in area. Political signs are not permitted in any public right-of-way and a

premise shall have no more than one sign per candidate. Said signs shall be erected no more than 30 days

prior to election and shall be removed by the political candidate within 15 days after the election in which

the person's candidacy ends. If the signs are not removed, or if political signs are located within any public

right-of-way at any time, the political candidate shall be given a 72-hour notice for such removal. The

candidate shall be assessed a \$100.00 fine, in addition to which shall be added a \$5.00 fine for each

remaining sign not removed as required herein that has to be removed by the city.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Jackson, Mississippi (the "Council" of the "City"), acting for and on behalf of the City, hereby finds, determines and adjudicates as follows:

SECTION 1. Under the power and authority granted by the laws of the State of Mississippi and particularly under Chapter 45 of Title 21 (the "TIF Act"), the Council on May 3, 2016, did adopt a certain resolution entitled:

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, DETERMINING THE NECESSITY FOR AND INVOKING THE AUTHORITY GRANTED TO MUNICIPALITIES BY THE LEGISLATURE WITH RESPECT TO TAX INCREMENT FINANCING AS SET FORTH IN CHAPTER 45 OF TITLE 21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AS AMENDED; DETERMINING THAT THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN, JWH EQUIPMENT PROJECT, CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, MAY 2016 PROPOSES A PROJECT THAT IS ELIGIBLE FOR TAX INCREMENT FINANCING UNDER THE LAWS OF THE STATE; THAT A PUBLIC HEARING BE CONDUCTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN, JWH EQUIPMENT PROJECT, CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, MAY 2016; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

2. As directed by the aforesaid resolution, and as required by law, a Notice of Public Hearing with respect to the Tax Increment Financing Plan, JWH Equipment Project, City of Jackson, Mississippi, May 2016 (the "TIF Plan"), was published in the *Mississippi Link*, a newspaper having a general circulation within the City, on June 2, 2016 as evidenced by the publisher's proof of publication of the same heretofore presented to the Council and filed with the City Clerk.

SECTION 3. The Notice of Public Hearing generally described the TIF Plan and further called for a public hearing to be held at City Hall, Jackson, Mississippi, at 6:00 p.m., on June 14, 2016, to enable the general public to state or present their views on the TIF Plan.

SECTION 4. At 6:00 p.m. on June 14, 2016, the public hearing was held, and all in attendance were given an opportunity to state or present their oral and/or written comments on the TIF Plan.

SECTION 5. The Council has received the Tax Increment Financing Plan, JWH Equipment Project, City of Jackson, Mississippi, May 2016 (the "City TIF Plan") and the City and has conducted hearings on the same. The TIF Plan is a qualified plan under the TIF Act and should be approved and accepted by the City.

SECTION 6. Pursuant to the Act, the Council hereby declares its intent to enter into an alliance with Hinds County, Mississippi (the "County"), pursuant to the Mississippi Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1974, codified as Title 21, Chapter 45, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Interlocal Act") to support the payment of the Tax Increment Financing Revenue Bonds, (JWH Equipment Project) in the maximum principal amount of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) (the "TIF Bonds") to be issued for the Project (as hereinafter defined) and the Mayor and Council and the City Clerk should be authorized and directed to proceed with regard thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council as follows:

SECTION 1. The Council is now fully authorized and empowered under the provisions of the TIF Act, to accept, approve and implement the City TIF Plan (a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "A"), and does hereby adopt and approve such TIF Plan, in order to support the payment of TIF Bonds, which funds will be used to pay for or reimburse JWH Equipment (the "Developer") for the cost of acquiring and constructing improvements, which may include, but are not necessarily limited to, installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water and sanitary sewer; construction, renovation, or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks; site improvements; offsite improvements and infrastructure which may include roads, rights-of-way, utilities, and water and sewer lines; surface parking; relocation of electrical lines; lighting; signalization; landscaping of rights-of way; related architectural/engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees; issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs (collectively, the "Infrastructure Improvements") all as set forth in the TIF Plan.

SECTION 2. In accordance with the Act, school taxes cannot be used to service tax increment financing debt obligations.

