
BE IT REMEMBERED that a Special Meeting of the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi, was called by a majority of the City Council Members and notices having been placed by the City Clerk at 2:50 p.m. on Thursday, February 6, 2020, in the Clerk’s Office, electronic notifications to all Council Members, on the City’s website and on the public bulletin board in City Hall, relative to: (1) Joint meeting with City Council members and the 1% Sales Tax Commission to discuss Infrastructure Projects. The meeting was convened in the Andrew Jackson Conference Room located at 200 S. President Street at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 12, 2020, being the second Wednesday of said month, when and where the following things were had and done to wit:

Present: Council Members: Virgi Lindsay, Council President, Ward 7; De’Keither Stamps, Vice President, Ward 4; Ashby Foote, Ward 1; Ward 4; Charles Tillman, Ward 5 and Aaron Banks, Ward 6. Directors: Chokwe Antar Lumumba, Mayor; Angela Harris, Interim Chief Deputy Municipal Clerk and Timothy Howard, City Attorney.

Absent: Kenneth Stokes, Ward 3.

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The meeting was called to order by **President Virgi Lindsay**.

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President Lindsay announced that the City Council was conducting a Work Session in conjunction with the Regular Meeting of the 1% Sales Tax Commission.

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The 1% Sales Tax Commission’s meeting was called to order by **Mayor Chokwe Antar Lumumba**, Chair of the Commission.

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Mayor Lumumba recognized AJA Management and Neel-Schaffer, who provided a detailed presentation of the City of Jackson’s Capital Infrastructure Improvement Plan Prioritization Methodology.

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During the presentation, **Mayor Lumumba** recognized **Council Member Stamps, President Lindsay, Council Member Banks, Council Member Foote, Council Member Priester** and **Council Member Tillman** who posed questions regarding the Improvement Plan Prioritization Methodology.

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Mayor Lumumba recognized **Attorney Trey Hairston**, Butler Snow, who provided information regarding the list of street projects requirement from the Mississippi Development Bank regarding the \$35 million bond and answered questions posed to him by Council Members.

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After a very thorough discussion, **Council Member Priester** recommended that a sub-committee be established between Council Members and 1% Sales Tax Commissioners to comprise a list of street project for submission to the Mississippi Development Bank.
