

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ORDER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AMENDMENT TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH 2°C MISSISSIPPI TO FACILITATE THE "GOING GREEN FOR A COOL HEALTHY JACKSON" PROJECT

WHEREAS, on October 27, 2020, the Jackson City Council ratified the submission of the "Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson" grant application to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) and authorized the Mayor to accept the grant award to reduce mortality and prevent illness associated with urban-heat-island (UHI) effects in Jackson, Mississippi, while providing a range of social, economic, cultural, and ecological co-benefits for the City of Jackson's at-risk residents for the term beginning November 1, 2020, and ending April 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2021, the Jackson City Council authorized the Mayor to execute an amendment to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation "Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson" grant award to revise the budget and budget narrative and to permit the City of Jackson to subcontract or subgrant funds to 2°C Mississippi such that 2°C Mississippi would facilitate said project for the remainder of the grant term; and

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2022, the Jackson City Council authorized the Mayor to amend consultant agreements with Dr. Vivek Shandas, Anna Marandi, Dr. Berneece Herbert, Dr. Dominika Parry, and UMMC to reflect that the consultants will be paid by 2°C Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2022, the Jackson City Council authorized the Mayor to execute a professional services agreement with 2°C Mississippi to facilitate the "Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson" project for the remainder of the grant term beginning February 1, 2022, and ending April 30, 2023, in the amount of \$475, 549.00; and

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2023, RWJF notified the Deputy Director of Economic Development that the grant period has been extended to October 31, 2023; however, the amendment does not modify the scope of work or increase the Foundation's commitment; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2023, the Jackson City Council authorized the Mayor to execute an amendment to the professional services agreement with 2°C Mississippi, to facilitate the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's "Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson" project for the remainder of the grant term beginning upon execution of the agreement and ending October 31, 2023 in the amount of \$91,131.00; and

WHEREAS, on October 12, 2023, RWJF notified the Deputy Director of Economic Development that the grant period has been extended to March 31, 2024; however, the amendment does not modify the scope of work or increase the Foundation's commitment; and

WHEREAS, to date, the City has received \$382,472.00 in grant funds from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and the City was due to receive the remaining amount of \$93,077.00 in 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City will keep \$1,946.00 of the grant funds from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation for indirect costs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson Chief Administrative Officer recommends the Mayor execute an amendment to the professional services agreement with 2°C Mississippi, 116 Summerlake Drive, Ridgeland, Mississippi, 39157, an organization founded by Dr. Dominika Parry that is purposed with building environmentally and economically sustainable communities, municipalities and businesses in Mississippi, to facilitate the project for the remainder of the grant term beginning upon execution and ending March 31, 2024, in the amount of \$91,131.00.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the Mayor be authorized to execute an amendment to the professional services agreement with 2°C Mississippi, to facilitate the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's "Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson" project for the remainder of the grant term beginning upon execution of the agreement and ending March 31, 2024, in the amount of \$91,131.00.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Professional Services Agreement ("Contract") is made by and between the CITY OF JACKSON ("City") and 2°C Mississippi ("Contractor") for the Implementation of the Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson (CHJ) Project, ("Contractor") upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES: The Contractor will provide the following described services to the City, to-wit: Facilitate the Going Green for a Cool, Healthy Jackson project. This project is designed to reduce mortality and prevent illness associated with the urban heat island (UHi) effect in Jackson. Miss., while providing a range of social, economic, cultural, and ecological co-benefits for the City's most at risk residents. The project will utilize medium- and long-term heat mitigation strategies, using nature-based solutions from Barcelona, Spain; Havana, Cuba; and Okaya, Japan. The project team will adapt the Spanish, Cuban, and Japanese models for the local context in Jackson through the full engagement of residents and community leaders in a co-creation process. The main activities will include identifying locations for heat-island interventions; engaging partners and community members in a community-driven decision-making process; developing the package of green interventions appropriate for communities to maximize heat mitigation and social and ecological benefits; and conducting education in schools and communities.

