# ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI NAMING THE SPLASH PAD AT THE PRESIDENTIAL HILLS II PARK "KINGSTON FRAZIER MEMORIAL SPLASH PAD" IN HONOR OF KINGSTON FRAZIER. (WARD 2)

WHEREAS, it is befitting for the City of Jackson to recognize, honor and celebrate individuals whose lives have had a significant and positive impact in the community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson, through the Department of Parks and Recreation, has received requests from the Presidential Hills II Community to name the Splash Pad at the Presidential Hills II Park, the "Kingston Frazier Memorial Splash Pad"; and

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2017, 6-year old Kingston Frazier was kidnapped and murdered after the vehicle he was sleeping in was stolen from the parking lot of Kroger's Food Store on I-55 North Frontage Road in Jackson, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, Kingston Frazier will forever be missed, but not forgotten, if the Splash Pad is named "Kingston Frazier Memorial Splash Pad", honoring him for many years to come.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** The Splash Pad at the Presidential Hills II Park is hereby named the "Kingston Frazier Memorial Splash Pad".

**SECTION 2.** Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this Article be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Article as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as a whole.

**SECTION 3.** This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage, and upon publication in accordance with Section 21-13-11 of the Mississippi Code Annotated, as amended.

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2020, the Jackson City Council authorized the execution of a one-year agreement with Granicus to provide an appliance for video housing and playback, a Meeting Efficiency Suite, Government Transparency Suite, Open Platform Suite, Encoding appliance software and resultant maintenance on an annual basis, and

WHEREAS, the appliance provides for an easy way to create, track, and publish agenda items for City Departments and the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned agreement, which contemplates access to the software and follow-on maintenance on a subscription basis, expired on December 31, 2020, and is currently due for renewal; and

WHEREAS, the need for continuous maintenance has been analyzed and the execution of an agreement with Granicus for continuous maintenance for this system is recommended; and

WHEREAS, Granicus offered to provide said maintenance for a three-year period in the amount of \$29,609.04 for Year 1 (1/1/2021 - 12/31/2021), \$31,681.67 for Year 2 (1/1/2022 - 12/31/2022), \$33,899.39 for Year 3 (1/1/2023 - 12/31/2023) total amount not to exceed \$95,190.10 for the three-year period to expire on December 31, 2023.

The ADA renovation cost for the building is determined to be \$340,000.00 and the consulting fee for the project is calculated by the State of Mississippi log fee formula with renovation work additional multiplier fee in the amount of \$29,688.00 plus additional amounts of \$2,000.00 for reimbursable items and \$1,800.00 for hazardous materials design services. Total not to exceed contract value of \$33,488.00.

#### **Talking Points:**

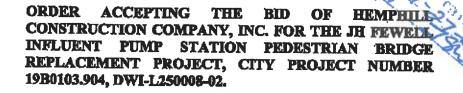

## MUNICIPAL SPECIAL SALES TAX COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES Wednesday, December 12, 2018 - 2:00 p.m. Warren G. Hood Building - Andrew Jackson Conference Room

PRESENT: Dr. Robert Blaine, Michael Boerner, Ted Duckworth, Carrie Johnson Robinson, Jonathan Lee, Mayor Lumumba, Pete Perry, and Duane O'Neill.

PRESIDING: Mayor Lumumba

CALL TO ORDER/INVOCATION: Mayor Lumumba called the meeting to order at 2:17p.m. and gave the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The minutes of the November 14, 2018 Municipal Sales Tax Commission Meeting were presented for approval. A motion was made by *Duane O'Neill* and seconded by *Dr. Robert Blaine* to approve the minutes. A vote was taken. Motion Carried.

STATUS OF SALES TAX FUND: Robert Miller stated that \$65,390,659.00 has been collected since inception (through November, 2018), \$58,021,252 has been obligated, leaving \$7,369,407 unobligated.

STATUS OF TRANSMISSION LINE FAILURE: Robert Miller stated that on Friday, November 30th there was a catastrophic failure of a 90 degree bend, in a 36 inch transmission main at the intersection of Laurel and Myrtle Streets in Belhaven. The failure was due to two holes in the bend of the pre-stressed concrete pipe. A boil water notice was issued early Friday afternoon. The job site was secured and turned over to Hemphill Construction on Friday evening and repair continued through the weekend. The pipe was refilled on Sunday evening and returned to service Monday morning. The boil water advisory was lifted noon on Monday. Because this infrastructure is significant, an independent evaluation regarding the cause of the failure is being completed by an engineer at Neel-Schaffer. The review is complete and a report is being drafted. The estimated cost is between \$350,000 and \$500,000.

2018 RESURFACING UPDATE: Dr. Charles Williams stated that two projects are complete. Base repair and sidewalk repair were made on Bailey Avenue and Bailey Avenue extension. Contractors are paving near Merit Health on Hospital Drive, base repairs were made on Clinton Boulevard and will move towards Bullard Street. The total project cost was \$3,912, 249.89. Robert Miller added that recent information provided regarding Ridgewood Court Drive has caused them to look at recommending another street that has pressing needs.

