

**PUBLIC HEARING AND SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2014, 6:00 P.M. 518**

BE IT REMEMBERED that a Public Hearing and Special Meeting of the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi was called by a majority of the Council and Notices having been placed by the City Clerk at 3:50 p.m., on Wednesday, September 3, 2014, in Council Members' mail boxes, in the Clerk's Office and on the public bulletin board in City Hall, relative to: (1) Discussion: Public Hearing of proposed FY 2014-2015; (2) Order establishing ad valorem tax levy on real and personal property for the City of Jackson and the Jackson/Hinds Library System for Fiscal Year 2014-15 (Tax Year 2014); (3) Order establishing ad valorem tax levy on real and personal property for the Jackson Municipal Separate School District for Fiscal Year 2014-15 (Tax Year 2014). The meeting was convened in the Council Chambers at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 4, 2014, being the first Thursday of said month when and where the following things were had and done to wit:

The meeting was called to order by **President De'Keither Stamps**.

DISCUSSION: PUBLIC HEARING OF PROPOSED FY 2014-2015: President Stamps recognized the following individual who provided comments regarding the City's Budget:

ORDER ESTABLISHING AD VALOREM TAX LEVY ON REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR THE CITY OF JACKSON AND THE JACKSON/HINDS LIBRARY SYSTEM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-15 (TAX YEAR 2014).

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014 there is levied on all taxable property, real and personal, within the corporate limits of the City of Jackson, the following ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes, said levies to be collected upon each dollar of assessed value as shown upon the real and personal ad valorem assessment rolls of the property within the City limits, to wit:

FOR GENERAL REVENUE PURPOSES – FORTY-TWO AND 42/100 (42.42) MILS

FOR BOND AND INTEREST FUND – SEVEN AND 56/100/100 (7.56) MILS

FOR PARKS AND RECREATION FUND – TWO AND 00/100 (2.00) MILS (Section 21-37-43)

FOR FIREMAN AND POLICEMEN DISABILITY AND RELIEF FUND – FOUR AND 48/100 (4.48) MILS (Section 21-19-117)

TOTAL FOR SAID MUNICIPAL PURPOSES – FIFTY-SIX AND 46/100 (56.46) MILS

TOTAL PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM – ONE AND 57/100 (1.57) MILS (Section 39-3-7)

TOTAL FOR MUNICIPAL AND LIBRARY PURPOSES – FIFTY-EIGHT AND 03/100 (58.03) MILS

Council Member Tillman moved adoption; Council Member Priester seconded.

President Stamps recognized Trivia Jones, the City's Director of Administration, who provided to the public an explanation of said order.

ORDER ESTABLISHING AD VALOREM TAX LEVY ON REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR THE JACKSON MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-15 (TAX YEAR 2014).

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Jackson Public School District has submitted a certified copy of its Order formally requesting an ad valorem tax levy and officially approving the fiscal year 2014-15 budget; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to adopt an ad valorem tax levy sufficient to fund said budget.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014, there is levied on all taxable property, real and personal, within the Jackson Municipal Separate School District, composed of property both inside and outside the corporate limits of the City of Jackson, the following ad valorem taxes for school purposes, said levies to be collected upon each dollar of assessed value as shown upon the real and personal ad valorem assessment rolls of the said Jackson Municipal Separate School District for Tax Year 2014, to wit:

DISTRICT SUPPLEMENT LEVY – SIXTY-FIVE AND 91/100 (65.91) MILS

DEBT SERVICE RETIREMENT - 2003B-TWO AND 68/100 (2.68) MILS (4019)

DEBT SERVICE RETIREMENT-2007 BOND SERIES PHASE I (4905)-TWO AND 35/100 (2.35) MILS

DEBT SERVICE RETIREMENT - 2008 BOND SERIES PHASE I (4906) – NINE AND 02/100 (9.02) MILS

DEBT SERVICE RETIREMENT - 2012A BOND SERIES PHASE I (4907)-ONE AND 88/100 (1.88) MILS

DEBT SERVICE RETIREMENT - 2012B BOND SERIES PHASE I (4908) – ZERO AND 60/100 (0.60) MILS

TOTAL LEVIED FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES – EIGHTY TWO AND 44/100 (82.44) MILS

Council Member Tillman moved adoption; Council Member Priester seconded.

Absent- Barrett-Simon, Cooper-Stokes and Whitwell.