2°C Mississippi led by its CEO, Dr. Dominika Parry, as the co-principal investigator and project director, will oversee the project's vision, design, strategies, partner coordination and project implementation. 2°C Mississippi will:

- Hire and oversee the work of staff, Contractors, and subcontractors:
- Coordinate and reimburse all travel expenses incurred by the 2°C Mississippi' staff, partners and Contractors;
- Coordinate and compensate for meeting expenses, including food for workshop participants; and
- Provide at least quarterly communication with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.
- 2. **CONTRACT TERM:** The period of performance of services under this Contract shall be from the date of execution March 31, 2024.
- 3. COMPENSATION: For the duties and obligations to be performed by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement, City agrees to compensate the Contractor at the rate set forth by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation grant \$91,131 (\$452.903 minus \$361,772 which has been paid by City and Contractor to consultants to date). Funds will be transferred to the Contractor according to the following schedule:
 - Project Year 3 (Nov. 2022 March 31, 2024): \$91,131.00 to be

transferred upon execution of this Agreement.

- 4. APPLICABLE LAW: The Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi. excluding its conflicts of laws provisions, and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the courts of the State of Mississippi. The Contractor shall comply with applicable federal, state and local City of Jackson ordinances, laws, and regulations.
- 5. **APPROVAL:** It is understood that if this Agreement requires approval by the Governing Authority/City Council and this Agreement is not approved by the Governing Authority/City Council, it is void and no payment shall be made hereunder.
- 6. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS: It is expressly understood and agreed that the obligation of the City of Jackson to proceed under this Agreement is conditioned upon the appropriation of funds by the City Council and the receipt of funds. If the funds anticipated for the continuing fulfillment of the Agreement are, at any time. not forthcoming or insufficient, either through the failure of the City of Jackson to provide funds or of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to appropriate funds or the discontinuance or material alteration of the program under which funds were provided or if funds are not otherwise available to the City of Jackson, the City shall have the right upon ten (10) working days written notice to the Contractor to terminate this Agreement without damage, penalty, cost or expenses to the City of any kind whatsoever, other than payment for legal services rendered prior to receiving written notice. The effective date of termination shall be as specified in the notice of termination.
- 7. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY: In connection with the performance of work under this contractual Agreement, the Contractor agrees not to discriminate in any manner whatsoever, including, but not limited to hiring termination/discharge promotion/demotion or other terms and condition of employment against any person otherwise qualified because of race, creed. color, religion, sex, age, national origin, disability, ancestry or political affiliation.
- 8. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: The parties agree that the legal relationship of Contractor and CITY is strictly an independent contractor relationship. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to create a joint venture, agency, partnership or Employer-Contractor relationship between the Parties. Neither Party shall have the power to bind the other Party in any manner. Additionally, the CITY shall have no obligation to Contractor with respect to the provision of any benefits (insurance, retirement or the like) nor shall the CITY have any responsibility for the payment of any taxes, fees. dues or memberships, workers compensation premiums, or the like which are the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

- 9. MODIFICATION OR AMENDMENT: Contractor agrees any budget adjustments must be approved by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation as provided under the original grant agreement attached hereto as exhibit 1. Any additional modifications or amendments to this Agreement may be made upon mutual Agreement of the parties, in writing signed by the parties hereto and approved as required by the City Council and Mayor.
- 10. NON-ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTING: The City of Jackson will not be independently obligated or liable under this Agreement to any party other than the Contractor named herein. Said Contractor understands and agrees that it shall not assign, transfer, delegate or subcontract with respect to any of its rights, benefits. obligations. interests or duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Office of the City Attorney.
- 11. NON-WAIVER OF BREACH: No assent, expressed or implied, by the parties hereto to the breach of the conditions of this Agreement shall be deemed or taken to be a waiver of any succeeding breach of the same or any other provision or condition and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of the Agreement.
- 12. **PUBLIC RECORDS:** This Agreement, including any accompanying exhibits, attachments, and appendices, is subject to the "Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983," and its exceptions. See Mississippi Code Annotated §§ 25-61-1 *el seq.* and Mississippi Code Annotated § 79-23-1.
- 13. REPRESENTATION REGARDING CONTINGENT FEES AND GRATUITIES: The Contractor represents that it has not retained a person to solicit or secure a government contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage. or contingent fee, except as disclosed to the Office of the Mayor and/or City Council. The Contractor represents it has not violated, is not violating, and promises that it will not violate any prohibition of gratuities set forth in the Mississippi Constitution.
- 14. **SEVERABILITY:** It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that if any part, term or provision of this Agreement is by the courts or other judicial body held to be illegal or in conflict with any law of the State of Mississippi or Ordinance of the City of Jackson, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected and the obligations of the parties shall be construed in full force as if the Agreement did not contain that particular pail, tem1, or provision held to be invalid.
- 15. **TERMINATION:** This Agreement shall commence on the date executed and shall continue uninterrupted through October 31, 2023. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time upon the delivery of written notice to the other party no less **than 14 days** prior to the intended termination date, provided

however that in such event. the terminating Party agrees to act in good faith to assist the other party with the orderly wind-down of such party's work on any active and on-going assignment.

16. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** This Contract, including exhibits 1, 2, and 3, constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein and supersedes or replaces any and all prior negotiations, understandings and agreements, written or oral between the parties relating thereto.

WHEREAS, the proposed interlocal cooperative agreement would continue from the effective date as until such time as the crisis has been abated, the funds have been expended, and activities contemplated by the interlocal agreement have been completed.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1974 and other applicable law, the Mayor is authorized to execute an interlocal agreement between the City of Jackson, Mississippi and the Hinds County to provide \$500,000 to Hinds County to hire additional deputies to assist with public safety within the City of Jackson, Mississippi.



 Accordingly, the Foundation will not engage in earmarking any funds under this Agreement.
- 4. **Subgranting:** Subgranting occurs when Grantee provides Foundation funds in the form of a grant to one or more organizations that are selected by the Grantee. The Foundation retains no rights to select or veto ultimate recipients. Financial reporting on subgrants must be done on a cash basis.
- 5. Accounting and Audit: Grantee must maintain a separate accounting for this grant. This should be accomplished through the establishment of a separate general ledger account, fund or cost center. Grantee is encouraged to use all interest earned on grant funds to further the Project; however, a formal accounting of such income is not required. Grantee shall (i) maintain complete and accurate separate accounting, detailing receipts and expenditures made under the grant, and (ii) retain these records during the Grant Period and continuing at least four (4) years after receipt and acceptance of the final report. During this time, Grantee shall make such records available to the Foundation (or its designated representatives) for inspection or audit at the Foundation's expense and on reasonable notice to Grantee. The Foundation may also, at its expense and on reasonable notice to Grantee, monitor and evaluate operations under this grant, including on-site visits to observe Grantee's procedures and talk with Grantee's personnel.
- 6. Reporting: Within 45 days following the end of each Reporting Period, the Grantee will furnish to the Foundation program officer a report. The report will contain (i) a narrative report of what was accomplished by expenditure of the grant funds, (ii) an evaluation report and (iii) a financial statement reporting expenditures according to the approved grant budget. This reporting should be done using consistent accounting practices (cash or accrual) and should be certified only by an agent of the Grantee authorized to submit financial accounting on behalf of the Grantee. Failure to submit timely reports will result in delay in processing any subsequent payments to Grantee. A final report (which includes a narrative report and a financial statement of expenditures) is to be provided to the Foundation no later than three (3) months after the close of the final Reporting Period. Any unexpended funds remaining at the end of the final Reporting Period must be immediately returned to the Foundation, unless an extension has been approved in writing by the Foundation. Grantee agrees to provide the Foundation, upon request, a copy of all information relating to the results, findings or methods developed under the grant.
- 7. Evaluation: Evaluation is an essential integrated part of the Foundation's grantmaking, as we view evaluation as an important tool to track impact and to generate learning. For that, the Foundation supports Grantee's evaluation efforts to strengthen and/or build its internal organizational capacity to produce and use data and knowledge in advancing its work. The Foundation recommends that

Grantee consider developing an evaluation plan as a best practice so the evaluation activities and the reports will be guided by the plan. The evaluation reports created regarding the Project are to be submitted by the Grantee, in electronic format, along with Grantee's narrative and financial reports at the end of each Reporting Period.

