PROCLAMATION HONORING NATIONAL NURSES WEEK MAY 6 – MAY 12, 2021

WHEREAS, each May, nurses are honored with a weeklong national celebration. Nurses Week honors nurses for the dedication, care, and skill they demonstrate every day; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, President Ronald Reagan signed a proclamation on March 25, proclaiming "National Recognition Day for Nurses" to be May 6, 1982. The American Nurses Association Board of Directors expanded the recognition of nurses to a week-long celebration, declaring May 6-12, 1991 as National Nurses Week; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, Nurses Week has taken on an even greater significance as it recognizes the extraordinary work nurses all over the world have done in combatting the Covid-19 Pandemic; and