SECTION 3. The Council does hereby approve and adopt the TIF Plan, in accordance with Sections 21-45-3 and 21-45-11 of the TIF Act.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to the Act or the Interlocal Act, the City is authorized to enter into an alliance or an interlocal agreement with the County with respect to the Project, the payment of the TIF Bonds for the Project and for related purposes. Such alliance or interlocal agreement will be carried out pursuant to an agreement to be subsequently presented to and approved by the Council.



The administration and implementation of this Tax Increment Financing Plan, JWH Equipment Project, City of Jackson, Mississippi, May 2016 (the "TIF Plan") will be an undertaking of the City of Jackson, Mississippi (the "City"), authorized pursuant to Sections 21-45-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "TIF Act"), and in accordance with The City of Jackson, Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan"), and will be administered and implemented as a joint undertaking of the City and Hinds County, Mississippi (the "County").
- The JWH Equipment LLC, a Mississippi limited liability company, its successor or assign, (the "Developer"), proposes to construct a 2 acre expansion of an equipment sales & service dealership to be located along the Highway 80 Corridor in the City consisting of the an equipment dealership, office space, service bays and a parts warehouse.

The Project will be located on real property more particularly described in Article VII of this TIF Plan and the plat attached hereto as "Exhibit A" (the "Plat"). The land described in the Plat and Article VII of this Plan being collectively referred to as the "TIF District."

- 3. The City and County will enter into an interlocal cooperation agreement which will designate the City as the primary party in interest in carrying the Project forward. The issuance of bonds to provide funds to finance the costs of infrastructure improvements identified in the TIF Plan shall be a joint undertaking of the City and County whereby the City may issue Tax Increment Financing Bonds as authorized herein to finance the Project as more fully described herein (the "TIF Bonds"). The TIF Bonds authorized by this TIF Plan shall not exceed \$600,000.
- 4. The Mayor and City Council of the City (the "Governing Body") does hereby find and determine that the Project is in the best interest of the City and its future development and that it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens that the provision of Section 21-45-9 of the TIF Act requiring dedication of the "redevelopment project" to the City not apply to those improvements which are constructed on the privately owned portion of the Project.

- 5. The tax increment financing funds as identified herein will be used to defray the cost of infrastructure improvements to serve the Project and the community as a whole.
- 6. The Developer has provided information to the City regarding the proposed site plans, the amounts of the private investments, sales taxes, and job creation projections. Estimates of ad valorem taxes were made through consultation with the office of the Hinds County Tax Assessor and valuations of similar projects in the region.

B. STATEMENT OF INTENT

- 1. The City may issue TIF Bonds pursuant to the authority outlined hereinabove, in an amount not to exceed Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000), which will be secured solely by a pledge of the increased ad valorem taxes from real and personal property and sales tax rebates generated within the TIF District, which funds will be used to pay the cost of acquiring and constructing improvements, which may include, but are not necessarily limited to, installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water and sanitary sewer; construction, renovation, or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks; site improvements; offsite improvements and infrastructure which may include roads, rights-of-way, utilities, and water and sewer lines; surface parking; relocation of electrical lines; lighting; signalization; landscaping of rights-of way; related architectural/engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees; issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs (collectively, the "Infrastructure Improvements").
- After sufficient development of the Project has been substantially completed the City will issue the TIF Bonds and reimburse the Developer in accordance with development agreements to be entered into between the City and each Developer as authorized by the TIF Act.
- 3. The construction of the Infrastructure Improvements will be undertaken to provide for the public convenience, health, and welfare.
- 4. The TIF Bonds will never be a general obligation of the City secured by the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the City, nor create any other pecuniary liability on the part of the City other than the pledge of the incremental increase in the ad valorem taxes and sales tax rebates set forth in this TIF Plan.
- The TIF Bonds will never be a general obligation of the County secured by the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the County, nor create any other pecuniary liability

on the part of the County other than the pledge of the incremental increase in the ad valorem taxes set forth in this TIF Plan.

C. PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

- The public convenience and necessity requires participation by the City and County in the Project. The Project will accomplish the following, which will provide for the public convenience and necessity and serve the best interests of the citizens of the City and County:
 - a. Construction of the Project will represent a private investment of approximately \$2,500,000.
 - b. It is estimated the Project will create construction jobs over the life of the Project with an estimated payroll of approximately \$1,000,000.
 - It is estimated that the Project will retain 19 full time jobs and create 10 new permanent full-time and part-time jobs.
 - d. It is expected that the Project will result in an annual real and personal property tax *increase* of about \$14,671 for the City.
 - e. It is expected that the Project will result in an annual real and personal property tax increase of about \$9,177 for the County.
 - f. It is anticipated that the Project will yield an annual real and personal property tax increase of about \$28,512 for the School District.
 - g. The annual sales generated by JWH Equipment are expected to reach approximately \$12,000,000.
 - h. The Project is expected to result in annual sales tax rebates to the City of about \$158,811. Additionally, it is anticipated that the Special Infrastructure Tax of 1% will result in additional annual revenue to the City and are not eligible for TIF Financing. Presently, JWH Equipment creates approximately \$77,169 in sales tax rebates.
 - i. The development of the Project will include an expansion of an existing business and will help expand the tax base of the City and the County.

ARTICLE II PROJECT INFORMATION

A. REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1. The Project is expected to consist of a 2 acre expansion of an equipment sales & service dealership to be located along the Highway 80 Corridor in the City consisting of the an equipment dealership, office space, service bays and a parts warehouse.

2. Project Location

- a. <u>Property Description and Map</u>: The Project is located along the Highway 80 Corridor in the City, as more particularly described in Article VII and Exhibit A attached hereto.
- b. Environmental Characteristics and Zoning: Development of the Project site will require improvements such as (but not limited to) installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water, sanitary sewer, construction, renovation, or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, site improvements, surface parking, relocation of electrical lines, lighting, signalization, landscaping of rights-of way, related architectural/engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees, issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs. All proposed uses shall comply with the applicable zoning ordinances of the City. The property is currently zoned as Commercial.

ARTICLE III ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IMPACT DESCRIPTION

A. JOB CREATION

- 1. <u>Construction Jobs</u>: The Project is expected to create construction jobs. Construction payroll is estimated to be approximately \$1,000,000.
- 2. <u>Permanent Jobs</u>: It is estimated that the Project will retain 19 full time jobs and create 10 new permanent full-time and part-time jobs.

B. FINANCIAL BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY

- Ad Valorem Tax Increases: The construction and development of the Project will generate significant ad valorem tax revenues for the City, the County, and the School District. The following are estimates of new ad valorem tax revenues expected to be generated.
 - (a) The estimates for real property taxes for JWH Equipment are based on an assumed new combined true value of \$1,760,000 for the development and for furniture, fixtures, equipment, and inventory; and an assumed combined assessed value of \$949,500.

2. Retail Sales: It is estimated that the Project will generate approximately \$12,000,000 in sales annually which will create annual sales tax rebates of \$158,811. Presently, JWH Equipment generates approximately \$5,959,000 in sales annually which creates a sales tax rebate of \$77,169. The City will pledge increases in sales tax rebates to secure the debt on the TIF Bonds.

ARTICLE IV THE OBJECTIVE OF THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN

A. PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

The primary objective of this TIF Plan is to serve the public convenience and necessity by participating in the Project. The TIF Plan will provide financing to construct the Infrastructure Improvements to serve the general public and JWH Equipment.

B. LOCAL CODES AND ORDINANCES

The Project and the Infrastructure Improvements will be constructed in accordance with standards, codes, and ordinances of the City.

C. HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC PROVIDED FOR

The Infrastructure Improvements will provide for the health and welfare of the public by providing for safe and adequate infrastructure improvements which may include, but are not necessarily limited to, installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water, sanitary sewer, construction, renovation, or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, site improvements, surface parking, relocation of electrical lines, lighting, signalization, landscaping of rights-of way, related architectural/engineering fees, attorney's fees, TIF Plan preparation fees, issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs.

ARTICLE V

A STATEMENT INDICATING THE NEED AND PROPOSED USE OF THE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN IN RELATIONSHIP TO THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN

The proposed use of the TIF Plan is to provide a financing mechanism for the construction of Infrastructure Improvements necessary to serve the public that will utilize the induced development within the redevelopment project area and will be a joint undertaking of the City and the County all as described in the Redevelopment Plan.