- 8. Legal and Tax Requirements: Grantee represents and warrants to the Foundation that:
 - A. Grantee is an organization in good standing, is either a governmental unit or an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code ("Code"), and is not a "private foundation" within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the Code. Grantee will notify the Foundation immediately of any change in its tax status.
 - B. Grant funds may be expended only for charitable, educational, literary or scientific purposes. In no event will Grantee use grant funds or any income earned thereon:
 - a) To carry on propaganda or otherwise to attempt to influence legislation (within the meaning of Section 4945(d)(1) of the Code).
 - b) To influence the outcome of any specific public election or to carry on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive (within the meaning of Section 4945(d)(2) of the Code).
 - c) To make grants to individuals or to other organizations for travel, study or similar purpose that do not comply with the requirements of Section 4945(d)(3) or (4) of the Code.
 - d) To undertake any activity other than for a charitable, educational, literary or scientific purpose specified in Section 170(c)(2)(B) of the Code.
 - C. Grantee agrees that any subgrant utilizing funds from this grant must only be made to a governmental unit or an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and which is not a "private foundation" within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the Code.
 - D. No part of the grant can inure to the benefit of any private person or entity in violation of Section 501(c)(3) and 4941 of the Code, including, but not limited to, any Foundation trustee, officer, employee, or his/her spouse, children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren or their respective spouses for any purpose.
 - E. Any payments made to or on behalf of any United States government official (federal, state, or local) in connection with this grant shall be limited to actual transportation costs solely within the United States plus an amount for related expenses (hotel, meals, etc.) at a rate not exceeding the standard per diem rate established by the U.S. General Services Administration.
 - F. Grantee is permitted under all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, and policies, including those concerning government ethics, to conduct the Project under the terms and conditions of this Agreement and to accept and use resources from the Foundation for such purposes.
 - G. Grantee agrees to conduct the Project in a manner that complies with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, and policies.
 - H. Grantee has obtained all necessary approvals from State and City attorneys, ethics bodies, and other authorities necessary to ensure that it may conduct the Project under the terms and conditions of this Agreement and accept and use resources from the Foundation for such purposes.

- Communications between the Foundation and Grantee that are related to this Agreement or that
 are related to the Project do not constitute lobbying within the meaning of Mississippi Code.
 Annotated § 5-8-1.
- 9. Patriot Act Compliance: Grantee certifies that Foundation funds will be used in compliance with all applicable anti-terrorist financing and asset control laws, regulations, rules and executive orders including, but not limited to, the USA Patriot Act of 2001 and Executive Order No. 13224. Furthermore, Grantee agrees to ensure that any Foundation funds, either directly or through a subgrant, will not be disbursed to any organization or individual listed on the United States Government's Terrorist Exclusion List or the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) Specially Designated Nationals & Blocked Persons List. In addition, Grantee takes reasonable steps to ensure that its board, staff and subgrantees have no dealings whatsoever with known terrorist organizations.
- 10. Ownership and Royalties: Grantee and/or its subgrantee(s) will own all right, title and interest in and to all intellectual property, inventions, work products and works of authorship, including but not limited to literary and artistic works, products, materials, information and computer software, created or developed as a result of this grant (the "Developed Materials"). Grantee hereby grants to the Foundation, and shall ensure that each subgrantee grants to the Foundation, a perpetual, irrevocable, worldwide, royalty-free, non-exclusive right and license, with the right to grant sublicenses, to use, publish, distribute, display, perform, reproduce, copy, modify and prepare derivative works based upon the Developed Materials for non-commercial purposes. Grantee shall provide and cause each subgrantee to provide to the Foundation such further instruments as the Foundation may request to evidence, establish, maintain, or protect the Foundation's license rights. Any moneys realized by the Grantee or any subgrantee from sales or licenses of the intellectual property created or developed from this grant must be utilized exclusively for educational and charitable purposes and shall not inure to the personal benefit of any individual or noncharitable entity.
- 11. **Termination/Repayment of Grant Funds:** The Foundation reserves the right to discontinue funding and terminate the grant at any time if the Foundation determines, in its sole discretion, that: (i) it is not satisfied with the progress of the grant or the content of any written report, (ii) grant funds are not being used by Grantee or any subgrantee in an effective and efficient manner to further the grant's purpose or (iii) Grantee or any subgrantee has otherwise failed to comply with the terms of this Agreement. In the event the Foundation makes any such determination, the Foundation shall have the right to (i) discontinue any further payments to Grantee (under this or any other agreement the Foundation may have with Grantee), (ii) direct Grantee to repay to the Foundation any grant funds not used in accordance with this agreement and (iii) set-off any funds owing to the Foundation by Grantee under this agreement against funds the Foundation may owe Grantee under any other agreement.
- 12. **Release and Indemnity**: To the fullest extent permitted by law, Grantee shall release, indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Foundation and its directors, officers, trustees, employees, representatives and agents from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, damages, liabilities, injuries (personal or bodily), property damage, causes of action, losses, judgments, costs, expenses and penalties, including, without limitation, court costs and attorney's fees, arising out of (directly or indirectly) or related in any way to the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of Grantee or any Grantee director, officer, employee, subgrantee, contractor or agent in connection with this

grant or Project, except to the extent resulting from the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of the Foundation.

