WHEREAS, the distinction between Human Resource and Personnel Management is Personnel Management focuses on the maintenance of all personnel and administrative systems while Human Resource focuses on a strategic approach by forecasting the organization's needs and continuously monitoring and adjusting all systems and processes; and

WHEREAS, another distinction is Personnel Management primarily focuses on ordinary activities, such as employee hiring, compensation, training, and harmony, while Human Resources considers employees as assets, which are to be valued, used and preserved; and

WHEREAS, the best interest of the City of Jackson would be served by renaming the Department of Personnel Management and redefining its function;

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the Department of Personnel Management be renamed the *Human Resources Department*, and the functions of department assigned as follows: The Human Resources Department shall perform all human resource management functions including the administration of benefits;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that SECTION 2-336 (6) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, is hereby amended to read as follows: Human Resources. The Human Resources Department shall perform all human resource management functions including the administration of benefits;

WHEREAS, the Jackson Fire Department requested that the Department of Personnel Management conduct a *salary survey* on mechanic and fleet maintenance manager classifications that are more tailored to the Fire Garage division positions and its job duties;

WHEREAS, the current positions, in the fire garage division, are Heavy Equipment Mechanic I, Heavy Equipment Mechanic II and Fleet Maintenance Manager. Those position job duties' are not specific to the Fire Garage division;

WHEREAS, inquiries, for mechanic and fleet maintenance manager classifications that are specific to the Fire Department, were submitted to the following Southeastern cities: Savannah, Georgia;; Frisco, Texas; and Plano, Texas;

WHEREAS, the response from the Cities surveyed were that Emergency Vehicle Technician I, Emergency Vehicle Technician II and Emergency Vehicle Technician Manager are more tailored to the job duties performed in the City of Jackson Fire Department Fire Garage division:

WHEREAS, the response from the Cities surveyed concerning the median salary paid for the position equivalent of the Emergency Vehicle Technician I was within the range of \$45,488.00-\$70,552.00; Emergency Vehicle Technician II was within the range of \$49,833.69-\$72,245.34 Emergency Vehicle Technician Manager was within the range of \$60,432.06 - \$87,626.50;

WHEREAS, the best interest of the City of Jackson would be served by adding the following positions to the current pay plan: Emergency Vehicle Technician I, Emergency Vehicle Technician II and Emergency Vehicle Technician Manager classifications at a salary comparable to the compensation paid by other Southeastern cities such as those cited;



Purpose: This survey was conducted to review the organization, salary and duties of the Heavy Equipment Mechanic I; Heavy Equipment Mechanic II and Fleet Manager make recommendations necessary for an efficient and effective operation.

Findings: Heavy Equipment Mechanic I: Presently, the classification of Heavy Equipment Mechanic I is a pay range 15, with a minimum salary of \$24,798.24. A survey of the Southeastern Cities indicated that the classification is currently below the median pay range of \$45,488.00-\$70,552.00. The recommended job class, that aligns with the job duties of the employees in the Fire Garage Division, is Emergency Vehicle Technician I (Job description is attached). Therefore, the recommended pay range is 22, which is a pay range of \$34,018.08-\$40,978.08.

In an effort for the City to recruit the experience needed and compete with other jurisdictions, we are requesting that job class Emergency Vehicle Technician I be added to the City of Jackson Pay Plan at 22 pay range to be changed in accordance to what the survey revealed.

Findings: Heavy Equipment Mechanic II: Presently, the classification of Heavy Equipment Mechanic II is a pay range 17, with a minimum salary of \$27,662.04. A survey of the Southeastern Cities indicated that the classification is currently below the median pay range of \$49,833.69. -\$72,245.34. The recommended job class, that aligns with the job duties of the employees in the Fire Garage Division, is Emergency Vehicle Technician II (Job description is attached). Therefore, the recommended pay range is 25, which is a pay range of \$39,041.28-\$47,097.12.

ORDER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AMENDED STADIUM LEAST AND MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPLAND KUSCHE SPORTS GROUP D/B/A OVERTIME SPORTS FOR THE SMITH WILLS STADIUM.

