North Blanco EMS completed the blood draw. After the blood draw, the suspect was released to the Blanco County Jail. This sample has been submitted to the Texas DPS Crime Lab for analysis. On January 21st Officer Greenhill was on patrol near the south city limits when he observed a northbound vehicle turning its headlights on and off several times. With it being dark Officer Greenhill stopped the vehicle to speak to the driver. During his interview he smelled an odor consistent with alcohol coming from the driver, so he investigated further. After completing standardized field sobriety tests Officer Greenhill believed that the driver was impaired and made an arrest. The driver was taken to the Blanco County Jail where a she agreed to submit a breath sample. It was later determined that the breath test machine, which is maintained by Texas DPS was broken so a legal breath sample not able to be taken. Suspect was released to the Blanco County jail.