ARTICLE VI

A STATEMENT CONTAINING THE COST ESTIMATE OF THE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT, PROJECTED SOURCES OF REVENUE TO MEET THE COSTS, AND TOTAL AMOUNT OF INDEBTEDNESS TO BE INCURRED

A. COST ESTIMATE OF REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

- 1. The development of the TIF District will represent a private investment of approximately \$2,500,000. The proceeds of the TIF Bonds will be used to pay the cost of constructing various Infrastructure Improvements, more particularly described in Article I, Section B.
- 2. The Governing Body does hereby find and determine that the Project is in the best interest of the City and its future development and that it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens that the provision of Section 21-45-9 of the TIF Act requiring dedication of the "redevelopment project" to the City not apply to those improvements which are constructed on the privately owned portion of the Project.
- 3. The construction of the Infrastructure Improvements will be undertaken to provide for the public convenience, health, and welfare.
- 4. Proceeds of the TIF Bonds may also be used to fund capitalized interest and/or a debt service reserve fund as may be permitted under the TIF Act.

B. PROJECTED SOURCES OF REVENUE TO MEET COSTS

- 1. The Developer will secure financing to construct the Project including the work to be funded with TIF Bonds.
- To secure the TIF Bonds the City shall pledge one hundred percent (100%) of ad valorem tax revenue increases generated from real and personal property in the TIF District.
- 3. To secure the TIF Bonds the City shall pledge one hundred percent (100%) of sales tax rebate increases generated from sales in the TIF District.
- 4. To secure the TIF bonds, the County will pledge fifty percent (50%) of the increased ad valorem taxes generated by the County's general fund millage applied to the real and personal property within the TIF District.

C. TOTAL AMOUNT OF INDEBTEDNESS TO BE INCURRED

- 1. The City will issue up to Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) in TIF Bonds which shall be secured as follows:
 - (a) The City shall pledge one hundred percent (100%) of ad valorem tax revenue increases generated from real and personal property in the TIF District; **PLUS**
 - (b) The City shall pledge one hundred percent (100%) of sales tax rebate increases generated from sales in the TIF District.
 - (c) The County shall pledge fifty percent (50%) of the incremental increase in ad valorem tax revenues generated from the County's general fund millage applied to the real and personal property within the TIF District.
- 2. The TIF Bonds will be issued and shall be sized as follows:
 - (a) One hundred percent (100%) of the incremental increases in ad valorem tax revenues generated from real and personal property in the TIF District based on the City's general fund millage; **PLUS**
 - (b) Fifty percent (50%) of the incremental increase in sales tax rebates generated; PLUS
 - (c) Fifty percent (50%) of the incremental increase in ad valorem tax revenues generated from the County's general fund millage applied to the real and personal property within the TIF District.
- 3. The Redevelopment Plan and this Tax Increment Financing Plan, JWH Equipment, City of Jackson, Mississippi, May 2016 shall be a joint undertaking by the City and the County including, but not necessarily limited to, the issuance of the TIF Bonds, which may include bonds, notes, or other debt obligations, to provide funds to defray the cost of the Infrastructure Improvements.
- 4. It is expected that \$600,000 in TIF Bonds or notes can be obtained at an annual interest rate of 4.5% for up to fifteen (15) years. Annual principal and interest payments are estimated to be up to approximately \$55,868 assuming the 4.5% rate and tax increment obligations over a period of up to fifteen (15) years.
- 5. The increase in ad valorem real and personal property revenues generated for the City is estimated to be \$14,671. The increase in sales tax revenues to be generated for the City is estimated to be \$81,642. The increase in ad valorem real and personal property revenues to be generated for the County are \$9,177.
- 6. The amount and timing of the issuance of the TIF Bonds shall be determined pursuant to further proceedings of the City.

ARTICLE VII REAL PROPERTY TO BE INCLUDED IN TAX INCREMENT FINANCING DISTRICT

A. PARCEL NUMBERS FOR THE TIF DISTRICT

The real property to be included in the TIF District from which the ad valorem real and personal property tax revenues will be generated to finance the TIF Bonds are described below and in Exhibit A.