- 13. **Equal Opportunity**: The Foundation gives high priority to the realization of equality of opportunity for all members of society and strongly encourages diversity by the Grantee in all aspects of the Project and throughout all levels of the organization.
- 14. Assignment Clause: This Agreement, or any of the rights, obligations or funds awarded under this Agreement, may not be assigned without the Foundation's prior written consent. An assignment includes (i) any transfer of the Project; (ii) an assignment by operation of law, including a merger or consolidation; or (iii) the sale or transfer of all or substantially all of Grantee's assets.
- 15. **Use of Logo/Letterhead/Copyright:** The name, logo, letterhead or any item copyrighted by the Foundation may not be used by Grantee or any subgrantee without the written permission from the Foundation's communications department.
- 16. Governing Law and Compliance: This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Michigan, with jurisdiction in the State and Federal Courts of Michigan. Grantee and all subgrantees will comply with all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations.
- 17. Entire Agreement, Severability and Amendment: This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Foundation and the Grantee relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous negotiations, correspondence, understandings and agreements between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by mutual written consent of the parties. In the event of any conflicting terms between this Agreement and the Project, this Agreement will supersede and govern. The Foundation's waiver or failure to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement in one instance shall not constitute a waiver of its rights hereunder with respect to other violations of this Agreement.

INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

This Maintenance Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this <u>31</u> day of October 2023 ("Execution Date") between the City of Jackson, Mississippi (City) and Adopt a Charger, Inc. ("AAC").

RECITALS

- 1. Founded in 1812, Jackson is the capital of and the most populous city in Mississippi. The city is also one of the two count seats of Hinds County, along with Raymond County. Jackson is the anchor for the Jackson metropolitan statistical area, the largest metropolitan area completely within the state and the 10th largest urban area in the Depp South. With a 2020 population estimated around 600,000, metropolitan Jackson is home to over one-fifth of Mississippi's population. The city sits on the Pearl River and is located in the greater Jackson Prairie region of Mississippi.
- AAC is a nonprofit organization dedicated to finding and working with sponsors to install, and maintaining electric vehicle charging stations ("EVCS") at popular destination locations for public use.

IT IS THEREFORE agreed by and among AAC and the City as follows:

I. EVCS EQUIPMENT

- A. AAC will purchase and install Level 2 240 volt EVCS to be installed at mutually agreed upon locations in and around Jackson. AAC will pay all up-front cost for the installation, equipment, operation and maintenance for a 5 year period using grant funding from the Entergy Environmental Initiatives Fund. Upon installation, the charging stations will become the property of The City. The City will have no financial obligation to repay the equipment and installation costs.
- B. AAC will provide the City access to the site host dashboard software system to track utilization at the charging stations.
- C. AAC shall be responsible for installing additional EVCS, if the City decides to expand the program and applicable rebates are available.

II. THE CITY AND AAC OBLIGATIONS

- A. The City agrees to support the Adopt a Charger Program with the following services:
 - 1. The City will make agreed upon parking spaces available for the purpose of electric vehicle charging.
 - 2. If the City decides to upgrade other electrical in the vicinity for lights or security cameras, they will pay their share of the utility upgrade costs.
 - 3. The City agrees to designate the parking spaces for EV charging only.
 - 4. The City shall be responsible for all electricity costs incurred by the EVCS during the term of this Agreement ("Electricity Charges")
 - 5. If the City decides to recoup the cost of electricity, they will enter into a separate agreement with the Electric Vehicle Service Provider (EVSP), to monetize the charging.
 - 6. The City will stripe the parking spaces to identify them as EV Charging Only.
- B. AAC will provide the City with the following services (the "Services"):
 - 1. AAC shall pay 100% of the upfront costs of the project using the Entergy Environmental Initiatives Fund Grant.
 - 2. There is no obligation for the City to contribute to any costs not covered by the ADEQ rebate.
 - 3. AAC will provide and install all necessary regulatory signage.