BELHAVEN CREEK UPDATE: Dr. Charles Williams stated that originally the project had two parts but were combined to look at the entire channel from Woodrow Wilson to Laurel. During the evaluation, Southern Consultants put together a proposal; and a series of meetings took place with residents who will be affected on how to move forward. A meeting was held in October and from that meeting it was decided to look at the area around St. Mary to Laurel Street, which affects about 16 property owners. So far six construction easements have been received and are working to obtain the others. Once easements are obtained, the Commission will be asked to provide construction funds. There was further discussion about the language regarding the project. It was stated that the language has not changed and the City is prepared with the assistance of the residents to move on the section, St. Mary to Laurel and move forward with the remainder of the project at a later time. Commissioners asked for a global analysis, a total cost and a detail breakdown of the sections.

STATUS UPDATE FOR WATER SEWER BILLING (WSBA): Robert Miller began by saying that the inability to collect water bills predates the implementation of the Slemens system; the City did not enforce its collection rules even before the new system was installed. They have worked to get customers billed and had considerable amount of success, with 21,600 customers billed from May-October. The turn off service began in November and business processed had to rebuilt. In addition, turn-offs began for non-payment and will ramp up after the Holidays. In November, 782 customers received notification. There are essentially three problems to work through: (1) customers who can't afford their bill, (2) incorrect bills, (3) customers who need discuss billing with the City but don't have access to MetroCenter (the City will provide satellite centers), and (4) the billing system is caught up but 'here are 24 significant issues to solve. There are nearly 20,000 accounts delinquent. A total of \$178,581.84 was collected in November; these are accounts that have not made payments in two or more years.

NORTHSIDE DRIVE BID RESULTS: Dr. Charles Williams stated that the price exceeded the Engineer's estimate so a bid evaluation was created by Southern Consultants. James Stewart of Southern Consultants reviewed the bid evaluation and used Terry Road as a comparison. A total of \$600, 725 is needed to cover the shortfall. A motion was made by Jonathan Lee and seconded by Dr. Robert Blaine to authorize \$600,725 to cover the shortfall, if MDOT allows the City to accept the bid for Northside Drive BID results. A vote was taken.

NORTH STATE STREET MILL AND OVERLAY: Dr. Charles Williams distributed and reviewed an opinionated cost for State Street prepared by Waggoneer Engineering. The subtotal construction items \$4,091,988.05, contingencies \$204,599.40, construction engineering and inspection \$491,038.57, so the total construction cost is \$4,787,626.02. The request is above the match. The original match that was applied for MPO funds for Northside was \$1,887,575, the federal match was \$1,415,681.25 and the City's local match was \$471,893.75.

State Street (Fortification to Woodrow Wilson) – The federal match is \$3,888,750.00; the local match City's is \$1,296,250. The total construction funding is \$5,185,000.00.

HINDS COUNTY PAVING PROJECT: Mayor Lumumba stated that Hinds County is requesting matching funds in the amount 1,085,058.82 for their MPO request. The funding will assist with repaving the following streets: Robinson Road segment 1 (Capitol Street to Ellis Avenue), Robinson Road Segment 2 (Ellis Avenue to Hwy 80), Robinson Road segment 3 (Hwy 80 to I-20), and Woodrow Wilson (Fortification Street to Martin Luther King Drive). Supervisor Calhoun will provide \$448,000. A motion was made Carrie Johnson Robinson and seconded by Jonathan Lee to allocate \$1,085,058.82 to support the local match required. A vote was taken 6-yes Dr. Robert Blaine, Michael Boerner, Ted Duckworth, Jenathan Lee, Mayor Lumumba, Carrie Johnson Robinson, and Duane O'Neill; 1-No, Pete Perry. Motion Carried.

**UPDATE ON BRIDGE CLOSURES:** *Dr. Williams* stated that a notice to proceed has been issued for Raymond Road as well as Henderson Road; and contractors have started on Henderson. Bids opened yesterday for Beasley Road and Ford Avenue. Bids also opened on Meadowbrook last week. There were issues with beams and with AT&T on McDowell Road; however those issues have been resolved and work should resume the first of the year. Additionally, West Street is near completion.

FY 20 PLANNING MEETING REQUEST: Robert Miller requested a planning meeting with Commissioners to review all authorized projects and the status of those projects. It was agreed that this meeting will replace the regular Commission Meeting on January 9, 2019.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at 3:57 p.m.

This litigation arose from reports of environmental dumping and the use of unmetered water at the Jaxon Energy, LLC facility located in the 400 block of Industrial Drive. Jaxon Energy operated a hydrogen reformer at this location, which produced byproducts that where allegedly dumped to a ditch where it entered the environment. The hydrogen reformer was also alleged to be using unmetered City of Jackson treated water.

