WHEREAS, Section 21-19-11 of the Mississippi Code as amended sets forth the procedure for mailing and posting notice of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, hearings were held on June 6, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the hearing officer determined that notice was provided in accordance with Section 21-19-11 prior to the hearings; and

WHEREAS, after hearing testimony and reviewing evidence, the hearing officer made findings and recommendations for adjudication concerning certain parcels as follows:

 Case #23-954: Parcel #613-50 located at 121 Savanna St.: No appearance by owner or an interested party. Hearing officer recommends that the property be adjudicated as a menace to public health, safety, and welfare with assessment of actual costs and a penalty of \$500.00. Ward 7

Scope of Work: Demolish and remove remains of dilapidated structure, trash, debris, foundation, steps, driveway, tires, and any other items to insure property is clear and free of any and all health hazards.

 Case #23-285: Parcel #214-72 located at 260 Marla Ave.: No appearance by owner or an interested party. Hearing officer recommends that the property be adjudicated as a menace to public health, safety, and welfare with assessment of actual costs and a penalty of \$750.00. Ward 5

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson previously contracted with Cooke Douglass Farr Lemons ("CDFL") to produce a scope of work for Thalia Mara Hall; and

WHEREAS, the City contracted Canizaro Cawthon Davis, A Professional Association to produce a scope of work for the Arts Center of Mississippi, which scope is to include an update to the existing public restrooms to bring them into compliance with the ADA due to performance issues with Construction Specialists, LLC, which recently caused the City to terminate that construction agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City authorized a contract with Benchmark Construction Corporation, whose principal office address is 1867 Crane Ridge Drive #200A, Jackson, MS 39216, to provide general contractor services to assist the City of Jackson with completing the proposed scope of work for Thalia Mara Hall by June 1, 2023; and

MAYORAL PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERENCY CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS. Section 33-15-17 (d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, authorizes the Mayor of a municipality to proclaim the existence of a local emergency as defined in Section 33-15-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Section 33-15-5 (h) defines an emergency as "any occurrence, or threat thereof, whether natural, technological, or man-made, in war or in peace, which results or may result in substantial injury or harm to the population or substantial damage to loss or property:" and

WHEREAS, Section 33-15-5 (g) defines a local emergency as "the duly proclaimed existence of conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the territorial limits of a county and/or municipality caused by such conditions as air or water pollution. fire, flood, storm, epidemic, earthquake, hurricane, resource shortages or other natural or man-made conditions, which conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the political subdivision and require the combined forces of other subdivisions or of the state to combat.;" and

WHEREAS, during the early morning hours of June 16, 2023. a band of severe thunderstorms generating straight-line winds of up to 80 miles per hour passed through the City downing trees, knocking out power to portions of the City, and causing damage to structures throughout the City, including City facilities such as traffic signals and the Public Safety Communications and Information Building: and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson will need additional assistance beyond its City personnel to assist in the removal of trees, the repair of traffic signals in a timely manner, and to make repairs to damage City facilities: and

WHEREAS. pursuant to Section 33-15-17 (b), the City "is authorized to exercise the powers vested under this section in the light of the exigencies of the extreme emergency situation without regard to time-consuming procedures and formalities prescribed by law pertaining to the performance of public work, entering into contracts, the incurring of obligations, the employment of temporary workers, the rental of equipment, the purchase of supplies and materials, the levying of taxes and the appropriation and expenditure of public funds,"

NOW, THEREFORE, I. Chokwe Antar Lumumba, Mayor of the City of Jackson. Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 33-15-17 (d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and in the public interest and for the general welfare of the City of Jackson, do hereby declare a **local emergency** for the City of Jackson. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Proclamation shall be (1) promptly filed with the City Clerk: (2) distributed to the news media and other organizations calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public; and (3) distributed to others as necessary to ensure proper implementation of this Proclamation of Local Emergency.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that this Proclamation of Local Emergency is effective immediately, until such time as the next regular meeting of the City Council or a special meeting legally called to review and approve or disapprove the need for continuing this local emergency.





WHEREAS, the NFPA Firefighter 1001 I-II course may be taken on the campus of the Mississippi State Fire Academy of through a field delivery program; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson Fire Department has candidates which it recommends for participation in the Mississippi State Fire Academy through a field delivery program; and

WHEREAS, the field delivery program began August 7, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi State Fire Academy has provided the Jackson Fire Department with a Memorandum of Understanding related to the candidates it is recommending for participation in the field delivery program with provisions as follows:

- (1) The location of the field delivery program will be the Jackson Fire Department Training Facility; and
- (2) The Mississippi State Fire Academy will furnish to the course coordinator for the City of Jackson Fire Department the Fire Fighter NFPA 1001 I-II Field Course and a complete package to manage delivery of the course; and
- (3) Books will not be included in the materials furnished to the City of Jackson Fire Department: and
- (4) The City of Jackson Fire Department is responsible for purchasing any required books from the textbook publisher; and
- (5) All documents and curriculum furnished to the City of Jackson Fire Department shall constitute property of the Mississippi State Fire Academy and may not be duplicated or used outside of the subject delivery; and
- (6) The Mississippi State Fire Academy will approve and administer all written and skill examinations; and
- (7) Certificates will be issued upon the successful completion of the course; and
- (8) The minimum number of candidates is ten (10) and the maximum number of candidates for the field delivery course is seventeen (17); and
- (9) The total cost of the service fee is eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$8,500.00) which is Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per candidate multiplied by (17) candidates which is being funded from account number 001.441.20.6419; and
- (10) The Mississippi State Fire Academy will invoice the City of Jackson Fire Department upon completion of the course and payment will become due within thirty (30) days of receipt of the invoice; and

WHEREAS, the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare will be served by authorizing the Mayor to ratify and execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Mississippi State Fire Academy and authorize payment of the applicable service fee upon completion of the NFPA 1001 I-II course.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE II, DIVISION 4 OF THE JACKSON CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, Section 21-8-13 of the Miss. Code Ann. specifically authorizes the City Council to "...appoint a clerk of the council and deputy clerks, as necessary, who shall compile the minutes and records of its proceedings, its ordinances and resolutions as this chapter requires, and perform such duties as may be required by law...."; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson ("City"), by ordinance, delineated the number of chief deputy clerks of council and deputy clerks of council, as well as the duties to be performed by the same in Chapter 2, Article II, Division 4 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson City Council finds it in the best interest of the City to amend Section 2-135 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances to increase the number of Chief Deputy Clerks of Council from one (1) to three (3); three (3) to (7) (4 Chief Deputy Clerks shall have the function of Chief Auditor Clerks of Council); and

WHEREAS, the Jackson City Council finds that Section 2-135 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances should be amended as follows:

Sec. 2-135. - Deputy Clerks of the Council.