III. GRANT OF RIGHTS

- A. AAC may use the Jackson logo and trademarks for promotion of the program, subject in each case to prior approval. The City's Logo shall at all times remain their exclusive property. The City reserves the right to withdraw this authority for AAC's use of the Logo at any time if such use is not consistent with the terms of this Agreement or if, in the City's sole judgment, such use may be harmful in any way, whereupon AAC shall cease all use of Logo immediately. The City represents and warrants that such approved use will not violate or infringe upon any rights of any kind or nature whatsoever, including without limitation copyright, rights of privacy or publicity, or trademark or servicemark rights, of any person or entity.
- B. The City may use/display AAC logo and promotional material, if any (collectively, for promotion by the City, subject in each case to prior approval by AAC. AAC's Logo shall at all times remain AAC's exclusive property. AAC reserves the right to withdraw this authority for City's use of Logo at any time if such use is not

consistent with the terms of this Agreement or if, in AAC's judgment, such use may be harmful to in any way, whereupon the City shall cease all use of Logo immediately. AAC represents and warrants that such approved use will not violate or infringe upon any rights of any kind or nature whatsoever of any person or entity, including without limitation copyright, rights of privacy or publicity, or trademark or servicemark rights.

IV. MAINTENANCE

- A. AAC will contract with Lavallee Services for maintenance of EVCS for the period of 5 years.
 - 1. Lavallee will list a toll free number on each EVSE unit to report problems.
 - 2. Lavallee will respond to any reported problems within 72 hours and make necessary repairs to EVCS.

V. TERM

The term of this Agreement is for five (5) years, commencing on the Execution Date and terminating five calendar years after the Execution Date (the "Expiration Date").

VI. INDEMNIFICATION

AAC and the City agree, jointly and severally, to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend the City, and their respective trustees, officers, employees and affiliates from and against any and all claims, liabilities, damages, and expenses (including without limitation attorneys' fees) incurred in connection with or arising from the use of the EVCS by visitors or staff.

VII. INSURANCE

AAC will maintain the following minimum insurance coverages: Commercial general liability insurance in the amount of \$1 million and workers compensation insurance as required under California law. AAC hereby waives all rights of recovery against the City of Jackson, its trustees, officers, employees, and subcontractors for damages arising out of or incurred in connection with this Agreement.

VIII. TERMINATION

Any party may terminate this Agreement upon 30 days' written notice to the other parties, with or without cause. The City shall be responsible for, and shall pay all Electricity Charges, up to the date of termination as specified in the notice of termination.

IX. NOTICES

A. Any notices that any party is required or permitted to give under or in connection with this Agreement must be in writing. All notices must be hand delivered, sent by fax with a copy sent by U.S. Mail postage prepaid, or sent by overnight delivery service or registered or certified mail, return receipt requested. Notice will be effective at the time of receipt by the receiving party if personally served, at the time of faxing if faxed with a copy sent by U.S. Mail, or on the day that is one day after mailing or delivering by overnight delivery service.

X. NO CONTINUING OBLIGATIONS

Except as provided in this Agreement, neither AAC nor the City of Jackson shall have any continuing obligations, liability, cost or expense with respect to each EVSE upon expiration of this Agreement.

XI. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. Each party represents and warrants that it has the right, authority, and capacity to enter into this Agreement and to provide the services set forth herein in compliance with the terms of this Agreement, for the entire term of this Agreement.
- B. The City may not transfer or assign this Agreement. AAC may not transfer or assign its rights, nor delegate its obligations under this Agreement to a third party, without the prior written approval of the City.

- C. Failure by any party at any time to require performance by the other party of any provision does not in any way affect the right to require full performance at any later time, nor does the waiver by either party of a breach of any provision of this Agreement constitute a waiver of any succeeding breach of same or any other provision, nor constitute a waiver of the provision itself.
- D. This Agreement is to be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Mississippi.
- E. The partial or complete invalidity of any one or more provisions of this Agreement will not affect the validity or continuing force and effect of any other provision.
- F. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to make the parties partners or joint venturers. Further, nothing in this Agreement makes one party the agent of the other, and no party has the power or authority to bind the other.
- G. Any modification of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all of the parties.
- H. Each party represents and warrants that it has the right, power, and authority to execute this Agreement and perform this Agreement in accordance with its terms.
- I. The parties agree that any dispute between them arising out of, based upon or relating to this Agreement will be resolved exclusively by arbitration conducted in accordance with the Commercial Rules of the American Arbitration Association then in effect. The prevailing party in such arbitration shall be awarded reasonable attorney fees, to be fixed by the arbitration, and its costs of arbitration.
- J. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same Agreement.
- K. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and all prior understandings, agreements, and contracts, if not contained herein, are of no force and effect. This Agreement is intended to supersede all prior agreements or understandings of the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.