March 31, 2020, the Council of the City of Jackson authorized the Mayor to retain William M. Quinn II and his law firm McRaney Montagnet Quin & Noble, PLLC and Merrida Coxwell and his firm, Coxwell & Associates, PLLC (collectively, "Outside Counsel") to pursue legal action against Jaxon Energy, LLC for the misappropriation of water and other resources from the City of Jackson.

Following the filing of the lawsuit, the Court conducted a mediation on October 22, 2021. During the mediation, parties used the respective information in their possession on conclude that Jaxon Energy used unmetered water that would have cost it \$41,429.50, had the water been metered properly. At the conclusion of the mediation, the defendants offered a settlement of \$62,000.00, which Outside Counsel believed to be reasonable and agreed to recommend to the City Council.

Under the terms of the fee agreement with Outside Counsel, the City will receive \$45,165.14. Outside counsel will receive a contingency fee of \$15,500 and reimbursement for expense in the amount of \$1,334.86.

This memorandum is to recommend settlement regarding the above styled matter against the City of Jackson, Mississippi.

The lawsuit was originally filed on August 14, 2015, and amended on October 14, 2016, in Chancery Court, against the City of Jackson, Mississippi. The Complaint alleged the following causes of action: breach of contract, civil conspiracy and a violation of City Ordinance. Plaintiffs' allege that the City conspired with Capital Hotel Associates, Butler's Locksmith, and David Waddell to breach the contract between Plaintiffs and Butler's Locksmith by denying Plaintiffs the right of first refusal. Plaintiffs further allege that the City violated a City Ordinance when the City closed a portion of Congress Street, during the construction of the Westin Hotel, without giving notice to Plaintiffs of the potential closure and not compensating Plaintiffs for any damages caused.

The Office of the City Attorney (OCA) has been successful in negotiations and the Plaintiffs are willing to accept the following as full and final settlement of all claims against the City of Jackson: the grant of the use of two metered parking spaces and two parking spaces created by Ferrell once he closes in one of his driveways to his parking lot. All four parking spaces will be located on Congress Street and the grant of the spaces will run for five years. At the August 4, 2020 Council meeting, Council agreed to settle this matter under the following conditions: (1) the City would not be responsible for the enforcement of said parking spaces; (2) Mr. Ferrell would indemnify the City regarding any disputes surrounding the enforcement of said parking spaces; (3) the grant of the parking spaces is non-transferable; and (4) the grant of the parking spaces is non-renewable.

Plaintiffs would not agree to the indemnification provision. As result, the matter did not settle. Capital Hotel Association, one of the defendants named herein, settled with Plaintiffs and filed a Motion to Dismiss them from the lawsuit. On February 9, 2021, the Court held a status conference. During the status conference, the Judge urged all of the parties to settle so that the lawsuit could be dismissed as to all parties. To assist in the settlement of this matter, the Judge ordered the City to remove the indemnification provision and, to assist Plaintiffs in enforcing the parking spaces, the Court suggested that the City write a letter giving Plaintiffs the right of possession of the parking spaces. Because the OCA was unable to settle this matter under the terms originally dictated by this Council, we now seek approval to settle this matter without requiring Plaintiffs indemnify the City and, provide Plaintiffs documentation granting them a right of possession of the parking spaces. The documentation would be attached as an exhibit to the Order of Dismissal. However, with the exception of the indemnification provision, all other conditions as dictated by the Council, will remain.

The approval to settle this matter, in accordance with the revised conditions as outlined above, is now being requested.

The OCA recommends that the governing authorities approve a final settlement in this cause.

ORDER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, AND HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO PROVIDE FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000.00) TO HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO ENGAGE DEPUTIES OF THE SHERIFF OF HINDS COUNTY TO ASSIST WITH PUBLIC SAFETY ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI.

WHEREAS, during the City Council meeting on October 13, 2020, the City of Jackson, by resolution (Item #65), declared a crisis of violence within the City of Jackson; and

WHEREAS, by way of the afore-mentioned resolution (Item #65) and another resolution, Item #66, passed during that same meeting, the City recognizes the fact that the Jackson Police Department (JPD)is presently understaffed and in need of tangible assistance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the afore-mentioned resolutions passed on October 13, 2020, and in consideration of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Jackson, the City should enter into an interlocal cooperative agreement with Hinds County, Mississippi to engage Deputies of the Sheriff of Hinds County, Mississippi to assist with public safety activities within the City of Jackson, Mississippi.; and

WHEREAS, under the proposed interlocal agreement the City of Jackson would provide \$500,000 to Hinds County to hire additional deputies to assist with public safety within the City of Jackson, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the proposed interlocal cooperative agreement would continue from the effective date as until such time as the crisis has been abated, the funds have been expended, and activities contemplated by the interlocal agreement have been completed.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1974 and other applicable law, the Mayor is authorized to execute an interlocal agreement between the City of Jackson, Mississippi and the Hinds County to provide \$500,000 to Hinds County to hire additional deputies to assist with public safety within the City of Jackson, Mississippi.
