



Proclamation

WHEREAS, on June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress adopted a Resolution stating that the "Flag of the United States be thirteen alternate stripes of red and white" and that the "Union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation"; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 1877, the first Flag Day observance was held on the 100th anniversary of the adoption of the Stars & Stripes; and

WHEREAS, in 1949, Congress officially designated June 14th as Flag Day, a National Day of observance and signed into law by President Harry Truman; and

WHEREAS, the concept for the annual National Pause for the Pledge of Allegiance originated in 1980 at the Star Spangled Banner Flag House in Baltimore, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 1985, the 99th Congress passed and President Reagan signed Public Law 9954 recognizing the pause for the pledge of allegiance as part of the National Flag Day activities; and

WHEREAS, June 14, 2021 marks the 244th birthday of our Nation's flag, the Stars & Stripes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rhonda Stell, do hereby proclaim June 14, 2021, as
"Flag Day"**

**in Johnson City, Texas and hereby welcome all citizens to celebrate our
community and our Nation's flag.**

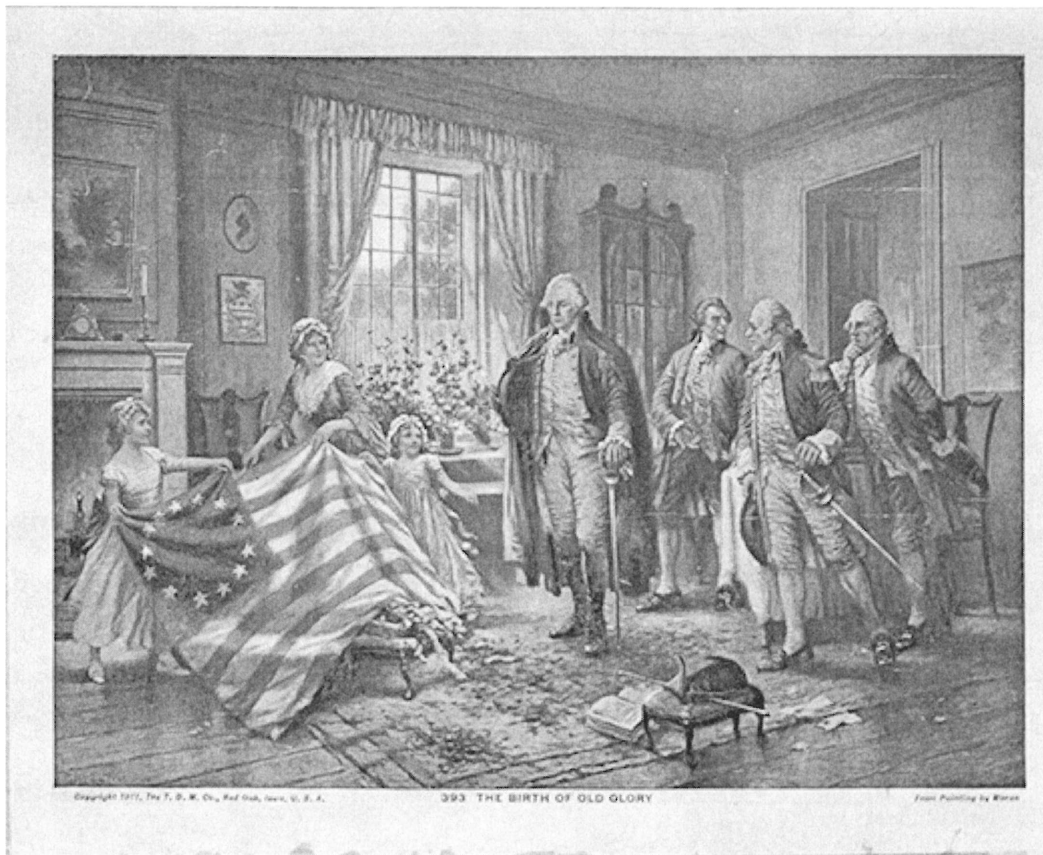

Flag Day

On **June 14**, 1777, the Continental Congress approved the design of a national flag.

Since 1916, when President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation establishing a national Flag Day on June 14, Americans have commemorated the adoption of the Stars and Stripes in many ways—displaying the flag in the front of their homes, parades, and other patriotic observances. Prior to 1916, many localities and a few states had been celebrating the day for years. Congressional legislation designating that date as the national Flag Day was signed into law by President Harry Truman in 1949; the legislation also called upon the president to issue a flag day proclamation every year.

According to legend, in 1776, George Washington commissioned Philadelphia seamstress Betsy Ross to create a flag for the new nation. Scholars, however, credit the flag's design to Francis Hopkinson, who also designed the Great Seal and first coin of the United States. Even so, Ross most likely met Washington and certainly sewed early American flags in her family's Philadelphia upholstery shop. To date, there have been twenty-seven official versions of the flag, but the arrangement of the stars varied according to the flag-makers' preferences until 1912 when President Taft standardized the then-new flag's forty-eight stars into six rows of eight. The forty-nine-star flag (1959-60), as well as the fifty-star flag, also have standardized star patterns. The current version of the flag dates to July 4, 1960, after Hawaii became the fiftieth state on August 21, 1959.