WHEREAS, on April 30, 2019, the governing authorities of the City of Jackson, Mississippi ("City of Jackson"), authorized the Mayor to execute a Stadium Lease and Management Agreement with Kusche Sports Group d/b/a Overtime Sports ("KSG") for professional management services of Smith Wills Stadium, located at 1200 Lakeland Drive, Jackson, Mississippi 39216; and

WHEREAS, the term of the agreement was for ten (10) years, with an option of two additional terms of ten (10) years, at a base rent of One Hundred and Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) per year or twenty percent (20%) of all gross marketing revenue generated at Smith Wills Stadium up to and not to exceed Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) per year beginning on October 1, 2020, with successive payment made annually on October 1; and

WHEREAS, the Covid-19 pandemic aggressively spread globally in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Covid-19 pandemic significantly affected the State of Mississippi, specifically the City of Jackson, which resulted in a complete shutdown; and

WHEREAS, said shutdown specifically affected Smith Wills Stadium that resulted in the inability of KSG to operate and generate revenue in order to fulfill its financial obligations to the city of Jackson; and

WHEREAS, as a result of KSG's inability to operate Smith Wills Stadium and generate revenue, the Administration entered into additional negotiations with KSG to amend the Stadium Lease and Management Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the negotiations between the parties resulted in a proposed amendment to allow KSG to defer the first payment of \$125,000.00 that was due on October 1, 2020 to be paid in 5 equal payments of \$25,000.00 over the years 2021 – 2025; and

WHEREAS, KSG will continue to make its payments as due on October 1 of each year of \$125,000.00 beginning in October of 2021.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Mayor is authorized to execute an Amended Stadium Lease and Management Agreement between the City of Jackson, Mississippi and Kusche Sports Group d/b/a Overtime Sports to allow KSG to defer the first payment of \$125,000.00 that was due on October 1, 2020 to be paid in 5 equal payments of \$25,000.00 over the years 2021 – 2025, as a result of the inability of KSG to operate and generate revenue in order to fulfill its financial obligations due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Memorandum of Understanding

Concerning the Establishment of the

Mississippi Analysis and Information Center (MSAIC)

Between the Undersigned Agencies

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU), made and entered into between the undersigned agencies, sets forth guidelines regarding the establishment of the Mississippi Analysis and Information Center (MSAIC), also known as the Fusion Center, and the Jackson Police Department, effective upon receipt of all signatures.

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1. Provide a framework and working mechanism for the organization of the Fusion Center to address issues that are common to participating agencies and to assure the success of the partnership through the achievement of coordination and cooperation.
- 1.2. Define the working relationships of the parties to the MOU.
- 1.3. Outline the intent of the parties regarding the implementation, operation, and administration of the Fusion Center.
- 1.4. The participating agencies shall be those that sign the original MOU and any others that join the MOU upon approval of the Board of Directors.
- 1.5. Any party may withdraw from this MOU 30 days after delivery of written notice of withdrawal to the other MOU parties or as may be stipulated in any written agreement executed under these terms and conditions.

2. OBJECTIVE

2.1. Since 9/11, efforts have been made to prevent or mitigate future terrorist acts through the development of new strategies and programs designed to strengthen domestic security. Many of these strategies focus on improving communication and coordination among local, state, tribal, and federal agencies. One step is the development of ways to combine relevant information from disparate databases, in order to maximize the usefulness of available information.

- 2.2. Despite significant progress in information sharing among law enforcement, much remains to be accomplished. For state and local law enforcement agencies to be true partners in homeland defense, improvements must be made in communication and information sharing among local, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement agencies. The establishment of a Fusion Center to combine the intelligence efforts of all participating agencies will greatly enhance the ability of law enforcement to predict, prevent, and respond to unlawful activity and terrorist threats to our community.
- 2.3 This agreement reflects a collaborative effort between the MSAIC Fusion Center and the Jackson Police Department to share strategic, operational, and tactical homeland security, terrorism and criminal information and intelligence.

3. ORGANIZATION AND MANAGEMENT

- 3.1. Oversite for the Fusion Center will be maintained by a Board of Directors whose membership will include command-level members from agencies participating in the mission of the center. Each member will have an equal vote on matters before the board. This group will serve in an advisory capacity to the Commissioner of Public Safety.
 - 3.1.1. The Board of Directors will adopt a set of Bylaws to govern the conduct of the board.
 - 3.1.2. The Commissioner of Public Safety will appoint a director for the Fusion Center who shall have day-to-day command authority over members assigned to the Fusion Center. All assigned personnel from any participating agency are subject to the supervision of the chain-of-command in place at the Fusion Center.
 - 3.1.3. The Board of Directors will provide bi-annual reports on the activities of the Center to the agency head of each participating agency in June and December of each year.
 - The Board of Directors may recommend additional participating agencies to the Commissioner of Public Safety.
 - 3.1.5. The Board of Directors may appoint committees, working groups, and other entities to assist in the management and development of the Center.