Three-Seven chief deputy clerks of the council and seven or more deputy clerks of the council may be employed and assigned to provide clerical support and to perform such other duties as required by councilmembers. These clerks shall be appointed in the same manner as the clerk of the council.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, THAT Section 2-135 of the Jackson Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-135. - Deputy Clerks of the Council.

Seven Chief Deputy Clerks of the Council and seven or more Deputy Clerks of the Council may be employed and assigned to provide clerical support and to perform such other duties as required by council members. These clerks shall be appointed in the same manner as the Clerk of Council.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage and publication thereof.

State of Mississippi Opinion No. 2003-0078 February 21, 2003

Re: Payment of Registration and Membership Dues, Travel Expenses and Subscriptions for Appointed Members of Municipal Boards and Commissions

Dear Mr. Myers:

Attorney General Mike Moore has received your request for an official opinion and has assigned it to me for research and response. Your letter reads as follows:

The City of Hattiesburg operates under the Mayor-Council form of government. MS Code Ann. Section 21-8-23 states in part (5) that "[w]henever the city council is authorized by any provision of general law to appoint the members of any board, authority or commission, such power of appointment shall be deemed to vest in the mayor with the confirmation of an affirmative vote of a majority of the council present and voting at any meeting." It is understood that the members of these boards or commissions are serving as volunteers and without compensation.

Various seminars, conferences, workshops and other educational programs are held from time to time that contain information that would greatly benefit the City by the attendance of these appointed board or commission members. The City could also benefit by these board of commission members becoming members of certain organizations (such as planning commission members being members of the American Planning Association), and by obtaining subscriptions to various publications regarding the board or commission on which they serve.

You then request an opinion on several questions, which will be answered in the order in which presented.

1. Can the City pay a registration fee for an appointed board or commission member to attend a seminar, conference or workshop which provides information pertinent to the board or commission on which they serve?

As we have recently opined to Alderman "Red" Bailey, a municipality may pay professional association dues for elected and appointed individuals, if certain criteria are met. Those criteria are as follows:

a. The public entity must determine that the professional association dues or licensing fees are reasonable and necessary to the performance of the employee's or officer's duties; and

b. The membership must accrue to the benefit of the municipality, and any benefit to the individual must be merely incidental.

MS AG Op., Bailey (January 31, 2003). We have opined that a county board of supervisors has the authority to pay reasonable expenses for the county engineer to attend various professional meetings "which the board determines and approves in advance as being necessary and related to the engineer's county responsibilities." MS AG Op., Austin (March 10, 1993). We are of the opinion that seminar or conference registration fees may be paid for members of appointed boards and commissions, provided those expenses are found to be necessary for the members' board or commission responsibilities.

*2 2. Can the City pay travel expenses in connection with the attendance of a seminar, conference or workshop by an appointed board or commission member?

Yes, the City may pay travel expenses in connection with the attendance at a necessary seminar, conference or workshop.

2. Can the City pay membership dues or fees for an appointed board or commission member to become a member of an organization which provides information, training, etc. for the board or commission on which they serve?

Yes. Please see our response to Question 1 and our opinion to Alderman Bailey, MS AG Op., Bailey (January 31, 2003).

2. Can the City pay for subscriptions to publications for an appointed board or commission member to obtain information pertinent to the board or commission on which they serve?

We are of the opinion that if the expense of a particular publication or periodical is found to be reasonable and necessary to the performance of that officer's duties, and that the benefits of the publication will inure to the benefit of the municipality with any personal benefit being incidental, the municipality may make such expenditure.

2. If the answer to any or all of the aforementioned questions is yes, under the Mayor--ouncil form of government, does the City Council have to approve any of the items in the questions posed prior to the board or commission member receiving the benefit, or is this at the discretion of the Mayor?

There is no authority for dues to professional organizations, registration for seminars or travel-related expenses to be paid prior to being approved by the governing authorities. MS AG Op., Bailey (January 31, 2003); MS AG Op., Willis (March 8, 2002). The requisite findings regarding the necessity of the expenditure for the benefit of the municipality must be made before the expenditures are authorized. The Mayor does not have the discretion to approve such expenditures; they must be approved by the City Council. The municipality would be without the authority to reimburse a board or commission member who expended money on travel, membership dues, seminar fees or professional publications without first receiving specific authorization.



WHEREAS, the Jackson Medical Mall Foundation Transportation Division has partnered with the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) and the City of Jackson's Human and Cultural Division through Senior Services for funding to support the Senior Transportation Program, which provides senior patrons and individuals with disabilities transportation services to nutrition, medical, and social destinations; and

Attached, you will find an agenda item authorizing payments to Hemphill and Utility Constructors (UCI) for work performed last summer and fall.

The Pearl River flood in August 2022 resulted in river water inundating the West Bank Interceptor and causing a mixture of sewage and flood water to infiltrate the main sewer line. The result was a mixture of sewage and river water backing up out of the West Bank interceptor and onto the Country Club of Jackson. The Country Club was schedule to host the PGA Tour Sanderson Farms Championship 30 days later, and two areas on the championship course had sewer on the course that had to be cleaned up to be presentable for the PGA Tour event.

In the fall of 2022, Hemphill and UCI were called upon to repair multiple broken water mains that occurred while the water system was in a fragile state. In order to preserve system integrity, Public Works called on the two contractors to repair water mains. The most critical of these repairs was a break in the 20 inch water main on Fortification Street east of Maple Street.

Finance has identified funds in Fund 372 Modernization Tax that can be used to pay for these expenses. It is the recommendation of this office that this item be taken up prior to claims and approved. If you have any questions, please call me.

I connected laptop and found no faults to prevent it from starting. I checked and found the fuel tank is filled to capacity and there are no leaks present. I found the engine is not building any rail pressure. I checked and found I have fuel coming into the low pressure pump from the electric transfer pump but can not get fuel to come out of the high pressure pump. I disconnected the quantity control valve and found the pump still will not put any fuel out. I started an EDS for T/S assistance and followed steps. I found them to lead to a failed high pressure fuel pump assembly. I also recommend replacing the fuel injectors due to them being dry fired. I sent parts requisition form for estimate to include pump, injectors and connector tubes and fuel filters.

