## Public Safety

On the 7<sup>th</sup>, Officer Kris Greenhill was patrolling the city when he saw a truck parked at one of the 7-11 gas pumps with its hood up. As Officer Greenhill drove into the parking lot, he noticed the vehicle had two different license plates on the front and rear. After running both plates, he found out the front plate belonged to a different vehicle and the rear plates registration had expired in 2020. Officer Greenhill then noted that the windshield sticker displayed a July 2022 expiration. The culmination of these facts leads him to further investigate, and he contacted the driver. When officer Greenhill was able to gather the driver's information, he was notified by Blanco County Dispatch that the driver had two felony warrants out of Hays County for credit card abuse. Officer Greenhill placed the driver into custody and upon searching the vehicle incident to arrest he located illegal narcotics and an illegal firearm which was a 12-gauge shotgun with the barrel sawed off.

On the 16<sup>th</sup>, Officer Kris Greenhill received a call from Blanco County Communication about a possible intoxicated driver traveling north on US Hwy 281 into Johnson City. Officer Greenhill observed the vehicle pass him in the 400 block of HWY 281 and he turned around on the vehicle to watch the driving behavior and make a traffic stop. As Officer Greenhill caught up to the vehicle it pulled into the 7-11 parking lot and stopped at one of the gas pumps. Officer Greenhill contacted the driver and noticed signs of possible impairment. As Officer Greenhill continued to investigate a potential DWI crime it became apparent that the driver was not going to cooperate. Officer Greenhill made the decision to place the driver under arrest. It was at this time that the driver resisted his attempts at placing him in handcuff and scuffle ensued. For two minutes Officer Greenhill attempted to gain control of the suspect to effect an arrest. Officer Greenhill deployed his department issued Taser and used it in a drive stun method to effectively gain compliance of the suspect and placed him into custody. Officer Greenhill transported the suspect to the Blanco County Jail where he obtained a search warrant for the driver blood. The blood specimen has been submitted to the Texas DPS Crime Lab for analysis. Neither the suspect nor Officer Greenhill were hurt during this incident. Lt. Scallorn and I have reviewed all dash and body worn camera footage of this incident and per JCPD's Use of Force Policy, no violations were observed.

On June 18<sup>th</sup> Officer Michael Pavlov received a call of a physical disturbance at 112 Schofield Ave. Officer Pavlov and several Blanco County Sheriff's Deputy's arrived and after speaking with other residents oof the trailer park determined that the disturbance was taking place in trailer located in spot 8W. Two Blanco Deputy's made there way to this trailer and upon contacting the resident saw sign that an assault had occurred.

When they entered the home, they were confronted by a male subject who immediately became combative and assaulted law enforcement. Two Sheriff's Deputy's and Officer Pavlov deployed Tasers which had no effect on the suspect. Another Deputy deployed OC (Pepper) Spray in the suspects face and they were able to detain him. North Blanco County EMS was called to the scene to evaluate two female victims who were assaulted by the male. The suspect was later seen by EMS personnel prior to me transporting him to the jail for pepper spray decontamination and booking. The suspect was charged with Family Violence Assault, Assault FV Strangulation by JCPD. It is my understanding that Blanco County Sheriff's Office has also charged the suspect with two counts of Assault on a Peace Officer. No officer was hurt during this incident. The Use of Force during this incident were deemed acceptable by all law enforcement agencies who investigated.