Interviews in American Life Histories: Manuscripts from the Federal Writers' Project, 1936 to 1940 contain entertaining examples of Flag Day in the American vernacular. For example, a search on *Flag Day* retrieves the following conversation between Mr. Richmond and Mr. Davis:

"Why ain't you got your flag out?" says Mr. Richmond, entering the gas station in which he spends much of his time these days. "You know today is flag day, don't you?"

"I guess the boss forgot to buy a flag, George," says Mr. Davis, the station attendant. "And even if we had one, we ain't got no place to put it."

Mr. Richmond: "That's a fine state of affairs, that is. Here they are tryin' to bring home to you people the fact that you're livin' in one of the few countries where you can draw a free breath and you don't even know it. You're supposed to have flags out all this week. Don't you know that? This is flag day and this is flag week. Where's your patriotism?"

Mr. Davis: "What the hell are you hollerin' about, George? You're always runnin' the country down. They can't do anything to suit you. You're worryin' about taxes and future generations and all like that. Where's your patriotism?"

Mr. Richmond: "Well, that's different. A man got a right to criticize. That's free speech. Don't mean I ain't patriotic."

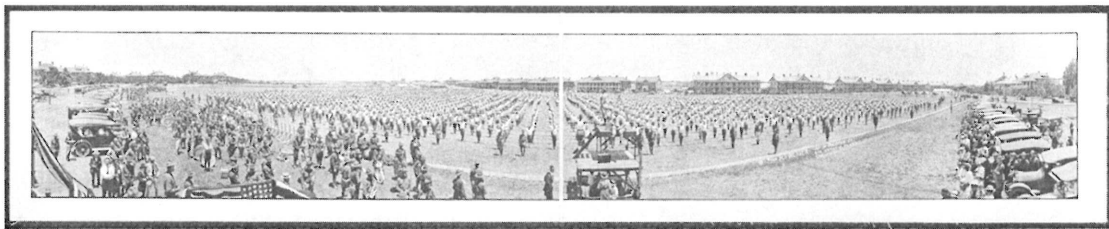

"I do not salute the flag because I have promised to do the will of God," wrote ten-year-old Billy Gobitas, a Jehovah's Witness, to the board of the Minersville (Pennsylvania) School District in 1935. Like most public school students at the time, Gobitas was required to salute and pledge allegiance to the flag daily. His refusal to do so touched off one of several constitutional battles over the

authority of the state to require respect for national symbols and the right of individuals to freedom of speech.

Both the United States district court and the court of appeals ruled in favor of the right to refuse to salute the flag. In 1940, however, the U.S. Supreme Court decided the government did have the authority to compel respect for the flag as a central symbol of national unity. Just three years later, on **June 14**, 1943, the Supreme Court reconsidered its earlier decision, holding that the right of free speech guaranteed by the First Amendment denies the government the authority to compel individuals to salute the American flag or to recite the pledge of allegiance.

Billy Gobitas' letter is also displayed (in color) in the online exhibition, American Treasures of the Library of Congress. Other related treasures include Francis Scott Key's "Star-Spangled Banner" and John Philip Sousa's "The Stars and Stripes Forever."

On May 8th Sgt. Garrett Scallorn responded to the Oak Forest Subdivision in reference to a reported vehicle burglary. While investigating the first complaint Sgt. Scallorn was notified of three other residents in the same subdivision who also had their vehicles entered and items taken from inside. Upon completion of these calls Sgt. Scallorn responded to two more burglaries near the intersection of Pecan Dr. and Ave N. In total six victims were identified during this spree. Sgt Scallorn attempted to locate latent fingerprints off several vehicles but was unsuccessful at finding any. He later located a resident who had CCTV surveillance video of what appeared to be two males

attempting to open vehicle doors. This video shows the suspects wearing masks and gloves and driving a dark colored passenger car. The investigation into this case is ongoing and he has reached out to other agencies in our area who had similar crimes occur before and after Johnson City was targeted.

On May 9th Officer Michael Pavlov was requested to assist The Hays County Sheriff's Office with a Vehicle Pursuit that entered Blanco County on 290 East. Officer Pavlov set up to deploy spike strips in the 100 Block of US HWY 290 east and made a successful hit on the fleeing vehicle as it past his location. The vehicle came to a stop in the driveway of Miller Creek RV Park where an adult male and juvenile male were taken into custody by Hays County Deputies.

On May 19th Officer Chad Wiggins and I responded to the Hill Country Inn in reference to a subject not breathing. When we arrived, we located a male subject lying outside of room 106 deceased. Our preliminary investigation has revealed no signs of foul play. The deceased is believed to have died of natural causes but due to the age and location of the body being found an autopsy was requested by our agency. JP 1 Judge Randy Brodbeck agreed, and his office has begun an inquest. The decedent was transported to Central Texas Autopsy in Lockhart, Texas for examination. We are currently awaiting those results. After speaking with the family, we learned the subject had history of drug use and alcoholism that began when he was a teenager. I will keep the Council updated as we receive information on this case.

Judge and I are now studying how to properly execute FTAs, so we can start issuing these. We are just trying to “cross our T’s and dot our I’s” to make sure nothing can bite us back later.

We will not have a Docket in June, and will condense them into July’s Docket. This is due to Judge and I having conflicting times with our upcoming Seminars.

We are closing out May (still pending on May 26) with the City’s incoming collections totaling \$7332.25 after the State’s remittance. We disposed of 39 cases, so far. We started the month with 1322 pending cases, and ending with 1318.
