WHEREAS, Mr. Andre Lamont Jones was a citizen of the City of Jackson; He was born on May 14, 1974 and departed on August 22, 1992; and

WHEREAS, Andre graduated from Clinton High School in May of 1992 and was scheduled to attend Alcorn University to major in Engineering on August 24, 1992; and

WHEREAS, Andre was found hanging by his shoelace in Simpson County jail on August 22, 1992, and his death gained national media attention, as a catalyst for conversation surrounding the uptick in the number of jailhouse suicides among blacks in the south and civil rights concerns; and

# ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI CREATING CIVIL PENALITIES FOR PROPERTY OWNERS WHO LEASE/USE THEIR PROPERTY CONTRARY TO ZONING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON

Section 1. WHEREAS, the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Jackson shall be considered by this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, property owners shall be required to observe and adhere to zoning ordinances in the City of Jackson in the use or lease of their property; and

WHEREAS, neighborhoods in the City of Jackson are being inundated with property owners using or leasing their property contrary to zoning ordinances creating havoc in residential communities and destroying the quiet enjoyment of families in their own homes; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Jackson that an Ordinance requiring the property owners to adhere to zoning ordinances of the City of Jackson in the use or lease of their property or face civil penalties.

### Section 2. PROCEDURE/PENALTY

- 1. Each property owner shall comply with the zoning ordinances requirements of the City of Jackson in the use or lease of their property.
- 2. Penalties for violations of this Ordinance shall be:
  - a. By a fine of up to One Thousand Dollars and/or;
  - b. If repeated violations occur, the property in question shall be subject to a civil process of interruption of ownership of the property by said property owner with due process.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi hereby creates civil penalties for property owners who lease and/or use their property contrary to zoning ordinances of the City of Jackson.

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI AMENDING SEC. 102-31 OF THE SIGN ORDINANCE ADDING THE EXEMPTION OF DEFINED CHURCH (PLACE OF WORSHIP) WITH EXISTING GROUND SIGN STRUCTURE.

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of the City of Jackson to exempt Churches with an existing ground sign from applying for a permit or variance to change the face of the sign.

WHEARAS, the City Council of Jackson, Mississippi recognizes that existing churches may change institutions either through Lease, purchase or acquisition. In addition the City Council understands that an institution defined as a church (place of worship) has the right and authority without a sign permit or variance to change the face of existing ground sign to represent the name of the place of worship.

WHEREAS, a church (place of worship) is defined as a facility used to hold religious services, meetings, and similar activities. The term church shall not carry a secular connotation and shall include buildings in which the religious services of any denomination are held. The term church does not apply to detached accessory uses or church related uses such as schools, residences, coffee houses, day care centers, bingo parlors, and fellowship halls.

WHEREAS, this ordinance does not apply to store front or newly built churches (places of worship). This ordinance only applies to existing churches where there is already a defined existing ground sign.

**BE IT HEREBY ORDERED** that the city council amends Sec. 102-31 of the sign ordinance adding the following:

(25) Church (Place Of Worship) with an existing ground sign.

**IT IS FINANLY ORDERED** that the preceding amendment of the referenced Ordinance of the City of Jackson, Mississippi shall be published and effective immediately upon passage.

### ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-168 OF THE JACKSON CODE OF ORDINANCES - CITY EMPLOYEE WAGE REQUIREMENTS. (ALL WARDS)

WHEREAS, the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Jackson shall be considered by this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the adjustment in minimum wage for the employees of the City of Jackson is timely; and

WHEREAS, the adjustment of the minimum wage in the City of Jackson to Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per hour will make the City of Jackson's pay structure in line with the minimum wage of many employers.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-168 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances is amended as follows:

Unless contrary to federal, state or local law:

- (1) Effective October 1, 2020, minimum hourly wage for city employees, excluding participants of the 2015 Mayor's Summer Youth Employment Program, shall be \$15.00.
- (2)—An-annual incremental hourly wage increase of \$0.95-shall-be-made for two consecutive years and shall be made effective at the beginning of each fiscal year as follows:
- be \$9.70.
- b. Beginning October 1, 2016, the minimum hourly wage-for-city-employees shall be \$10.65.
- (3) Each city employee shall certify to the city personnel department that the employee will be compensated at a rate of pay not less than the minimum hourly wage in effect, as set forth by this section.
- SECTION 2. Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this Article be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Article as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as a whole.
- SECTION 3. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage, and upon publication in accordance with Section 21-13-11 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972), as amended.

Their Son I.S. Sanders Jr. has been one of music icon Stevie Wonder's tour musicians for several years; and

WHEREAS, Thelma Sanders was one of the first African American women business owners in Jackson, MS. She opened a clothing boutique located on the historic Farish St. in the early 1950s that she operated for over 30 years because African American women were not allowed to try on clothes at the major retailer store; and

WHEREAS, Thelma Sanders was a pioneer true Civil Rights icon. She hosted many notable Civil Rights leaders in her home for meals and planning sessions including Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Dr. Ralph Abernathy, Medgar Evers, and Urban League Director Whitney Young, just to name a few. As a result, her home was bombed in 1964; and

WHEREAS, Thelma Sanders owned a make-up line designed specifically for African American women called New You Products. She was also responsible for bringing the Ebony Fashion Show to Jackson, MS for 30 plus years and proudly served on the Tougaloo College Board.