Forked unit into shop Removed CAC pipe, radiator brace, EGR cross over pipe, EGR actuator, unplugged part of wiring harness, Crank case breather housing, valve cover, injector harness rocker cover housing, injector feed lines, R and R all injectors with new feed tubes. Then disconnected fuel lines going to the high pressure fuel pump. remove fuel pump gear nut unbolted and removed pump. Swapped fittings over to new pump and installed into unit torqueing nut to spec (133ftlb). Reinstalled all parts that was removed during repair, EGR components waiting gasket to come in for them.

Got gaskets from cummins finished installing EGR components. Primed fuel system started and ran unit checking for any leaks. Steamed cleaned unit road tested to verify repair found after road test the injector supply lines #2 #6 are leaking fuel at the rail check and verify that lines are tight. 

#### ORDER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH COMPLETE ENVIRONMENTAL AND REMEDIATION CO., LLC FOR THE COLLECTION OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARD WASTE AND HANDLING SERVICES AT THE ENVIRONMENTATION SERVICE CENTER

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson, through the Solid Waste Division, has received grant funds from the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality to operate a permanent site for the collection of unwanted household hazardous waste from residents; and

WHEREAS, the City's Environmental Service Center (ESC) requires a professional waste company to remove and dispose of the collected household hazardous waste; and

WHEREAS, the City published a request for proposals for the handling of household hazardous waste at the ESC, and the proposal of Complete Environmental and Remediation Co., LLC was the best proposal received; and

WHEREAS, the scope of services for the Agreement is as follows:

#### **General Information**

The Service Provider agrees to accept, process and dispose of specified quantities and types of Hazardous Waste originating from sources located in Hinds County, including, but not limited to the City of Jackson, Hinds County, and Rankin County, in accordance with all applicable Federal, state and local regulations. Nothing herein shall prohibit any Service Provider from entering into any separate Contract with another person or municipality to provide such waste collection services.

#### **Required Services**

- (a) Provide all equipment (e.g. safety equipment and supplies) and labor for the collection, handling, packaging, transportation and disposal of household hazardous waste;
- (b) Provide all supplies needed for containerizing the waste.
- (c) Provide annual training to City personnel regarding planning and organizing assistance as needed for the operation of the Environmental Service Center (ESC);
- (d) Collection of household hazardous waste from the City's ESC includes, but will not be limited to, the following items: antifreeze, batteries, brake fluid, chlorine bleach, detergents, disinfectants, drain openers, furniture polish, motor oil/filter, oven cleaners, paint products, paint thinners, pesticides, photo chemicals, rodent poisons, rug cleaners, transmission fluid,

Agenda Item # 38August 29, 2023 R. LEE, LUMUMBA) turpentine, varnishes, water sealants, wood finishes, wood finishes, cell phones, computers and other electronics;

- Under no circumstances shall Contractor accept or handle the following waste: compressed gases, radioactive materials, ammunition, explosives, dioxin, biological waste, medical waste, animal manure, animal carcasses, and spoiled foods;
- (f) Supply properly trained and qualified labor to review, segregate, package, manifest, and transport collected waste every 30-90 days or within 5 working days of a request for service;

Provide for the safe handling and disposal of collected waste in compliance with all applicable State and Federal regulations. The preferred method of waste management is recycling or reuse, followed by fuel blending, incineration, or chemical treatment. Land disposal shall be minimized to the extent possible; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement may be terminated under the following conditions:

The City may terminate this Agreement at any time during its terms or any extension thereof with or without cause. All terms and conditions of this Agreement are considered material, and failure to perform any of the terms and conditions on the part of either party shall be considered a breach of this Agreement.

- (a) Termination for Convenience. If termination of the Agreement by the City is not based on cause, then the City shall provide the Contractor with thirty (30) days advance written notice of termination.
- (b) Termination for Cause. Prior to termination of the Agreement for cause, the City shall provide the Contractor written notice of its intent to terminate the agreement based on cause. The notice shall cite the basis for the City's intended action, reasonable measures that should be taken or implemented by the Contractor to cure or remedy the defect, and shall advise the Contractor that the Agreement shall terminate ten (10) days from the date of the notice, if there has been no cure or if such deficiencies cannot reasonably remedied within a thirty (30) days period, as determined solely by the City. The failure of the City to terminate for cause shall not preclude the City from terminating the agreement at any time subsequent to the expiration of the ten (10) period to cure, absent the City agreeing in writing to afford the Contractor additional time.
- (c) Termination for failure to comply with State and Federal law. The City may terminate this Agreement at any time for Contractor's failure to comply with applicable State and Federal laws, effective immediately upon giving written notice.

- (d) This Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice, if the Contractor is adjudicated bankrupt; is the subject of the appointment of a receiver and fails to have the receiver removed within thirty (30) days; has any property attached and fails to remove such attachment within thirty (30) days; becomes insolvent, or is unable to pay its debts as they become due.
- (e) This Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice, if the Contractor fails to provide or maintain the performance bond as required by this Agreement; or fails to obtain or maintain any insurance policies and endorsements as required by this contract; or fails to provide following the City's request, the proof of insurance as required by this agreement.
- (f) This Agreement shall terminate on September 30th of each year of the Agreement, if the City does not receive an annual grant from the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality in the amount at least \$75,000.00 or otherwise does not budget for this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the term of the Agreement shall be as follows:

The term of this contract will be for two years with two one-year extensions solely at the option of the Mayor. The contract will automatically extend after the initial contract term expires unless the Mayor notifies the Contractor of its intent to terminate this contract within 30 days of the beginning of the contract extension. The second option will automatically begin after the end of the first extension term under the same conditions; and

WHEREAS, the amount invoiced for the initial two-year term of the Agreement shall not exceed \$150,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the amount invoiced for the first option year, if exercised by the City shall not exceed \$75,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the amount invoiced for the second option year, if exercised by the City shall not exceed \$75,000.00.

IT IS, THEREFORE ORDERED that the Mayor is authorized to execute an agreement with Complete Environmental and Remediation Co., LLC for two years with two one-year extensions solely at the option of the Mayor in amount not to exceed \$150,000.00.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Agreement will automatically extend after the initial contract term expires at the same rates for work and in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 unless the Mayor notifies the Contractor of his intent to terminate this contract within 30 days of the beginning of the contract extension.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the second option will automatically begin after the end of the first extension term at the same rates for work and in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 unless the Mayor

notifies the Contractor of his intent to terminate this contract within 30 days of the beginning of the contract extension.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all related necessary documents to implement the Agreement and any extensions.

#### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION AGREEMENT

This agreement is made on the ______ day of August, 2023 by and between the CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, a municipal corporation (hereinafter called the "City"), and Complete Environmental and Remediation Co., LLC, (hereinafter called "CONTRACTOR"), a Mississippi Limited Liability Company.

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson, through the Solid Waste Division, has received grant funds from the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality to operate a permanent site for the collection of unwanted household hazardous waste from residents; and

WHEREAS, the City's Environmental Service Center (ESC) requires a professional waste company to remove and dispose of the collected household hazardous waste; and

WHEREAS, the City published a request for proposals for the handling of household hazardous waste at the ESC, and the proposal of Complete Environmental and Remediation Co., LLC was the best proposal received; and

WHEREAS, the annual cost of the agreement is contingent upon the types and volumes of household hazardous waste delivered to the contractor; and

WHEREAS, in the recent past, approximately \$75,000.00 was spent annually for the City's household hazardous waste handling services

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and benefits of this Agreement, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by both parties, City and Contractor agree as follows:

- 1. The City's Request for Proposals and the Contractor's response to the Request for Proposals ("Contractor's Proposal") are hereby made part of this Contract as fully and completely as if set forth in words and figures herein. The Request for Proposals, the Contractor's Proposal, and this Household Hazardous Waste Agreement ("Agreement") constitute the Contract Documents that shall govern the parties in their performance of their respective duties regarding the work to be done ("Contract Work").
- 2. The Contract Work to be performed by the Contractor, more specifically disclosed by the Contract Documents, is the performance of Household Hazardous Waste Collection Services at the City's Environmental Service Center, which shall include the proper handling, transportation, and disposal of household hazardous waste products collected from residents.

- 3. The Contract Work shall be performed in accordance with the Contract Documents.
- 4. The Contractor agrees to faithfully perform and complete the work contemplated by the Contract Documents within the requested time schedule from the date of issuance by the City of any instructions and strictly in accordance with the Contract Documents and any incidental requirements of the City.
- 5. The Contractor shall comply with all local, state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to the Contract Work.
- 6. The City agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to accept the unit prices set forth in the Contractor's Proposal as full compensation for the performance of all Contract Work, as well as all losses or damages, if any, arising out of the nature of this work, and any and all other unforeseen difficulties that may be encountered in the prosecution of the same, the Contractor assuming all risks of every kind and description in the performance under this Agreement.
- 7. The Contractor agrees and binds itself to indemnify and save harmless the City of Jackson of and from any and all claims for damages for any reason whatsoever growing out of the performance of this Agreement as a result of negligence on the part of the Contractor.
- 8. The City of Jackson shall be named as an additional insured on all applicable insurance policies required by the Contract Documents.

#### 1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

#### **General Information**

The Service Provider agrees to accept, process and dispose of specified quantities and types of Hazardous Waste originating from sources located in Hinds County, including, but not limited to the City of Jackson, Hinds County, and Rankin County, in accordance with all applicable Federal, state and local regulations. Nothing herein shall prohibit any Service Provider from entering into any separate Contract with another person or municipality to provide such waste collection services.

#### **Required Services**

- (a) Provide all equipment (e.g. safety equipment and supplies) and labor for the collection, handling, packaging, transportation and disposal of household hazardous waste;
- (b) Provide all supplies needed for containerizing the waste.

- (c) Provide annual training to City personnel regarding planning and organizing assistance as needed for the operation of the Environmental Service Center (ESC);
- (d) Collection of household hazardous waste from the City's ESC includes, but will not be limited to, the following items: antifreeze, batteries, brake fluid, chlorine bleach, detergents, disinfectants, drain openers, furniture polish, motor oil/filter, oven cleaners, paint products, paint thinners, pesticides, photo chemicals, rodent poisons, rug cleaners, transmission fluid, turpentine, varnishes, water sealants, wood finishes, wood finishes, cell phones, computers and other electronics;
- (e) Under no circumstances shall Contractor accept or handle the following waste: compressed gases, radioactive materials, ammunition, explosives, dioxin, biological waste, medical waste, animal manure, animal carcasses, and spoiled foods;
- (f) Supply properly trained and qualified labor to review, segregate, package, manifest, and transport collected waste every 30-90 days or within 5 working days of a request for service;
- (g) Provide for the safe handling and disposal of collected waste in compliance with all applicable State and Federal regulations. The preferred method of waste management is recycling or reuse, followed by fuel blending, incineration, or chemical treatment. Land disposal shall be minimized to the extent possible.

#### 2. VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT

All vehicles, equipment and facilities used by the Contractor shall be kept and maintained in sanitary condition and in good repair. Employees driving Contractor's vehicles shall have a valid operator's license of the State of Mississippi and shall meet federal requirements concerning commercial licensing. The Contractor shall not use the City name or other words implying municipal ownership or stationary, vehicles or equipment.

#### 3. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Insurance coverage specified herein constitutes the minimum requirements. Said requirements shall in no way lessen or limit the liability of the Contractor under the terms of the Contract. The contractor shall procure and maintain, at his own cost and expense, any additional kinds and amounts of insurance that, in his own judgment, may be necessary for proper protection in the prosecution of the Contract Work.

The contractor shall carry insurance as prescribed herein and shall be with companies satisfactory to the City of Jackson.

If a part of this Contract is sublet, the Contractor shall require each subcontractor to carry insurance of the same kinds and in like amounts as carried by the prime Contractor.

Certificates of insurance shall state that ten (10) days written notice will be given to the City before the policy is canceled or changed. No contractor or subcontractor will be allowed to start any work on this Contract until certificates of all insurance required herein are filed and approved by the City. The certificates shall show the type, amount, class of operations covered, effective dates and the dates of expiration of policies.

The Contractor shall secure and maintain in effect for the period of the Contract and pay all premiums for the following kinds and amounts of insurance:

- (a) Workmen's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance This Insurance shall protect the Contractor against all claims under applicable State Workmen's Compensation Laws. The Contractor shall also be protected and shall cause each subcontractor to be protected against claims for injury, disease, or death of employees which, for any reason, may not fall within the provisions of a Workmen's Compensation Law. The liability limits shall not be less than the required statutory limits for Workmen's Compensation and Employer's Liability.
- (b) Contractor's Comprehensive Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance, covering all operations in connection with the performance of this Contract (including overspray) in amounts no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for each occurrence. The City shall be named as an Additional Insured.
- (c) Automatic Public Liability and Property Damage: The Contractor shall maintain automobile public liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$500,000 for injury to one person and \$500,000 for one accident; and automobile property damage from any and all claims arising form the use of the following:
  - 1. Contractor's automobiles and trucks.
  - 2. Hired automobiles and trucks.
  - 3. Automobiles and trucks owned by subcontractors.

