### **Items 3.1**

The Public Hearing was held on Tuesday, September 3, 2024. Section 102.006 of the Local Government Code requires the governing body to provide notice and hold a public hearing on the proposed budget. Notice of the budget public hearing date was provided to the public by publication in the Williamson County Sun. Section 102.007 of the Local Government Code requires the governing body to take action on the proposed budget at the conclusion of the budget public hearing.

The budget must be adopted on or prior to September 15). The Council may make any changes to the budget prior to adoption. The adoption of the budget motion can be a simple stated motion to approve Ordinance No. 2024-0911-01 and requires a record vote from each Councilmember, where the Mayor calls on each Councilmember individually.

**Item 3.2:** After adoption of the budget, the Council will need to take a separate vote to ratify the property tax increase reflected in the budget, even though the property tax rate is decreasing. This vote is separate from the vote to set the tax rate. This vote does not need to be a record vote and can be made with a simple motion to "Approve Ordinance No. 2024-0911-02 to ratify the property tax increase reflected in the budget."

**Item 3.3:** Texas Property Tax Code 26.05(b) requires the tax rate be set by an ordinance and approved by 60 percent of the City Council through a record vote. The language required for this motion is specifically outline in the Property Tax Code, "I move that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$.394004, which is effectively a 4.48% increase in the



tax rate." A record vote is required. This vote is the final action required for the budget and must occur after the two votes outlined above.

Please note that our agreement with the Tax Assessor/Collector's Office requires that we set our tax rate by September 15<sup>th</sup>. If the Council decides to delay the adoption of the budget and the subsequent votes on the tax rate, they are required to set a date for adoption of the budget for September 15 or earlier.

**Recommendation:**

Staff recommends approval of the budget with any changes desired by the City Council and adoption of a tax rate of \$0.394004. Since the Council previously set a maximum proposed tax rate of \$0.394004, the rate cannot be set higher than this amount, but it can be set as a lower rate. The budget would need to be adjusted accordingly.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-0911-01

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, FOR THE 2024-2025 FISCAL YEAR, BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, FOR SUCH FISCAL YEAR; APPROPRIATING MONEY TO A SINKING FUND TO PAY PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON THE CITY'S INDEBTEDNESS; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, OPEN MEETINGS AND EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the City of Jarrell is responsible for conducting city financial business as specified by Federal and State law; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the City of Jarrell, must establish a budget before any funds may be spent on City needs; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Manager of the City of Jarrell has submitted to the City Council a proposed Budget (the "Budget") of the revenues of the City and the expenses of conducting the affairs thereof and providing a complete financial plan for the ensuing fiscal year, beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has received a copy of the proposed Budget and information supporting the same, which has been filed with the City Secretary; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Section 102.006 of the Texas Local Government Code, a public hearing was held giving all interested taxpayers an opportunity to be heard for or against any item or amount therein; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Jarrell is of the opinion that the proposed Budget should be approved and adopted as the City's Budget for the ensuing fiscal year;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, THAT:**

**Section 1. Findings of Fact.** The facts and recitations contained in the preamble of this ordinance are hereby found and declared to be true and correct, and incorporated by reference herein and expressly made a part hereof as if copied herein verbatim.

**Section 2. Prerequisites Satisfied.** The City Council of the City of Jarrell (the “City Council”) hereby finds that all of the prerequisites to the creation and adoption of a Budget for this City for the fiscal year 2024-2025, (including, without limitation, certifications, notices, submittals, and public hearings) as required by law have been complied with.

**Section 3. Approved Budget.** The Budget, as shown in words and figures in Exhibit A, is hereby approved in all respects and adopted as the City’s Budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025.

**Section 4. Appropriations.** The appropriations for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025, for the support of the general government of the City of Jarrell, Texas, be fixed and determined for said terms in accordance with the expenditures shown in the City’s Fiscal year 2024-2025 Budget, a copy of which is appended hereto as Exhibit A.

**Section 5. Sinking Fund Appropriations.** The amount shown in said budget necessary to provide for a sinking fund for the payment of the principal and interest and the retirement of bonded debt requirements is hereby appropriated for the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 of the City of Jarrell, Texas.

**Section 6. Repealing Conflicting Ordinances.** All ordinance and resolutions, or parts of ordinances and resolutions, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, and are no longer of any force and effect.

