Discussion of and action on a Zoning Amendment Application from Mr. David Conlon for a Conditional Use Permit for the construction / installation of a residential structure to house Tech Con Trenching, Inc. employees located at 512 N. U.S. Hwy. 281, Johnson City, Texas 78636, property more particularly described as BCAD Property ID No. 9059. (Applicant)
 - Councilmember Coleman motioned to approve the application and include the conditions recommended by the planning and zoning committee which include one (1) single building with five (5) units, the placement of the building must coincide with the provided map, and the structure be affixed to the ground.
- 13. Discussion of and action on a request by Andrew Creel, P.E., on behalf of Hill Country Wireless & Technology, for a variance to Municipal Code of Ordinances Chapter 10 Subdivision Regulation, Appendix B Design Standards and Specifications Manual, Section 1.6 Utilities to be Underground requiring that all utilities within a residential

development be placed underground and related to the placement of five (5) new communications poles along and within N. Winters Furr right-of-way for the purposes of installing new fiber optic cable. (Applicant)

Councilmember Coleman motioned to approve the variance request. Councilmember Babb seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion was approved.

- 14. Discussion of and action on the selection of one of the following applicants to the City of Johnson City Planning and Zoning Commission:

 - Amy Crowson. (Mayor Fisher)

Councilmember Dildine motioned to appoint Tricia Keith to the Planning and Zoning Commission. Councilmember Guthrie seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

- 15. Discussion of and action on the following policies and procedures for the City of Johnson City, Texas:

Councilmember Coleman motioned to approve the policies and procedures with the addition of the 90-day requirement for passwords in the IT Access and Recovery Policy. Councilmember Babb seconded the motion. All were in favor and the item was approved.

16. Discussion of and action on monument letter painting related to the restoration of the James Polk Johnson Cemetery located near the intersection of W. Pecan Dr. and N. Ave. L. (Staff)

Councilmember Babb motioned to approve the monument letter painting and to allow the monument company to decide on which monuments to paint. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion. All were in favor and the item was approved.

17. Discussion of and direction on Municipal Code of Ordinances Chapter 2 Animal Control, including, but not limited to, the number of dogs and/or cats allowed on an individual parcel or within a residential unit and animal nuisances, such as excessive, continuous, or untimely barking. (Mayor Fisher)

The council directed staff to amend the Municipal Code of Ordinances Chapter 2 *Animal Control*, the restrict the number of animals based on lot size.

Councilmember Dildine made the motion to approve an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas making appropriations for the support of the City of Johnson City for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024; appropriating money to a sinking fund to pay the interest and principal of the City's indebtedness; adopting the annual Budget(s) of the City of Johnson City for the 2023 – 2024 Fiscal Year; authorizing personnel positions and salaries; setting the 2023 – 2024 holiday schedule for City employees; authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer to expend monies and sign documents in accordance with said Budget(s); incorporating recitals; providing for severability; repealing any other Code provisions, ordinances, or parts of ordinances, and other provisions in conflict herewith; and setting an effective date. The motion was approved.

19. Discussion of and action on an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas levying an ad valorem (property) tax rate for the Tax Year 2023 in the amount of \$0.356900 cents per one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation and directing the Blanco County Appraisal District to assess, account for, and distribute the ad valorem (property) taxes as herein levied; authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer to take all necessary steps to implement the provisions of this Ordinance; incorporating recitals; providing for severability; repealing any other Code provisions, ordinances, or parts of ordinances, and other provisions in conflict herewith; and setting an effective date. (Staff)

Councilmember Dildine moved that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.356900 per \$100 valuation, which is effectively a 14.87% increase in the tax rate. This motion includes:

- 1) the adoption of an ad valorem (property) tax rate for the Maintenance and Operations expenditures of the City of Johnson City at \$0.208500 cents per \$100 valuation for the Tax Year beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023; and
- 2) the adoption of an ad valorem (property) tax rate for the principal and interest payable on the Interest and Sinking (debt service) expenditures of the City of Johnson City at \$0.148400 cents per \$100 valuation for the Tax Year beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023.

Councilmember Coleman seconded the motion.

20. Discussion of and action on an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas ratifying the adoption of the fiscal year (FY) 2023 – 2024 Municipal budget(s) raising more revenue from ad valorem (property) taxes due to increased property valuations and the addition of real property to the tax roll than in the FY 2022 – 2023 Municipal budget(s); authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer to take all necessary steps to implement the provisions of this Ordinance; incorporating recitals; providing for severability; repealing any other Code provisions, ordinances, or parts of ordinances, and other provisions in conflict herewith; and setting an effective date. (Staff)

Councilmember Coleman motioned to approve an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas ratifying the adoption of the fiscal year (FY) 2023 – 2024 Municipal budget(s) raising more revenue from ad valorem (property) taxes due to increased property valuations and the addition of real property to the tax roll than in the FY 2022 – 2023 Municipal budget(s); authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer to take all necessary steps to implement the provisions of this Ordinance; incorporating recitals; providing for severability; repealing any other Code provisions, ordinances, or parts of ordinances, and other provisions in conflict herewith; and setting an effective date. Councilmember Babb seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion was approved.

21. Discussion of and action on an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas establishing and amending fees, costs, and fines charged by the City of Johnson City; adopting savings, repealer, and penalty clauses; and adopting an effective date. (Staff)

Councilmember Babb motioned to approve the fee schedule as presented with the addition of a \$100 per day fee for the use of the softball field and a 50% discount for non-profit use with an IRS determination letter and to approve other suggestions as stated. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion. All were in favor and the item was approved.

22. Discussion of and action on a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas regarding a financing agreement for the purpose of procuring one (1) 2024 Ford PD Utility vehicle and one (1) 2024 Ford PD F-150 vehicle, in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Two Thousand, Four Hundred Thirty-Seven Dollars and Two Cents (\$172,437.02), for a term of five (5) (6.115%) years with payments payable from the Interest & Sinking Fund. (Staff)

Councilmember Dildine made the motion to approve the Resolution as presented. Councilmember Guthrie seconded the motion. All were in favor and the Resolution was approved.

Discussion of and action on a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Johnson City, Texas regarding a financing agreement for the purpose of procuring one (1) 2024 Chevrolet Silverado 3500HD vehicle, in the amount of Sixty-Four Thousand One Hundred Forty-Four Dollars and No Cents (\$64,144.00), for a term of seven (7) (6.249%) years with payments payable from the Vehicle Equipment and Replacement Program (VERP) Fund. (Staff)

Councilmember Colemand made the motion to approve the Resolution as presented. Councilmember Babb seconded the motion. All were in favor and the Resolution was approved.

24. Discussion of and action on a Take Home Vehicle Policy for the City of Johnson City Police Department. (Staff)

Councilmember Coleman made the motion to approve the Take Home Vehicle Policy for the City of Johnson City Police Department. Councilmember Dildine seconded the motion. Dildine, Coleman, Guthrie, and Thomas voted to approve the motion. Councilmember Babb was opposed.

With no further business before the council, the meeting was adjourned at \$3.58 pm.