The City shall me named as an Additional Insured.

#### 4. BASIS AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

The Contractor shall be paid within forty-five (45) days for successful work completed and invoiced. In the event of a dispute as to a portion of any invoice, the City will make payment of the undisputed portion of the invoice and provide written notice to the Contractor of the dispute. The Contractor and City agree that the prices provided in the Cost Proposal section of the Contractor's proposal shall not increase for the term of this Agreement, plus any extensions.

The City expects to annually receive a grant from the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality in the amount of \$75,000. The amount invoiced for the initial twoyear term of the Agreement shall not exceed \$150,000.00. The amount invoiced for the first option year, if exercised by the City shall not exceed \$75,000.00. The amount invoiced for the second option year, if exercised by the City shall not exceed \$75,000.00.

#### 5. DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

The Contractor must take the necessary precautions to prevent damage to the existing facility, equipment, and to the grounds (including grass, shrubs, and fence). Should damage occur as a result of the Contractor's action or negligence, he will be required to repair at his expense to the satisfaction of the City. No additional contract time will be allowed for any such repairs.

#### 6. TERMINATION

The City may terminate this Agreement at any time during its terms or any extension thereof with or without cause. All terms and conditions of this Agreement are considered material, and failure to perform any of the terms and conditions on the part of either party shall be considered a breach of this Agreement.

- (a) Termination for Convenience. If termination of the Agreement by the City is not based on cause, then the City shall provide the Contractor with thirty (30) days advance written notice of termination.
- (b) Termination for Cause. Prior to termination of the Agreement for cause, the City shall provide the Contractor written notice of its intent to terminate the agreement based on cause. The notice shall cite the basis for the City's intended action, reasonable measures that should be taken or implemented by the Contractor to cure or remedy the defect, and shall advise the Contractor that the Agreement shall terminate ten (10) days from the date of the notice, if there has been no cure or if such deficiencies cannot reasonably remedied within a thirty (30) days period, as determined solely by the City. The failure of the City to terminate for cause shall not preclude the City from terminating the agreement at any time subsequent to the expiration of the ten (10) period to cure, absent the City agreeing in writing to afford the Contractor additional time.
- (c) Termination for failure to comply with State and Federal law. The City may terminate this Agreement at any time for Contractor's failure to comply with applicable State and Federal laws, effective immediately upon giving written notice.

- (d) This Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice, if the Contractor is adjudicated bankrupt; is the subject of the appointment of a receiver and fails to have the receiver removed within thirty (30) days; has any property attached and fails to remove such attachment within thirty (30) days; becomes insolvent, or is unable to pay its debts as they become due.
- (e) This Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice, if the Contractor fails to provide or maintain the performance bond as required by this Agreement; or fails to obtain or maintain any insurance policies and endorsements as required by this contract; or fails to provide following the City's request, the proof of insurance as required by this agreement.
- (f) This Agreement shall terminate on September 30th of each year of the Agreement, if the City does not receive an annual grant from the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality in the amount at least \$75,000.00 or otherwise does not budget for this Agreement.

#### 7. TERM

The term of this contract will be for two years with two one-year extensions solely at the option of the Mayor. The contract will automatically extend after the initial contract term expires unless the Mayor notifies the Contractor of its intent to terminate this contract within 30 days of the beginning of the contract extension. The second option will automatically begin after the end of the first extension term under the same conditions.

#### 8. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

Contractor binds itself, partners, successors, administrators, and assigns to this Agreement, and to the partners, successors, administrators, and assigns of the City in respect of all of the covenants of this Agreement.

City binds itself, partners, administrators, and assigns to this Agreement, and to the partners, successors, administrators, and assigns of the Contractor in respect of all of the covenants of this Agreement. City successors in office shall not be bound to the covenants of this Agreement and may terminate this Agreement at any time after succeeding in office by a duly enacted Order of the governing authorities.

#### 9. EQUAL BUSINESS OPPORTUNITY

The CONTRACTOR agrees to make good faith efforts to meet the goals of this agreement by making available opportunities for MBEs (AABEs, HBEs, and ABEs) and FBEs for utilization in the work set forth.

- (a) Notification to MBEs and FBEs that the Engineer has subcontracting opportunities available and maintenance of records of the MBEs and FBEs responses.
- (b) Maintenance by the Engineer of a file of the names and addresses of each MBE and FBE contracted and action taken with respect to each such contract.
- (c) Dissemination of the Engineer's EBO policy externally by informing and discussing it with all management and technical assistance sources, by advertising in news media, and by notifying and discussing it with all subcontractors and suppliers.
- (d) Specific and continuing personal (both written and oral) recruitment efforts directed at MBE and FBE Engineer organizations, MBE and FBE assistance organizations.
- (e) Sub-division of the contract into economically feasible segments as practice to allow the greatest opportunity for participation by MBEs and FBEs.
- (f) Increasing where possible the number of aggregate purchase items so as to eliminate the requirement of front-end purchases of material for as many MBE and FBE subcontractors as possible.
- (g) Adoption of the Equal Business Opportunity Plan submitted with its response to the Invitation for Bids or Request for Proposals obligations under this agreement, as approved by the Equal Business Opportunity Officer.
- (h) Submission of monthly reports on the forms and to the extent required by the Equal Business Opportunity Officer, to be due on the last day of each month following the award of the work set forth in this agreement.

The CONTRACTOR further agrees that its breach of the EBO provisions contained herein shall subject it to any or all of the following penalties:

- (a) Withholding of ten percent (10%) of all future payments under the involved eligible project until it is determined that the Engineer is in compliance;
- (b) Withholding of all future payments under the involved project until it is determined that the Engineer is in compliance.
- (c) Refusal of all future bids or offers for any eligible project with the City of Jackson or any of its departments or divisions until such time as the Engineer demonstrates that there has been established and there shall be carried out of all the EBO provisions contained herein;
- (d) Cancellation of the eligible project.

