Personnel

During the month of January, we completed the background investigation of Kristopher Greenhill for the open full-time Police Officer position. A conditional offer of employment was given to him which he accepted. Officer Greenhill will start on 01-29-2022. He comes to us with 15+ years of experience. Officer Greenhill currently works part-time with the Comal County Fire Marshalls Office. We welcome him to our department and know he will be a great fit to the Johnson City Community.

Public Safety

On 01-28-2022, Officer Chad Wiggins was conducting stationary traffic enforcement in the 700 Block of US HWY 281 when he radared a northbound vehicle at 90 mph in the posted 55 mph zone. Officer Wiggins stopped the vehicle and upon speaking with the driver observed signs of possible intoxication. As Officer Wiggins continued to investigate, he developed enough probable cause to arrest the driver for driving while intoxicated. After the arrest the driver agreed to submitting an alcohol breath test. The results of the test indicated that the driver's BAC was 4 times the legal limit of .08.

Training Strategy 2022

For the 2022 calendar year, the Johnson City Police Department strives to be the best trained department in Blanco County. During this calendar year, I have asked for each officer to send me trainings they wish to attend and to find an area of law enforcement they would like to focus on. The law enforcement training this year will include individual officer classes, as well as mandatory TCOLE training and classes that I, as the Police Chief, feel will benefit the department.

Officer Ethan Bishop will be attending New Detectives School in San Antonio on February 1st-3rd.

Officer Jessica Oestreich will continue to train in the area of Code Enforcement and work towards obtaining her Intermediate License. She completed Crisis Intervention Training in Burnet, TX January 24th-27th.

Officer Michael Pavlov has expressed interest in learning more about Criminal Interdiction and Narcotics Investigations.

Lt. Garrett Scallorn will attend the De-Escalation Course, as well as the Command Staff Leadership Series, at the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas. As the department's Investigator he seeks to attend classes that will further his knowledge in the investigation of crimes.

Officer Chad Wiggins has not advised me of any classes he wishes to attend at this time.

I continue to seek law enforcement administration classes on a regular basis.

All Officer's will complete the following classes, as required by TCOLE, during this training cycle:

De-Escalation Techniques #1849, May 26th, 2022 and July 7th, 2022 in San Antonio

CPR Training:

- Course 3845 (2-16 hours)
- Would support officers in their duty to render aid under HB 3712 and SB 2212

Trauma-Informed Sexual Assault Investigations:

- Either Course 470 via MyTCOLE or Course 4070 in-person
- Supports the work of the Governor's Sexual Assault Survivors Task Force

Approaching Alzheimer's: First Responder Training

- Currently free on the Alzheimer's Association website and it generates a certificate until we are able to work out an agreement with them to post it on MyTCOLE
- Can be reported under course number 3908, Law Enforcement and the Elderly (1-100 hours)