4. DISTRIBUTION OF WORK

4.1. Each participating agency agrees to provide at least one member to be physically assigned to the Center, on a full or part-time basis, to assist in the work, purpose and functions of the Center.

- 4.1.1. Additional partnering agency members may be assigned as determined by the Commissioner of Public Safety based on workload and the needs of the Center.
- 4.1.2. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall have final approval authority over the qualifications of individuals to work at the Center.
- 4.2. Participating agencies agree to conduct investigative follow-up to leads developed by the Center and forwarded to the agency.

5. FINANCIAL

- 5.1. Participating law enforcement agency employees will conduct designated functions at their agency's expense, including salaries, benefits, and local transportation.
- 5.2. Any expenses associated with agency partners assigned to the Fusion Center for training at the request of the Fusion Center may be paid by the Center contingent upon the availability of such funding and applicable guidelines and regulations for federal grant expenditures.

6. SECURITY

- 6.1. The Director of the Center shall be responsible for establishing appropriate security measures to ensure the integrity of the operations of the Center.
 - 6.1.1. The Director shall report on security measures at each meeting of the Board of Directors.
 - 6.1.2. Any breach of security shall immediately be reported to the members of the Board of Directors and the Commissioner of Public Safety.
- 6.2. Each participating agency shall be responsible for ensuring appropriate background checks have been completed on each agency member assigned to the Center and each agency member who is authorized to receive information from the Center.
- 6.3. The Director, as identified in section 3.1.2, shall have the discretionary authority to deny the assignment of an individual to the center and/or deny access to any information or the facility itself.
- 6.4. The Center shall utilize the "Third Agency Rule" and thereby not disclose an agency's information without the approval of that agency

7. PRIVACY

- 7.1. In addition to other policies promulgated, the Board of Directors shall establish a Privacy Policy to ensure the rights of innocent citizens are not abridged by the operations of the Center, and each participating agency shall agree to abide by it.
- 7.2. The Center shall adhere to the rules of intelligence sharing as are articulated in Section 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations Part 23.

8. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 8.1. Any disputes that may arise between the participating agencies concerning the operations of the Center shall be referred to the Board of Directors, then the Director of Homeland Security and then the Commissioner of Public Safety for final resolution.
- 8.2. This Memorandum of Understanding is not a legally binding agreement and May not be referred to an arbitrator or be the subject of any legal proceeding.

9. AMENDMENTS

- 9.1. Proposed amendments to this MOU shall be presented in writing to the Director of the Fusion Center and reviewed by MDPS Legal Department. Any disputes regarding the resolution of a proposed amendment shall be resolved by a majority vote from the Board of Directors and approval by the Commissioner of Public Safety.
- 9.2. Acceptance of additional participating agencies shall be considered an amendment

10. DURATION AND TERMINATION

- 10.1. This MOU shall remain in effect until such time as either party withdraws from the MOU.
- 10.2. Any participating agency may withdraw from this MOU by providing a 30-day written notice to the Fusion Center.

In Furtherance of their respective goals, objectives, and missions, the parties jointly agree to abide by the provisions of this MOU, as evidenced by the affixed representative signatures.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this MOU to be duly executed.

This agreement is made this <u>1st</u> day of <u>October</u> 2021, between the United States

Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (hereinafter "DEA"), and
the <u>Jackson Police Department ORI# MS0250100</u> (hereinafter "<u>JPD</u>"). The DEA is authorized
to enter into this cooperative agreement concerning the use and abuse of controlled
substances under the provisions of 21 U.S.C. § 873.

Whereas there is evidence that trafficking in narcotics and dangerous drugs exists in the Jackson area and that such illegal activity has a substantial and detrimental effect on the health and general welfare of the people of Mississippi , the parties hereto agree to the following:

- 1. The Jackson HIDTA Task Forcewill perform the activities and duties described below:
- a. disrupt the illicit drug traffic in the Jackson area by immobilizing targeted violators and trafficking organizations;
- b. gather and report intelligence data relating to trafficking in narcotics and dangerous drugs; and
- c. conduct undercover operations where appropriate and engage in other traditional methods of investigation in order that the task force's activities will result in effective prosecution before the courts of the United States and the State of Mississippi.
- 2. To accomplish the objectives of the Jackson HIDTA Task Force, the JPD agrees to detail one (1) experienced officer(s) to the Jackson HIDTA Task Force for a period of not less than two years. During this period of assignment, the JPD officers will be under the direct supervision and control of DEA supervisory personnel assigned to the task force.
- 3. The <code>jpd</code> officers assigned to the task force shall adhere to all DEA policies and procedures. Failure to adhere to DEA policies and procedures shall be grounds for dismissal from the task force.
- 4. The JPD officers assigned to the task force shall be deputized as task force officers of DEA pursuant to 21 USC 878.