# SITE SET UP & COLLECTION PROCESS

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Traffic will be directed to the unloading area. Participants are urged to stay in their cars. Waste will be unloaded and placed in a central area for segregation. ESC personnel will unload the vehicles and place it in the segregation and packaging area.

The segregation area will allow enough space for the transfer of waste onto dollies and to their proper consolidation areas. Reception areas will be staggered to ensure against cross vehicular contamination in the event of a spill for the safety of our personnel working in close quarters with moving vehicles. A Decontamination area will be set up at the back of the roll-off containers or paint areas for fast response for the decontamination in the event of an emergency. Emergency eyewash stations will be located in this area as well as the first aid station for additional safety.

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## NOTE: THERE WILL BE NO ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES OTHER THAN THOSE NOT LISTED ABOVE.

Based on previous experience with similar projects, we feel that the equipment and supplies listed above will be sufficient for project completion. However, if any additional equipment or supplies are needed Complete Environmental will make every effort to provide this additional equipment in a time and cost efficient manner.

All paperwork including waste profiles, manifest, labels, and LDRs will be provided by the contractor at no additional charge. If lab analyses are ordered by the sponsor, they will be billed at cost plus 20%.

## SAFETY PLAN

Complete Environmental will use all precautions necessary to minimize the risk of spills and fires and ensure the safety of the workers and participates. All workers must have the appropriate personal protective equipment as directed in the safety training.

To minimize the risk of a spill, any container that is heavier than twenty-five pounds, two people or a forklift will be required to remove the container from the vehicle. In the event that there is a leaking container, the spill will be contained as soon as possible. The leaking container will be over-packed with either a poly or metal over-pack depending on the type of chemical. Any spilled materials will be recovered with the proper absorbents.

The segregation area will be lined with poly sheeting to prevent the ground from being contaminated if a spill occurs during packaging.

Smoking will only be allowed in designated areas. There will be no smoking near the waste collection and storage area.

Fire extinguishers will be placed strategically around the segregation area. To prevent fires and to ensure the safety of participates, only trained personnel employees will be allowed to consolidate flammable liquids.

Traffic control devices will be placed in order to direct the flow of traffic and a worker will be assigned to direct the drivers when to pull ahead to the next unloading zone.

# **CONTINGENCY PLAN**

- 1. Complete Environmental's safety officer will make decisions on the course of action to be taken. The safety of private citizens and personnel assisting with the event is paramount.
- 2. Each consolidation area will be segregated according to hazard classes as well as the chemistry and reception areas.
- 3. If a spill involving waste of a non-hazardous, flammable, corrosive, or oxidizing nature should occur, Complete Environmental will contain the spill and remediate the materials, leaving no residual. If the segregation area is involved, Complete Environmental employees will work to clean this area and return it to perfect working order as soon as possible.
- 4. In the event of toxic or poisonous release or spill, all personnel and citizens will be evacuated from the immediate area and moved to a safe area. Complete Environmental will don the proper PPE, contain the material, and ensure that it is packaged and sealed tightly prior to the return of personnel into the area.
- 5. Complete Environmental will be equipped with PPE to handle spills of any nature involving household hazardous wastes and will possess the equipment to eliminate the problem quickly.
- 6. In the event of any spill, Complete Environmental will maintain an emergency phone number list for each city and county that is applicable. This list will be posted in the case of an emergency. Phone numbers on this list will include local EMS, fire department, police, sheriff departments, and hospitals. All Complete Environmental management personnel will carry cellular phones.

## SITE OPERATIONAL PLAN

Successful completion of a project depends on planning and employees understanding the plan in its entirety. Complete Environmental has experienced employees who understand the complex rigors of a successful household hazardous waste collection. This understanding improves the overall success of the project. Our personnel are accustomed to working under OSHA Safety Guidelines and will carry out the operational plan of action in a timely and safety conscious manner. Complete Environmental will merge both technical and operational supervisors to ensure that our operational plan will proceed smoothly and within regulations.

Complete Environmental has set forth guidelines to be followed for the waste collection. These guidelines are to be followed unless the scope of work changes enough as to affect the efficiency of the job. At such time, Complete Environmental's project manager will assess the situation and make changes accordingly.

Complete Environmental's Operational Plan is as follows:

- 1. <u>COLLECTION</u>: If Complete Environmental is awarded this contract, we will host an initial site safety and operational meeting immediately. All of Complete Environmental personnel and ESC personnel will be asked to attend. Operational plans and safety training will be discussed during this meeting.
- 2. **RECEPTION:** During the reception phase, all non-essential personnel will remain clear of the work areas. Residents will be required to stay in or near their vehicles during this phase. Vehicles approaching the reception area will be required to stop a minimum of 50 feet prior to entering. This is to ensure proper working distance for emergency spill operations and the safety of our personnel working around motor vehicles.
- 3. **IDENTIFICATION:** Complete Environmental train ESC personnel on waste identification. The waste will be segregated according to hazard class prior to packaging. This will insure all waste streams are in their prospective place for packaging. First stage identification will be performed in the reception area; waste will be transferred from the reception area to waste stream specific consolidation areas. Complete Environmental will insure proper packaging through secondary identification at the time of pickup.
- 4. <u>PACKAGING</u>: Packaging will be performed in compliance with all local, state, and federal regulations. All containers will be DOT approved for shipping. Each waste stream type and size will determine the container type and size (i.e., acids will be packaged in acid approved shipping container). Technicians will ensure the proper waste stream packaging and install proper lids, rings, and bolts prior to container being moved out of primary waste stream segregation area. All containers will be inspected for overall integrity of the drum. Proper labeling and waste approval numbers with identification will be placed on the drum for tracking purposes.

**STAGING:** Waste Streams will be verified by Complete Environmental personnel and the driver of the transporting vehicle. Upon completion of this verification and the manifests, the generator's representative will sign the manifests. This is to ensure that no waste streams are counted in error and all containers are properly accounted for.

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- 6. <u>**TRANSPORTATION**</u>: Technicians will perform a pre-shipment inspection on all containers in the staging area to ensure that all labels and shipping information is properly affixed. Containers will be loaded on the trailers and secured for shipment. All containers will be accounted for on hazardous or non-hazardous waste manifest. The generator or generator's representative will be required to sign the manifest along with the transport driver. At this time, the generator or representative will receive the first generators copy.
- 7 **DISPOSAL:** After the waste has been recycled, blended, or disposed of, the generator will receive a certificate of disposal. General matrix of the waste will be the determining factor in the disposal method utilized. Complete Environmental will provide all support documentation: manifest, labels, and tracking of the waste as a courtesy to the generator and will maintain a permanent copy for future reference or in the event that the original documentation is lost or destroyed.