The duration of this TIF Plan shall be thirty (30) years from the date of approval thereof.

ARTICLE !X

The construction and development of the Project will generate significant ad valorem tax revenues for the City, the County, and the School District. The following are estimates of new ad valorem tax revenues expected to be generated.

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ARTICLE X

A STATEMENT REQUIRING THAT A SEPARATE FUND BE ESTABLISHED TO RECEIVE AD VALOREM TAXES AND THE PROCEEDS OF ANY OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

A separate fund entitled the "Tax Increment Fund: JWH Equipment Project" shall be established by the City to receive ad valorem taxes in connection with this TIF Plan.

ARTICLE XI

THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY SHALL BY RESOLUTION FROM TIME TO TIME, DETERMINE (i) THE DIVISION OF AD VALOREM TAX RECEIPTS, IF ANY, THAT MAY BE USED TO PAY FOR THE COST OF ALL OR ANY PART OF A REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT; (ii) THE DURATION OF TIME IN WHICH SUCH TAXES MAY BE USED FOR SUCH PURPOSES; (iii) IF THE GOVERNING BODY SHALL ISSUE BONDS FOR SUCH REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT; AND (iv) SUCH OTHER RESTRICTIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS AS IN THE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY SHALL BE NECESSARY IN ORDER TO PROMOTE AND PROTECT THE PUBLIC INTEREST.

Through the adoption of the TIF Plan, the Governing Body of the City acknowledges the above and shall adopt the necessary resolutions when deemed necessary and appropriate.

ARTICLE XII PLAN OF FINANCING

A. SECURITY FOR THE TIF BONDS

The TIF Plan provides for the City to issue the TIF Bonds which will be secured by the pledge of incremental increases in ad valorem real and personal property taxes generated by the Project. To secure the TIF Bonds the City will pledge one hundred percent (100%) of the incremental increase in ad valorem tax revenues on real and personal property and one hundred percent (100%) of the incremental increase in sales tax rebates. To secure the TIF Bonds the County will pledge fifty percent (50%) of the incremental increase in ad valorem tax revenues generated by the County's general fund millage applied to the real and personal property within the TIF District. The TIF Bonds will be sized as set forth in Article VI(C)(2).

B. FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY

Such decision on the most advantageous method for the City to incur the debt will be made pursuant to further proceedings of the City.

C. AMOUNT AND TIMING OF ISSUANCE

The amount and timing of the issuance of the TIF Bonds shall be determined pursuant to further proceedings of the City.







Background:

In July, October, November, and December 2013, the Trahon and Big Creek Publicly-Owned Treatment Works violated its effluent total recoverable copper limitation in its NPDES permit issued by the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality. The City's wastewater treatment contract operator, United Water Service of Mississippi, LLC, investigated the source of the periodic spikes in copper in the wastewater coming into the Trahon and Big Creek WWTP. UWS was not able to identify a source among the facilities with industrial discharge permits, as all were within their discharge limits for copper. To resolve the issue, UWS began using a chemical in the wastewater entering the plant to remove the copper prior to discharge of the treated wastewater leaving the plant.

This corrective action resolved the issue and Trahon and Big Creek WWTP has operated without any further violations of the copper limit. However, because of the extremely low limit for copper in the NPDES permit, the increase over the limit was greater than 40%, which regulations classify as a major permit violation. While expressing their satisfaction with the quick corrective action taken by the City and UWS, MDEQ is required by their regulations to impose a fine for the violation.

The maximum fine as calculated under MDEQ's civil penalty policy could have been as much as \$25,000.00. However, due to negotiates and the successful corrective action, MDEQ agreed to reduce the fine to \$6,250.00.

Talking Points:

- Neither the City nor UWS were aware of the potential of a violation of the copper limit in the NPDES permit
- UWS acted swiftly to investigate and take corrective action that has prevent any further violation of the permit limit
- MDEQ was very satisfied with the manner in which the City and UWS resolved the permit violations by investigating and taking corrective action
- The maximum fine under MDEQ's civil penalty policy was \$25,000.00, but due to the corrective action to resolve the permit violation and through negotiation, MDEQ agreed to reduce the fine to \$6,250.00.