ACT OF DONATION

This Act of Donation ("<u>Agreement</u>") is made by and between Entergy Services, LLC "<u>Donor</u>"), a Louisiana limited liability corporation, and the Adopt A Charger ("<u>Donee</u>"), an IRC § 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, effective as of the date of full and final execution below (the "<u>Effective Date</u>").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, Donor has established the "Environmental Initiatives Fund" to support environmentally beneficial projects with an emphasis on climate change mitigation, solutions, and sustainability (the "Fund"); and

WHEREAS, Donee has requested that Donor make a charitable contribution to Donee to so that Donee may fund its Charge Up! Program for EV charging installations at high profile locations in the Jackson, Mississippi metro area ("the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Donor has agreed to make a charitable contribution to Donee under the terms and conditions provided herein.

NOW THEREFORE, Donor and Donee agree as follows:

AGREEMENT:

1. <u>Donation</u>. Donor agrees to give to Donee the amount of One Hundred and Sixty Thousand (\$160,000) Dollars. The payment(s) made by Donor to Donee are sometimes referred to herein as the "<u>Donation</u>."

2. Permitted Uses: Donee Obligations.

Donee also shall provide other information, in Donee's possession or available to Donee, related to Project and/or the Donation requested by Donor from time to time.

2.3 Upon request by Donor, Donee agrees to participate in public announcements and events with representatives of Donor to promote the program and to recognize accomplishments in the media and with business and community leaders.

3. Indemnity.

- 3.1 Donee agrees to indemnify and hold Donor harmless against any and all claims, demands, suits and judgments that may be asserted for damages for loss or liability on account of injuries to (including death of) persons or damage to property and including costs and expenses incidental thereto, arising wholly or in part from, or in connection with, Donee's use of the Donation and/or related to the Project. Donee also agrees to indemnify and hold Donor harmless against any and all claims or demands by any third parties used by Donee to provide or perform any work in connection with the Project.
- 3.2 If suit is brought against Donor to recover for, or on account of, any matter provided for in Section 3.1 above, Donee shall, at Donor's request, and at Donor's option, appear and defend said suit, with counsel reasonably acceptable to Donor, at Donee's sole cost and expense, whether or not well-founded, and will pay any judgment that may be entered therein against Donor or Donee, or both. The indemnification of Donor by Donee hereunder shall include but not be limited to the reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs incurred by Donor or on Donor's behalf in connection with any such suit, claim, demand or judgment. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, Donee shall not indemnify Donor for Donor's gross negligence or intentional misconduct. The word "Donee" as used in Section 3.1 above shall include Donee's agents, contractors, subcontractors, representatives, servants, employees, invitees, successors, subsidiaries, affiliates or assigns, and the word "Donor" as used in this Section 3 shall include Donor, Donor's affiliated and associated companies, and the officers, directors, shareholders, agents, employees, representatives, licensees, invitees (express or implied) of each and their heirs, successors and assigns. The provisions of this Section 3 shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Faithful Performance: Termination</u>. The Donation is given on condition that Donee faithfully complies with all terms and conditions specified in this Agreement.
- 5. Records. Donee shall, for at least three (3) years after the completion of the Project, keep and maintain such time and other records or accounts of Donee as are necessary to verify and support any and all charges paid for using the Donation. This includes verification that any and all material, services, labor, and other expenses incurred for the Project have been paid. All books and records shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Such books and records shall be made available, on mutually agreeable dates and times, at Donee's facility in the United States for verification, copying, audit and inspection by representatives of Donor. Any such audit shall be at Donor's expense and conducted during the Donee's normal working hours; provided, however, that Donee shall provide reasonable assistance necessary to enable Donor to conduct such audit and shall not be entitled to charge Donor for any such assistance.

6. Miscellaneous Provisions.

- 6.1 No Assignability. This Agreement shall not be assigned by Donee.
- 6.2 Governing Law. This Agreement is to be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana.