## **UNACCEPTABLE WASTE**

Complete Environmental will under no circumstances accept the following waste streams:

- 1. Dioxin
- 2. Explosives / Ammunition
- 3. Biological / Medical Waste
- 4. Animal Manure / Carcasses
- 5. Spoiled Foods
- 6. Compressed Gases

The above mentioned waste streams are not handled by Complete Environmental at any time. Complete Environmental will refuse any or all of these listed as we are not insured, trained, or equipped to handle these waste streams. Complete Environmental can however recommend EPA approved disposal options for these waste streams.

## WASTE SCREENING

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Complete Environmental and ESC personnel and volunteers will make a primary survey of waste materials as they are received from the citizen. At this time, waste will be categorized. If any questions arise during this process, the citizen delivering the waste may be questioned on the product to help with determination process. Our field chemists can generally make a determination on categorization by the type of container, matrix of the product, color, odor, and quantity. For further information, the product will be forwarded to the chemistry area for field analysis. After a product has been declared a flammable (for example), the waste will be taken to the flammable consolidation area to be properly packaged. Packaging technicians will observe each product as it is packed to ensure the product is correctly categorized. If the technician has a questionable container, the container will be reprocessed by our field chemists to ensure the waste is properly packaged and disposed of.

Complete Environmental can and will accept waste of any nature approved by representatives of the MDEQ. Special waste of this nature may be handled on a case by case basis. Complete Environmental has provided quotations on waste streams as generally requested by the sponsor; however, Complete Environmental can handle the disposal of most products (i.e., NORM or PCB contaminated materials). Recyclable materials can also be accepted and handled by Complete Environmental. Materials such as oils, batteries, and fluorescent bulbs are common recyclable waste streams and can be handled in a cost and time efficient manner.

No segregation of paint related material as to hazardous or non-hazardous classification will be performed. All paint will be shipped as Paint Related Materials.

# PERSONNEL TRAINING

An accelerated hazardous materials awareness level course will be taught. Topics of this training course will include:

General site safety

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- Hazardous Materials, Definitions, and Classes
- Hazard Communication
- Hazard "Indicators" such as labels, shipping papers, and placards
- Where hazardous materials may be encountered
- Use of the Emergency Response Guidebook
- Decontamination areas
- Understanding & Executing Site Safety / Contingency Plan
- Packaging and Storage
- Shipping and Transportation

Only trained individuals will be allowed to physically come in contact with hazardous substances. The only exception to this is if the possess a current certificate of completion from an approved 40 hour course as per 29 CFR 1910.120. All participating citizens will remain clear of all hazardous consolidation areas

#### ORDER AUTHORIZING AN APRIL 2023 CREDIT TO SANITATION CUSTOMERS OF THE CITY OF JACKSON FOR GARBAGE COLLECTION

WHEREAS, due to the lapse of solid waste collection services on April 1, 2023, sanitation customers of the City of Jackson failed to receive garbage collection during a portion of the month of April 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson billed customers for garbage collection for April 2023, including those days when they did not receive garbage collection; and

WHEREAS, because customers paid for, but did not receive garbage collection, the City of Jackson in compliance Miss. Code Ann. Section 17-17-5 believes that fairness requires a credit be applied to those sanitation customers who had active accounts during the period when the City did not provide for garbage collection; and

WHEREAS, based on the lapse in services provided as of April 1, 2023, the City's cost was reduced in the amount of at least \$484,821.00, by not having to pay a contractor for garbage collection; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the appropriate credit to be provided to each customer with an active sanitation account on April 19, 2023 is at least \$12.53.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that each customer with an active sanitation account on April 19, 2023 shall receive a credit to their "sanitation fee" of at least \$12.53 on their monthly bill, with the total amount of the credits to all qualifying customers being approximately \$484,821.00, and that this credit shall be applied to the customer's account as soon as practicable to make them whole for garbage collection services for which these customers where charged.

# ORDER REVIEWING AND CONTINUING AUGUST 29, 2022 STATE OF EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on August 29, 2022, the Mayor issued a proclamation of emergency as a result of (1) excessive rainfall and extreme flooding, (2) the March 7, 2020 Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) Emergency Administrative Order (EAO); (3) the February 2021 system-wide failure due to extreme water conditions that caused pipes to freeze and lose pressure; (4) the July 1, 2021 SDWA Administrative Order of Consent (AOC); (5) the July 29, 2022 Boil Water Notice which existed for more than thirty (30) days; and (6) the August 25, 2022 flooding of the Pearl River, which lead to problems with treating water at the O.B. Curtis Water Plant; and

WHEREAS, Section 33-15-17(d) of the Mississippi Code allows the mayor of a municipality to proclaim a local emergency and authorizes the governing body of a municipality to review and approve or disapprove the need for continuing the local emergency at its first regular meeting following such proclamation or at a special meeting; and


WHEREAS, Section 33-15-5 (h) of the Mississippi Code defines an emergency as "any occurrence, or threat thereof, whether natural, technological, or man-made, in war or in peace, which results or may result in substantial injury or harm to the population or substantial damage to loss of property;" and

WHEREAS, Section 33-15-5 (g) of the Mississippi Code defines a local emergency as "the duly proclaimed existence of conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of person and property within the territorial limits of a...municipality caused by such conditions as...water pollution...or other natural or man-made conditions, which conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the political subdivision and require the combined forces of other subdivisions or of the state to combat;" and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 33-15-17 (b) of the Mississippi Code, the City "is authorized to exercise the powers vested under [Section 33-15-1, et seq.,] in light of the exigencies of the extreme emergency situation without regard to time-consuming procedures and formalities prescribed by law pertaining to the performance of public work, entering into contracts, the incurring of obligations...and the expenditure of public funds....

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT** we the governing body of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in the body by Section 33-15-17(d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and in the public interest and for the general welfare of the City of Jackson, do hereby approve of the continued need for a civil emergency for the entire City of Jackson for the reasons set forth in this Order.