**Section 7.** Pursuant to Texas Local Government Code §102.007, the motion to adopt this ordinance must be a record vote; which is reflected below:

This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget by an amount of \$283,659 (11.39%), and of that amount \$135,681.15 is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.

**Section 9. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption of its reading by the City Council of the City of Jarrell, Texas.

**Section 10. Open Meeting.** That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meetings at which this ordinance was passed were open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meetings were given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Local Government Code.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2023-0911-02

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, RATIFYING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024/2025 AS A RESULT OF THE CITY RECEIVING MORE REVENUE FROM PROPERTY TAXES THAN THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, following public notice duly posted and published in all things as required by law, a public hearing was held, by and before the City Council of the City of Jarrell, the subject of which was the proposed budget for the City of Jarrell for Fiscal Year 2024/2025;

**WHEREAS**, the Budget as adopted raises more revenue from property taxes than was raised from property taxes in the previous year;

**WHEREAS**, the tax rate will increase total tax revenues from properties on the tax roll in the preceding tax year by 4.48%;

**WHEREAS**, Texas Local Government Code Section 102.007 (c) requires the City ratify the Budget by a separate vote; and

**WHEREAS**, a vote under this subsection is in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or a vote to set the tax rate required by Chapter 26, Tax Code, or other law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JARRELL THAT:**

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Section 102.007(c) of the Texas Local Government Code, the governing body of a municipality is required to take a separate vote to ratify the property tax increase reflected in the City budget.

Based on the Tax Rate of \$0.394004 per \$100 assessed valuation, the City Council hereby ratifies the adoption of a budget for Fiscal Year 2024/2025 which results in an increase of revenues from property taxes than the previous year, with the following declaration: **THIS BUDGET WILL RAISE MORE REVENUE FROM PROPERTY TAXES THAN LAST YEAR'S BUDGET BY AN AMOUNT OF \$283,659.00, WHICH IS A 11.39% PERCENT INCREASE FROM LAST YEAR'S BUDGET. THE PROPERTY TAX REVENUE TO BE RAISED**

Severability.** It is hereby declared that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this ordinance, because the same would have been enacted by the city council without the incorporation of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

**SECTION 3.** All ordinances and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed insofar as they conflict herewith.

**SECTION 4. Adoption.** It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

**SECTION 5. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its adoption and it is accordingly so ordained.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-0911-03

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, LEVYING AD VALOREM TAXES FOR USE AND SUPPORT OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS, FOR THE 2024-2025 TAX YEAR; PROVIDING FOR APPORTIONING EACH LEVY FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES; PROVIDING WHEN TAXES SHALL BECOME DUE AND WHEN SAME SHALL BECOME DELINQUENT IF NOT PAID; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, OPEN MEETINGS AND EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that the Williamson County Appraisal District have prepared, certified, and submitted to the tax assessor/collector the appraisal roll of the City of Jarrell, Texas (the “City”) for 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that the 2024 certified appraisal roll represents the total appraised, assessed and taxable value of all property and the total taxable value of new property within the City as \$34,436,490; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds the tax rate to be levied for 2024 (fiscal year 2025) set by this ordinance is based on the appraisal roll and is sufficient to provide the tax revenues required by the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds all required notices have been issued and all required hearings have occurred in accordance with Texas law permitting this tax levy; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that this Ordinance is in compliance with Texas Tax Code §26.05(b)(1) by including the following statement:

**“THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR’S TAX RATE.”**

**“THIS TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY -23.43% PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY -\$74.95.”**

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that this Ordinance is in compliance with Texas Tax Code §26.05(b)(2) by directing the City Secretary to place the following on the homepage of the City’s website:

“THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR’S TAX RATE.”

“THIS TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY -23.43% PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY -\$74.95.”

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JARRELL, TEXAS:

**Section 1.** There is hereby levied an ad valorem tax of \$ 0.394004 on each \$100.00 of property within the City which is not exempt from taxation under the State constitution or State law. The general fund operating portion of the tax is \$0.244941. The debt service portion of the tax is \$ 0.149063.

**Section 2.** The City’s tax assessor/collector is hereby authorized to assess and collect the taxes of the City employing the above tax rate.

**Section 3.** The taxes levied hereby are due presently and shall be delinquent if not paid by January 2025.