5. To accomplish the objectives of the Jackson HIDTA Task Force, DEA will assign two (2) Special Agents to the task force. HIDTA will also, subject to the availability of annually appropriated funds or any continuing resolution thereof, provide necessary funds and equipment to support the activities of the DEA Special Agents and JPD officers assigned to the task force. This support will include: office space, office supplies travel funds, funds for the purchase of evidence and information, investigative equipment, training and other support items.

- 6. During the period of assignment to the Jackson HIDTA Task Force, the JPD will remain responsible for establishing the salaries and benefits, including overtime, of the officers assigned to the Task force and for making all payments due them. HIDTA will, subject to availability of funds, reimburse the JPD for the equivalent of 25% of a GS-12, Step 1, of the general pay scale for the Rest of United States. Reimbursement for all types of qualified expenses shall be contingent upon availability of funds and the submission of a proper request for reimbursement which shall be submitted monthly or quarterly on a fiscal year basis, and which provides the names of the investigators who incurred overtime for DEA during the invoiced period, the number of overtime hours incurred, the hourly regular and overtime rates in effect for each investigator, and the total cost for the invoiced period. Invoices must be submitted at least quarterly within 10 business days of the end of the invoiced period. Note: Task Force Officer's overtime "shall not include any costs for benefits, such as retirement, FICA, and other expenses.
- 7. In no event will the JPD charge any indirect cost rate to DEA for the administration or Implementation of this agreement.
- 8. The **JPD** shall maintain on a current basis complete and accurate records and accounts of all obligations and expenditures of funds under this agreement in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and instructions provided by DEA to facilitate on-site inspection and auditing of such records and accounts.
- 9. The JPD shall permit and have readily available for examination and auditing by DEA, the United States Department of Justice, the Comptroller General of the United States, and any of their duly authorized agents and representatives, any and all records, documents, accounts, invoices, receipts or expenditures relating to this agreement. The JPD shall maintain all such reports and records until all litigation, claim, audits and examinations are completed and resolved, or for a period of six(6) years after termination of this agreement, whichever is later.
- 10. The JPD shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, and all requirements imposed by or pursuant to the regulations of the United States Department of Justice implementing those laws, 28 C.F.R. Part 42, Subparts C, F, G, H and I.

- 11. The **JPD** agrees that an authorized officer or employee will execute and return to DEA the attached OJP Form 4061/6, Certification Regarding Lobbying; Debarment, suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; and drug-Free Workplace Requirements. The **JPD** acknowledges that this agreement will not take effect and no federal funds will be awarded until the completed certification is received.
- 12. When issuing statements, press releases requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or part with federal money, the JPD shall clearly state: (1) percentage of the total cost of the program or project which will be financed with federal money and (2) the dollar amount of federal funds for the program or project.
- 13. While on duty and acting on task force business, the officers assigned to the HIDTA task force shall be subject to all DEA and federal government rules, regulations and procedures governing the use of OGV's for home to work transportation and for personal business. The HIDTA Executive Committee acknowledges that the United States is liable for the actions of task force officer, while on duty and acting within the scope of their federal employment, to the extent permitted by the Federal Torts Claim Act.
- 14. The term of this agreement shall be effective from the date in paragraph number one until September 30, 2022. This agreement may be terminated by either party on 30 days advance written notice. Billing for all outstanding obligations must be received by DEA within 90 days of the date of termination of this agreement. HIDTA will be responsible only for obligations incurred by JPD during the term of this agreement.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

AND

CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI

In re: Public Infrastructure Projects 2021-04

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into on the dates shown at the end of this document by and between HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI (the "County"), a body politic and political subdivision of the State of Mississippi and the CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI (the "City"), a municipal corporation, pursuant to and in accordance with the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1974, Section 17-13-1, et seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), and other applicable law.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County and the City believe it is in their best interest to improve and maintain the public infrastructure within the City which is also within the boundaries of the County.

IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual benefits described herein, the parties agree as follows:

I. PURPOSE AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. AGREEMENT. This Agreement is entered into pursuant to and in accordance with the authorization of the Act found at Section 17-13-1 et seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as it now appears or is hereafter amended, and all provisions set forth in the Act are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth in words and figures, it being the intent of the parties to

this Agreement that such authority as is granted by the Act shall be exercisable by the parties to enable them to accomplish the scope of work in Subsection B. Scope, Participation and Financing.

B. SCOPE, PARTICIPATION AND FINANCING. The nature and scope of the project(s) contemplated by this Agreement is paving the following roads, streets and any associated bridges in the City and County to provide benefit to all citizens:

Approved by the Hinds County Board of Supervisors on July 19, 2021

District 3

1. Resurface the intersection of Industrial Drive and Country Club Drive at an amount not to exceed \$59,857.30, to be paid from Series 2017 Bonds

Public infrastructure improvements supported by this project may include, but not necessarily be limited to, purchase of equipment, sidewalks, paving and striping of roadways, rehabilitation of curbs and gutters, and landscaping of rights-of-way on those streets and roads where the County will undertake the work. The County shall be responsible for all construction costs and materials, milling if necessary, manhole cover riser rings, water valve cover riser rings, and center line and edge line striping as deemed necessary by its Department of Public Works. The County shall also recut the loop or install alternative detection at existing traffic signals.

All labor will be completed by, and under the direction and supervision of, the County or its designees. At its discretion, the County may select an outside/contract vendor and provide project management services.

This Agreement provides that the County will provide funding not to exceed the abovereferenced estimated amounts from the Series 2017 Bond Funds or other applicable sources to fund and complete this project. The City will provide ongoing maintenance for the abovereferenced roads after the completion of the project.

- C. AUTHORITY. The specific authority under which the County and the City may exercise the powers necessary to fulfill the terms of this Agreement is found, respectively, in Article 6, Section 170, Mississippi Constitution of 1890 and Sections 17-13-1, et. seq., 19-3-41, and 21-37-3 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.
- D. PUBLIC BENEFIT. It is acknowledged that each of the parties has formally considered this matter and has determined that it is in the public interest that they participate and cooperate in this project, and that substantial benefits are anticipated to inure to citizens of the County and the City by virtue of the project.
- E. SIGNAGE. The parties agree that either the County or the City, to the extent either contributes funding, may install signage at the location specified in Subsection B. Scope, recognizing it as the sponsor for the work performed under this Agreement. Location and specifications for the respective signage, if any, shall be left to the discretion of the County and the City.

II. AMENDMENTS OR TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this agreement without recourse, upon sixty (60) calendar days' written notice to the other party, with such action taken by resolution in the same procedural manner as required in the instance of the adoption of this Agreement.

III. ADMINISTRATION

The County Administrator and the City Chief Administrative Officer shall serve as the project administrators responsible for ensuring that there is full compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

IV. <u>DURATION</u>

This Agreement shall be in full force and effect from the effective date as explained in Section V. Enforceability, below and shall continue in effect until such time as the parties acknowledge, through the project administrators described in Section III, that the activities contemplated by this Agreement are complete.

V. ENFORCEABILITY

- A. APPROVAL. The parties understand that, as a condition precedent to this Agreement being enforceable, this Agreement shall be submitted to the Attorney General of the State of Mississippi for approval and that this Agreement shall not be enforced unless:
 - 1. Approved by the Attorney General, or until,
- 2. Sixty (60) days has passed since its submission and the Attorney General has failed to disapprove same, in which event the Agreement shall be considered approved and enforceable.

Upon the City's return of the executed Agreement, the Office of the Hinds County Board Attorney will submit the Agreement to the Attorney General.

- B. FILING. Upon approval by the Attorney General, or the passage of sixty (60) days after submission without disapproval, copies of this Agreement shall be filed with the Chancery Clerk of Hinds County and the Mississippi Secretary of State. In accordance with the terms of the Act, the Agreement will not be deemed in force until proof of filing of the Agreement has been received from the Chancery Clerk of Hinds County and the Mississippi Secretary of State. The Office of the Hinds County Board Attorney shall be responsible for filing the Agreement and for notifying the project administrators that the Agreement is properly in force. A copy of the Agreement will also be forwarded to the Clerk of the City for recordkeeping purposes.
 - C. PARTIAL ENFORCEABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement or any

portion thereof is determined to be unenforceable or invalid by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, which determination is not appealed or appealable, for any reason whatsoever, such unenforceability or invalidity shall not invalidate the entire Agreement, but the Agreement shall be construed as if it did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced accordingly.

D. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous arrangements or understandings with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