#### ORDER REVIEWING AND CONTINUING STATE OF EMERGENCY.

**WHEREAS**, on February 18, 2020, the Jackson City Council, pursuant to Section 33-15-17(8(d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, passed an Order Declaring the Need to Continue the State of Emergency that was issued on February 13, 2020 by Chokwe A. Lumumba, Mayor of the City of Jackson, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson City Council, in the February 18, 2020 Order, found that flood waters and wide spread drainage system issues had affected several Jackson creeks, including, but not limited to: Belhaven Creek; Bogue Chitto Creek; Canney Creek; Eubanks Creek; Hanging Moss Creek; Lynch Creek; Purple Creek; Three Mile Creek; Town Creek; Travon Creek; and White Oak Creek; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson City Council, in the February 18, 2020 Order, found that the flood waters and wide spread drainage system issues caused extensive damages to homes, business, public property, and threatened the safety of the citizens and property of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, requiring the exercise of extraordinary measures; and

**WHEREAS,** the Jackson City Council, in the February 18, 2020 Order, found that all efforts should be taken to protect people and property in consideration of the health, safety, and welfare of the City's residents and the protection of their property within the affected areas; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson City Council, on March 17, 2020; April 14, 2020; May 12, 2020, June 9, 2020, July 7, 2020, August 4, 2020, September 1, 2020, September 29, 2020, October 27, 2020, November 24, 2020, December 22, 2020, January 19, 2021, February 17, 2021, March 30, 2021, April 27, 2021, May 25, 2021, June 22, 2021, July 20, 2021, August 31, 2021, September 28, 2021, October 26, 2021, November 23, 2021, December 21, 2021, January 25, 2022, February 15, 2022, March 29, 2022, April 26, 2022, May 24, 2022, June 21, 2022, July 19, 2022, August 30, 2022, September 27, 2022, October 25, 2022, November 22, 2022, December 20, 2022, January 31, 2023, February 28, 2023, March 21, 2023, April 25, 2023 and May 23, 2023, June 22, 2023 and July 18, 2023 pursuant to Section 33-15-17(8)(d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, reviewed the need for and continued the local emergency; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Section 33-15-17(8)(d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, the Jackson City Council has again reviewed the need for continuing the local emergency and determined that the emergency should be continued.

**IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY ORDERED** that said Order Declaring the Need to Continue the Declared State of Emergency as delineated by the Jackson City Council, remains in full force and effect and shall be reviewed again in thirty (30) days in accordance with Section 33-15-17(8(d) of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended

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#### RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI ENCOURAGING THE MAYOR TO PROCURE SERVICES FOR THE COMPLETION OF A DISPARITY STUDY, AS THE CITY COUNCIL APPROPRIATE FUNDS IN THE FY23/24 BUDGET, TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH JACKSON CODE OF ORDINANCE ARTICLE 2 SEC. 127.53.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the city council to require the completion of a disparity and availability study not less than every five years in an attempt to provide a remedy for past underutilization of minority and woman-owned businesses and to prevent any ongoing underutilization of minority and women's business enterprises in the city's contracting process by ensuring the full and equitable participation of minority and female business enterprises in the provision of goods and services to the city on a contractual basis; and

**WHEREAS,** he ultimate goal of this policy is to remedy the effects of past underutilization in the local marketplace by increasing the use of minority and women's business enterprises to one more comparable to their representation in the City of Jackson business community; and

WHEREAS, for several decades, the City of Jackson has conducted numerous disparity and availability studies that have documented the discriminatory practices and barriers to public procurement within the City of Jackson that have plagued minority business enterprises and women business enterprises; and

WHEREAS, Historical, systemic and institutionalized discrimination against minority and women owned businesses exists in the Jackson business sector, which has restricted their access to private and public contracting markets and which has emerged as the major factor responsible for their marginal economic position in the Jackson business population; and

WHEREAS, the specific industries that showed discrimination against women and other minorities include construction, commodity sales, and professional services; and

WHEREAS, The contracting and procurement practices of the City of Jackson, prior to the inception of a minority and female business enterprise program, were dominated by an historical, institutional and systematic network from which women and minorities were excluded; and

WHEREAS, Market place discrimination against minorities and women business owners occurred in the Jackson marketplace across a wide range of businesses, including evidence of double standards in work appraisals, denials of opportunities to bid, discrimination in bonding, financing and in payments, lack of access to contracts, unnecessarily restrictive specifications, the existence of and the exclusion from the historical, systematic, and institutional network, subcontracting, bid shopping, and bid manipulation; and

WHEREAS, the statistical comparison suggested by the U.S. Supreme Court in Croson, between the number of available qualified minority businesses, and the total contract dollar awards going to minority businesses, referred to as the utilization percentage ratio (UPR), yields

Agenda Item No. 42 August 29, 2023 (Banks) significant statistical disparities in all industries between majority and minority businesses who contract with the City of Jackson. Moreover, this comparison suggested by the court, although showing a significant degree of disparity, results in a deficient measure of discrimination, failing to take into account those minority or female individuals or firms who were discouraged, deterred and/or disadvantaged by the discriminating practice in the marketplace; and

WHEREAS, Race and gender neutral policies, including those suggested by the U.S. Supreme Court in Croson, although helpful in improving minority and women owned business development, are found to be inadequate standing alone to eliminate discriminatory practices which continue to deny women and minority business owners access to public and private contracts in the Jackson marketplace; and

WHEREAS, Women and minorities have been discriminated against in public and private markets for contractual services. There is a presence of discrimination in Jackson in various industry classifications and by employer status which has persisted over time. Moreover, there is strong anecdotal and statistical evidence that African American businesses continue to suffer the effects of past and present discrimination in the Jackson business markets both public and private; and

**WHEREAS,** Female, African American, and other minority owned businesses continue to suffer discrimination in the local business market when competing for construction contracts. Given the strikingly low participation of minority enterprises in private construction markets, the City of Jackson should leverage behavior in the private market to assure the effective development of minority and female business enterprises and to eradicate discriminatory practices; and

**WHEREAS,** The City of Jackson was a passive participant in discriminatory practices in both public and the private commercial markets; and

WHEREAS, Past and present discrimination in public and private markets for contractual services and the inability of race and gender-conscious programs standing alone, make race and gender-conscious programs necessary in order to remedy economic disparities between minority, female and majority contractors; and

**WHEREAS,** Utilization goals, attainable by good faith efforts, not quotas, for African-American, female, Hispanic, and Asian American owned businesses are necessary to mitigate the competitive disadvantages which are caused by discrimination and are justified by evidence in the record.

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED,** that the City Council of Jackson, MS strongly encourages the Mayor to procure services for the completion of a disparity study, as the City Council appropriate funds in the FY23/24 budget.
